“Your Essex - at Goldhanger”

extracts from a long article in the 1937 Essex Chronicle with the above title:

I made my way to Head Street where Mr. W. Wenden lives, he knows the village well. Mr. Wenden was in his garden rich in choice apple trees. Goldhanger is noted for its fruit.

Towards the Square, I called at the house of Mr. John Howard, where I learned much more. Mr. Howard first attended school held in a room in two cottages. Later he went to school at the Old Rectory. Sunday school treats, at which roast beef and plum pudding were served. Scholars took their own plates, knife, fork and jug, and Mr. Samuel Huxter, the Rector's gardener, and Mr. Collins, the butler, assisted at the gathering. Mr. Howard remembered when the singing at the Church was led by a barrel organ played by Mr. Brown, the Church clerk.

I went to Miss Wenden's home in Fish St. where once Samuel Jordan, Joe Wenden, James Gooch and Tom Miller carried on the fishing industry. Miss Wenden was a pupil at Miss Stowell's private school, held in a cottage opposite the present school. Miss Wenden said her grandfather, George Alexander, a Wesleyan, used to preach in a cottage opposite the mill.

At a house near Garden Field I called to see Mr. Manfred Jordan. His father was a fisherman and had owned the five-on smack "The Diamond". He told me about the fair which used to be held on Whit-Monday and Tuesday with stalls in the street. "A lot of people get there in the summer. I have seen fifty cars on a Sunday, people coming down to the water" said Mr. Jordan. He spoke about the feast held in the Chequers connected with the benefit club. I learnt from Mr. Jack Spitty, the host at The Chequers, that an annual feast is still held in this charming old hostel.

Not far from The Cricketers is the blacksmiths shop carried on by the Emeny Brothers. I met Mrs. Alice Emeny, whose husband had been at the forge for over half a century. Mr. Jack Emeny told me of the 5th of November bonfire on the stone in The Square, and the skittle alleys where women used to bowl for tea and men for tobacco.

Stokes is a name you are certain to hear, for the family has been in the village for many years. My great-grandfather, said Mr. George Stokes, was skipper of a sailing ship, and later went into the Preventative Service. Mr. Stokes had heard of the smuggling days when the feet of horses were bound so their direction could not be discovered. I listened to a century-old smuggling story in which twenty barrels of spirit were found on the premises of a man who disclaimed any knowledge of the spirit, but was sent to prison. In prison he is said to have received a splendid lunch daily from an unknown benefactor.

This month's cover picture is a postcard sold in Mr W Wenden's post office and shop in the early 1900s. The house is still called Wencis and is at 15 Head St.

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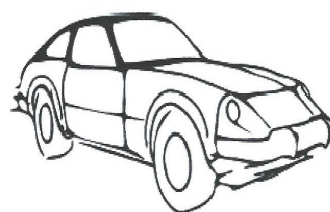
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GOLDHANGER, LITTLE TOTHAM and TOLLESHUNT MAJOR W.I.

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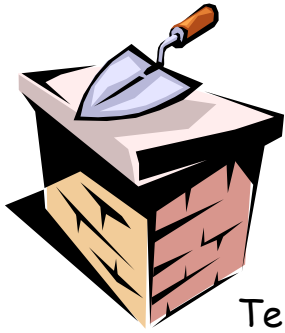


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Dark Horse Morris at The Chequers

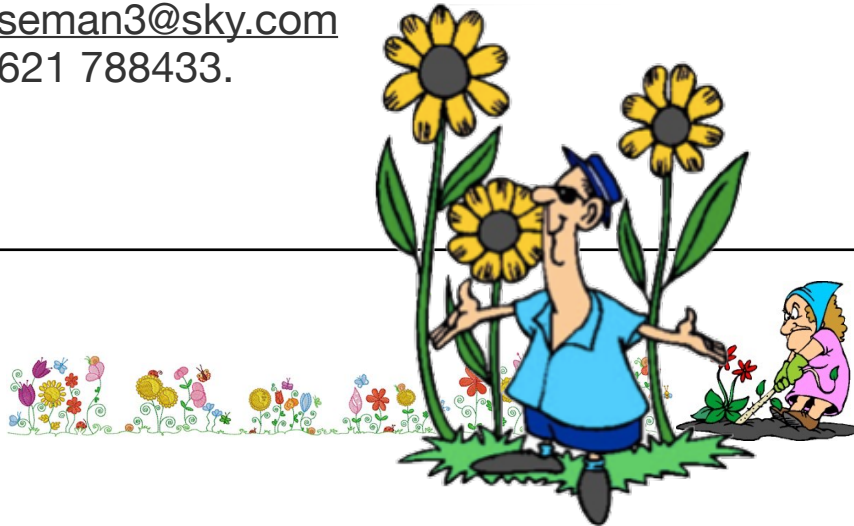

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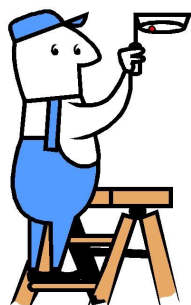

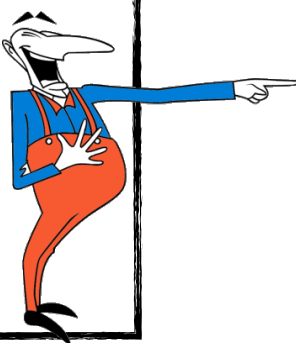

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Recipe of the month

Chickpea, tomato and spinach curry

Serves: 6

Preparation time: 15 minutes

Cooking time: 40 minutes

INGREDIENTS

- 1 onion, chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, chopped
- 3cm/1¼ in piece ginger, grated
- 6 ripe tomatoes
- ½ tbsp oil
- 1 tsp ground cumin
- 2 tsp ground coriander
- 1 tsp turmeric
- pinch chilli flakes
- 1 tsp yeast extract (we used Marmite)
- 4 tbsp red lentils
- 6 tbsp coconut cream
- 1 head of broccoli, broken into small florets
- 400g can chickpeas, drained
- 100g bag baby spinach leaves
- 1 lemon, halved
- 1 tbsp toasted sesame seed
- 1 tbsp chopped cashew, to mix with the sesame seeds

DIRECTIONS

1. Put the onion, garlic, ginger and tomatoes in a food processor or blender and whizz to a purée.
2. Heat oil in a large pan. Add the spices, fry for a few secs and add purée and yeast extract. Bubble together for 2 mins, then add lentils and coconut cream. Cook until lentils are tender, then add the broccoli and cook for 4 mins. Stir in chickpeas and spinach, squeeze over lemon and swirl through sesame and cashew mixture. Serve with rice.
