An extract from the History Archives...

Christmas time newspaper extracts from the past

Essex Standard - 2 January 1874

The Parish Church of St. Peter in Goldhanger is very prettily and profusely adorned with much taste. The most remarkable feature is the font, which is ornamented round the top with the words, "One Lord, one Baptism" in moss and fleur-de-lys berries on a white ground, whilst the base is covered with moss, frosted leaves, and berries, the four corners being filled in with crimson, on which rest pots of white primula and maidenhair fern.

Chelmsford Chronicle - 13 December 1935

GOLDHANGER W.I. - Mrs. G. Bunting presided, seventy members being present. An interesting talk on "The Origin of Father Christmas" was given by Miss Randell. Competitions results: Best made cake for 1/6d - Mrs. Blighton; something new from something old - Miss Clark and Mrs. White. Ninety-five garments were sent to the Personal Service League.

Chelmsford Chronicle - 9 December 1938

GOLDHANGER W.I. met in the new Village Hall, 70 members being present. Mrs. G. Bunting presided, having been returned to office. A very amusing and interesting talk on the "Origin of Marriage Customs was given by Miss Tamplin, of Newport. She and Miss Rolfe judged the dolls which had been dressed by members. There were two classes, knitted and material. The dolls, all alike, had been bought by the Institute. Miss Sylvia Everett won the knitted class, and her mother, Mrs. Everett, the material class. The dolls were sent to Chelmsford Hospital for the children at Christmas.

Essex Newsman - 10 January 1942

GOLDHANGER - A children's party was given by the W.I. to all under 11 years of age, 45 attending. Grace was said by the Rev. A.S.Berey. Each child received two bags of sweets, one of which was given by the British Legion, and 6d. each from the Brotherhood. Games were arranged by Miss J. Bunting, Mrs Waring, and Mr. Berey, Father Christmas, distributed the gifts.

Chelmsford Chronicle - 23 December 1949

GOLDHANGER MOTHERS UNION - The meeting in the Village Hall opened with carols. Mrs.Buttle announced the spring festival is to be at Goldhanger.

GOLDHANGER WOMEN CONSERVATIVES - In a tastefully decorated hall the annual social evening was well attended. Members invited friends. Games were arranged by Miss Emery and Mrs Brewer. Miss Gilchrist entertained with her accordion and patter. Dancing followed. The party closed with Auld Lang Syne.



WEA taster courses in Goldhanger Village Hall



GOLDHANGER PARISH COUNCIL Report on the Ordinary Meeting held on 14.11.2017

Planning

Maldon District Council's decisions were noted:

Bluebell House 10 St Peters Close – various tree works – allowed to proceed.

The Stumble 4A Church Street – two storey rear extension – approved.

Councillors considered the following new applications:

<u>Cobbs Farm Maldon Road</u> – continuation of use of a washing plant for processing sand and gravel from the construction of an agricultural reservoir. The Parish Council has no objections but asked for limits on the period of use, permitted noise levels, the removal of all stockpiles of unwashed materials at the end date, and a requirement to undertake wheel and road cleaning.

<u>Vaulty Manor Goldhanger Road Heybridge</u> – various alterations to the Stable Ranges to provide further facilities at the wedding venue – supported but the Parish Council feels that the new walkway should not be roofed with shingles as this would be out of keeping with other adjacent roofs.

Land east of Bradwell Power Station Downhall Beach Bradwell-on-Sea – preliminary groundworks and investigations in association with a potential new nuclear power station –

A no comment response, but concerns were raised over any final power station design.

The Parish Council was disappointed to hear that Maldon District Council is to discontinue the parish trigger whereby any application to which a Parish Council objected although it was recommended for approval by officers, would be decided by the North West Planning Committee. However, the Ward Members can still be asked to bring an application to the Committee if the Parish Council requests this. There was also concern that from April 2018 no hard copies of planning applications would be available to Parish Councils.

Dog fouling

There have been complaints that some owners are not clearing up after their pets when walking in Marigold Wood. This is very disappointing as the Parish Council is trying to create an amenity for the village and dog waste bins have been provided at each end of the wood.

Budget and Precept for the year 2018-2019

The Council continued its discussions on the setting of the precept for the above year, and these will be finalised at the December meeting. It is intended (subject to certain conditions) to make a donation of £5,000 to the Village Hall Management Committee for the proposed works to the Hall, and this will be done through an increase in the precept.

Highways

Speeding in Maldon Road continues to be a problem, and so the Parish Council has asked Maldon District Council to provide some monitoring with Trucam equipment which will result in fines if anyone is caught exceeding the speed limit.

The Local Highways Panel will be asked when the proposed 20mph speed limit in Fish Street will be put in place, and for an update on the other schemes.

The Highways Rangers have been about the village and carried out various grass cutting and strimming work.

It was reported that there has recently been a break in at the allotments.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Tuesday 12th December at 7.30 pm.






Goldhanger Village Hall Chairman Statement 2017

I am very pleased to be able to give my report on the past year to the Annual General Meeting.

It has been a busy and challenging year for all of us on the Village Hall Management Committee, particularly with the design period, consultation and initial funding applications for the re-development of the hall being pressed into action. The fund raising and awareness events we have held during the year have all gone very well indeed.

The use of the hall by village residents and the wider community has continued at a promising level with a new, clearer and competitive pricing policy helping to attract more bookings. Of course there is always room for improvement in the number of private bookings we can accommodate but it has been a very good year overall.

Our Social and Fundraising sub-committee has been led very ably by Jill Crooks and thanks go to her and her team for all their hard work through the year planning and managing a variety of events at the Hall. The launch of the Goldhanger Film Club has been a great success with films as diverse as A Street Cat named Bob and Lion appearing to suit all tastes.

It was wonderful to see our field being used for the Goldhanger Summer BBQ in August. The event went off extremely well and we were blessed with great weather. We had fantastic music and entertainment, the Pimm's was flowing and the BBQ did a roaring trade. We also had very interesting and informative displays from each of the clubs and groups who regularly use the village hall to promote their activities and hopefully welcome new and existing residents to their group.

The Goldhanger Village Hall website www.goldhangervillagehall.co.uk has been building in success and is now the Go To place online to access all the information about the village hall and the events being held. Thanks go to Jill Crooks again for her hard work in keeping the Village Hall website up to date and current. We continue to promote the hall through the press and thanks go to Chris and Steven, the editors of the Goldhanger Parish Magazine for their help with this, as well as Kaye Shrubb – our dedicated Maldon Standard correspondent!

The work of the VH Improvement Project committee, especially Chris Joslin and Clive Cheeseman, has been invaluable in getting the project of the ground and ensuring the Grant applications are as good as they can be to the many grant bodies. In a difficult financial environment, the task to apply for the available grants has at times proven too be long and arduous so well done to all involved, we are getting there so let's keep the momentum going.....!!

The property sub-committee headed by Barbara Wilson has worked hard this year to keep the village hall ship shape inside and out, and making sure the field is safe and secure. 

So, what can we do for you this month? Well by the time you're reading this, I'm guessing that you will have tumbled to the fact that every retail outlets has been shouting at you since September. "Christmas is almost here!" So I'm starting with some of my favourite words by the 17th-century poet Richard Crashaw to describe the world's most amazing, life changing, life-giving, birth, the birth of Christ.

"Welcome, all wonders in one sight!
Eternity shut in a span,
Summer in winter, day in night,
Heaven in earth, and God in man!
Great little One, whose all-embracing birth
Lifts earth to Heaven, stoops Heaven to earth."

However in the next year I'll be talking to many mums and dads who think that, in terms of their own families, the birth of their child is a pretty amazing, life-giving, life changing experience too. If God loves and cares for us enough to send his own son into our risky and dangerous world for our sakes, think how much he must delight in sharing with each and every family their joy as they welcome their new child into the world.

We, the Church, want to share that joy; and to join with you in welcoming your child into the world because we think it's a pretty life-giving, life changing event too. Mostly we would like to welcome your child into a new and even bigger family than the one into which they were born. This new family is called the Church and we welcome all those who want to join in a celebration called Baptism.

Through their baptism children are joined to Christ and his whole church not just in this parish but in every part of the world, now, in the past and in the future, in earth and in heaven (How about that!). There will always be a place for them and an important place too.





Recipe of the month

Roasted Brussels Sprouts with Parmesan & Garlic

Makes 3-4

INGREDIENTS

685g Brussels Sprouts, washed & trimmed 2 tablespoons Olive Oil 3-4 cloves Garlic, minced or crushed 1 tablespoon Balsamic Vinegar Salt & fresh pepper to taste 75g Parmesan Cheese, grated


