An extract from the History Archives...

The Tithe Barn

The Tithe Barn was located in Church Street next to the Church and is shown on the village tithe maps in the 1800s. It was then part of Church Farm, also called The Glebe and Old Rectory Farm. The barn was a low timber framed building, with gabled entrances on the east and west sides, just large enough for horse drawn carts to load and unload in the dry.

Tithe barns were used to store farm produce given to the Church in lieu of tax in the Middle Ages, and was often one tenth of a farmer's produce. They were in a prominent position near to the Church. Before the Reformation tithes were collected by Beeleigh Abbey, and after that the tithes passed to the Rector. Replacing tithes with the tax structure we know today was a long and complex process starting with the Tithe Act of 1836 and ending with the 1977 Finance Act.

This month's cover picture is a postcard view taken from the Church tower around 1930 and shows the symmetrical shape of the barn with four gable roofs. These two photos were taken in the 1960s...





The barn was demolished in the early 1970s when the two photos below were taken that show that the barn was in a very bad state...





Two new houses were built on the site in the early 1980s.

Goldhanger bell ringers

As part of the Heritage Weekend on 11th September, the Goldhanger bell ringers opened St Peter's Church tower to the public.

There was a steady stream of visitors all afternoon, and many decided to go up the tower to see the bells. Although safety issues meant that it was not possible to go to the very top of the tower (one look at the last vertical ladder above the bells and you can see why!) visitors were able to look into the bell chamber and see how the eight bells are arranged in the frame. The workings of the bells were carefully explained, and everyone was impressed with what they saw.

On coming back to ground level in the ringing chamber, there was the opportunity to have a go at ringing a bell under expert guidance. It may look easy in experienced hands, but there were a lot of surprised faces when people got to try it for themselves!

Visitors were also able to hear about the history of the church and the bells, and some fascinating photos of the replacement of the old bell frame in the 1950s were shown. Displays also gave information about bell ringing in general and why it's a great hobby to take up!

In addition, visitors were able to listen to recordings of our bells ringing various tunes or methods. A camera had been fixed in the bell chamber so that the way in which the bells swing from one "up" position to the other when they are being rung could be seen in the church below. This was really fascinating, even to the ringers! Many people did not realise that bells were rung in this way.

The tower handbells were also on display, along with a smaller set for children, and everyone was encouraged to have a go. Other activities for very young visitors were laid on. The youngest to go up the tower was five years old, but courtesy demanded that we didn't ask who was the oldest!

With the ladies of the church providing tea and cake, the whole afternoon was very successful. The Goldhanger ringers are very proud of their bells and the tower, and it was lovely to share this with so many visitors, some of whom had come quite a way to see us. We look forward to doing it again. If you live in the village and didn't get chance to go up the Tower or have a go, then why not come along on a Wednesday and see us?

Marigold Wood Work Party

Marigold wood is land owned by Goldhanger Parish and lies between St Peters Close, to the rear of the village hall field and the back of Peartree Close.

Since the land was given to the parish as part of the development of St Peters Close, young trees and hedging have been planted, It has always been designated public access but while the young trees were getting established there was little of interest to see.

last year an inspection showed very damp areas, so ditches were added to help with drainage.

This Autumn a 2m wide footpath will be created across the Western end of the village Hall field and then around the woodland in a circular route and connecting with access at St Peters Close. Crushed concrete surfaced with black road planning will be used and gates suitable for disabled access erected on the woodland boundaries.

At the same time the boundary hedges will also be cut back and some trees removed to allow long term growth.

A timber bridge will be built across the open ditch. This work has been partially funded by grants that the Parish Council had applied for.

While contractors are completing the main works the Parish Council will be holding a work party to do general tidying and maintenance in the woodland. This will be on:-

Friday December 30th at 10am, meeting at the Village Hall.

All help would be greatly appreciated, please bring your own tools suitable for cutting back branches and vegetation and rakes and suitable gloves.



Report on the Ordinary Meeting held on 11.10. 2016

Moat Housing has still not repaired the broken posts in Hall Estate, despite several letters from the Council.

There have recently been reports of hare coursing in land adjacent to Blind Lane. This has been reported to the police.

It is hoped to locate the two defibrillators which are to be bought for the village in the phone kiosk in Maldon Road and the telephone box in the Square.

Councillors considered their response to the Maldon District Local Development Plan consultation. It was noted that the Rural Allocations provision will now be for a minimum of 420 dwellings in and around the District's villages, but this is yet to be finalised.

The full document can be seen on the Maldon District Council website.

Highways.

The parking restriction signs are now up in Fish Street and the scheme is out for public consultation.

There has been no progress in the Local Highways Panel's schemes for Charity Farm bends and speed reduction measures in Maldon Road. Due to lack of funding both of these have been put back to 2017/2018 but they may be moved forward if money becomes available.

Damage to various road signs in the village and the uneven surface in Little Totham Road will be reported to Highways.

The circular path in the wood has now been completed. It is intended to put dog waste bins at each end of the path, and drop down bollards will be placed in the drive to the Village Hall field.

The next Ordinary Meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Monday 8th November 2016, and the agenda will be published on the Council's web site.





Wildwatching News

The September 2nd Thursdays was very memorable, with 21 Black Terns visible from the Visitors' Centre at Abberton. They were in post-breeding or juvenile plumage. Black Terns breed widely across mainland Europe, and winter in Africa. They aren't difficult to find in East Anglia during spring and autumn migration times. Also at Abberton was a Common Sandpiper which flew underneath the road at the bridge, and a female or juvenile Marsh Harrier which gave us a fly-past.



There are good numbers of Egyptian Geese, (Pictured), present at Abberton, presumably as a result of several good breeding seasons. They were originally a bird of the lower Nile, and were domesticated and revered by ancient Egyptians. They were introduced into this country over 300 years ago, and are particularly a feature today of large estates in Norfolk, particularly Holkolm. Cambridge Professor Dr Bill Sutherland has suggested that us human beings evolved

on the lush African savannah, which is why we have an instinctive leaning towards recreating the habitat as parkland, with short grass, scattered trees and water. It seems entirely appropriate, then, that Egyptian Geese, which also hail from African savannah country, should also thrive in our parklands or similar habitats today.

It's been a good few weeks for mammals – Nina and I disturbed a lovely Red Fox from the roadside at Little Totham on "Ride and Stride" day, and an all – white one has been seen in Maldon. A Muntjack crossed the road in front of me in Heybridge at dusk one night. It must have been feeding in gardens – it was well into the urbanised area. I picked up a roadkilled animal – it was either a Polecat or a Polecat/Ferret cross, just up the road from Broomfield hospital. They only seem to be found as roadkills at present, but at least they



indicate a return of the species to Essex. The details of this one, (Pictured), will be submitted to Essex Wildlife Trust.

A walk around Tiptree Heath provided an opportunity to see the Exmoor Ponies again. Although they aren't wild in the true sense of the word, they have been present in this country since the last ice age in their present form. Unfortunately, Dormice numbers are decreasing on the heath due to people like me, who are interested, disturbing the nest-boxes. Although I'm not guilty personally, it's good to be able to reinforce the message to leave them alone. Some strange, lumpy looking objects on the ground turned out to be oak galls. Apparently they are malformed acorns. The minute Gall Wasp lays its eggs in the developing acorn, and the resulting larvae cause the host to develop an abnormal swelling or gall. You live and learn!


Recipe of the month

Ploughman's Scones Courtesy of Jackie Christy Cooking time - 20 mins

Makes approx 15

INGREDIENTS

1 kilo self-raising flour
2 sweet apples - peeled, cored & diced
250g salted butter
250g grated cheddar cheese
150g sweet pickle
Pinch of salt & pepper





DIRECTIONS

Pre-heat oven to 155C and line a baking sheet with greaseproof paper. Mix flour and butter in a bowl until it resembles fine breadcrumbs. Add the apple, cheese, pickle, salt & pepper and mix briefly to distribute

the contents.

Mix the eggs and milk until it resembles damp dough (add more flour if too wet or more milk if too dry).

Roll out on a floured surface to approx 4cm deep. use a fluted cutter to cut out the scones and transfer to a baking tray.

Place in pre-heated oven and cook for 18-20 minutes.

Cool on a wire rack.

Serve with butter and some chutney.

The Vicar/Rector writes,

Remembrance Day etc.

It seems to me that there are two quite different sets of circumstances that we might find ourselves in, in which we are likely to bare our souls, and reveal what we really think and believe.

The first is a crisis of some sort. Many people have said to me over the year things like "I don't go to church regularly, but when the crunch came, the first thing I did was say a prayer – straight from the heart." A man I used to work with whose daughter was taken very ill comes to mind. Many people in this sort of situation value the prayers of the church as well.

Remembrance Day has taken on an extra dimension in the past few decades due to more recent conflicts, such as those in Northern Ireland, Iraq and Afghanistan. One serviceman, after his return home from Afghanistan to one of my last parishes, spoke of the fear that he and his fellow soldiers felt in dangerous situations, and of the prayers that were "sent up." This reminds me of a retired Captain, a relative by marriage, who had served for a number of years in Northern Ireland. He said that when the chips are down and danger threatens, you are afraid. If anyone says they're not scared, then they are lying. He did concede that there are a few "nut cases" in the army who don't care whether they live or die. The great majority aren't like that, they do feel fear – and many of them pray when the pressure is on.

The other set of circumstances in which our souls are bared? Quite the reverse of the above. Some of us feel able to say what we really think and feel when we are in the safety of our homes and families, or perhaps when we are in the safety of a group of good friends who we have known for a long time. When we are feeling completely relaxed and unselfconscious, it can start to come out.

I hope that the churches of this Benefice, and their life and ministry are "Safe Places" as well, places where we can relax, be ourselves, and bare our souls, almost without ever realising that we are doing so.

It is essential to have our safe places to go to and unwind, especially after we have been through a crisis of some sort. The cost of not doing so can be very high. I will always remember the man, another relative by marriage, who had been involved in the Polish resistance movement during the 2nd world war. After the war he returned to civilian life, and must have in some way put to one side in his mind all that he had been through. This strategy was at one level successful while he had his full mental faculties. During his terminal illness though, as with many people, he lost the ability to control and compartmentalise his mind. The full horror of his war years returned vividly, and he thought that the hospital in which he spent his final weeks was a concentration camp. Although I have never been through anything as awful as that personally, I believe that he could have been healed, over the course of his life, of much of what troubled him, if he had found a safe place in which he could talk about it. Perhaps one of our Remembrance Sunday services this year will, in some way, be a part of the healing process for some of those who attend.

At the end of the day, the biggest "Safe Place" of all is God himself. He knows us better than we know ourselves. Our souls are constantly bared as far as he is concerned. Whatever we are thinking and feeling, whether we are angry with him or even if we find saying prayers boring, we may as well tell him because he knows already. In the presence of God we can supremely be ourselves with no barriers or defences up at all. It would be useless to try to be any different.
