2018 Armistice Celebration in the Village Hall

On Saturday 10th November the History Group organised an evening of photos, short videos, performances and readings from the Parish Magazine and newspapers of the time to celebrate the 100th anniversary of Armistice Day. The Jubilee Choir entertained the audience with moving patriotic songs, Kim & Ray performed a rendition of *I Vow To Thee, My Country,* and Dr Killy's guest Swaraveenapani read a poem he had written. The proceeds from the evening went to The Village Hall Improvement Project. Here are two newspaper reports that were read out during the evening...

From the Chelmsford Chronicle of 13th June 1919

Goldhanger held a very successful Welcome Home on Whit Monday for the discharged service men of the parish. A good dinner was provided in the Schoolroom which had been decorated for the occasion for about forty three guests. After dinner a service of thanksgiving was held in the Parish Church.

In the evening a smoking concert was held, followed by refreshments, and a dance finished the evening. A very large number of friends were present and thoroughly enjoyed the re-union. Mr Field (the Curate) extended a hearty welcome to the men, and Mr John Buckingham (the Rector's manservant & Tower Captain) thanked the ladies who had contributed songs, and all the helpers. Before and after the service the bells were rung by the ringers who included six returning soldiers.

From the *Chelmsford Chronicle* of 25th July 1919 (reporting on Peace Day) Goldhanger - The village was gay with flags, the bells of the church rang joyful peels, there were sports for children and adults in the Rectory grounds, and the returned soldiers were entertained to a capital dinner.

Mr. G. Bunting kindly gave the meat, and the vegetables were provided by other friends. The old and young had a substantial tea, after which the Revd. Gardner gave a hearty welcome to all, especially the soldiers. He referred in sympathetic terms to those who had made the supreme sacrifice.

The sports included a costume bicycle race, hitting the hock of bacon by women blindfolded, and a tug-of-war: the army and navy versus civilians; The Services winning. At 10.15 two huge bonfires were lit and a display of fireworks brought the day's festivities to a close.

Several images from the recent event in the Village Hall are included in this magazine and many more can be seen on the Village Hall website and Facebook page.

A page has also been added to the Goldhanger Past website recording Armistice related events that took place here from 1918 onwards.



WOULD YOU BE INTERESTED IN JOINING A GOLDHANGER SPEEDWATCH GROUP?



The Parish Council is looking at the possibility of setting up a Community Speed Watch group in Goldhanger.

This is a group of volunteers who work with Essex Police to use speed detection devices to monitor vehicles travelling in 30 and 40 mph speed limits.

Volunteers are trained and supported by the Police, and if a speed offence is detected by the Group a letter will be sent to the registered keeper of the vehicle with the aim of educating them to reduce speed and stick to speed limits. Anyone who repeats offences or is well over the speed limit will be highlighted to Essex Police's Casualty Reduction Team and could face prosecution.

The Speed Watch scheme covers the whole country, and there are active groups in this area. However, in order to run successfully volunteers are needed to work with the police to reduce speeding on Essex roads and make them safer.

Waste and recycling collections Rubbish collections in Goldhanger. – no "side waste" policy

I know I get in a muddle occasionally with the bin collections, but I thought for this issue of the magazine, with Christmas coming and likely extra rubbish being generated, it was a good time to explain the government and local council "no side waste policy".



The refuse collectors will NOT take any extra bags that are placed next to your black wheelie bin. This is because (in a nut shell) it's most cost effective for them to have calculated maximum loads based on 1 bin per household.

The down side is that if a

household has extra rubbish and it is left at the side of the road it can attract pests or be ripped open by cats or foxes leaving a bigger mess to be cleared up.

This policy is to help encourage recycling and there are no limits on the number of pink sacks picked up, so long as the recycling is clean and not household rubbish in disguise, as it will again be rejected!

If you have items that the refuse collection will not take then they can be taken to the 'dump' and it's worth noting that the dump is run by a completely different company and doesn't sort recycling like the collected bins. (pink sacks at the dump go in general waste, only cardboard is separated)

The Goldhanger <u>website</u> has details of our collection calendar which I always make a note of on my own calendar, (if it's a bins or recycling week) and Maldon district council can always be contacted if you have any issues.

Submitting articles to the magazine

Some helpful hints and tips.



We love making your magazine look good, but we also need your help to do this. Hopefully these tips will make things quicker and easier for you as well as for us.

Sending articles and notices

If you are just sending us text, please write your article directly into the body of an email. We can simply copy it out. There is no need to send a text document attachment.

We use Apple computers and Word Documents don't always look the same to us as they will to you (we don't have Word installed) - fonts change, positioning of paragraphs and photos can change.

If you have a particular layout in mind, or you're sending images with an article, it would be helpful if you could create your article in your document in the way you would like it to appear and then convert it to a PDF (Portable Document Format) to send us. We are able to insert a PDF straight into the magazine (in the same way we add photos) without having to copy anything out and without any changes to the appearance of your article.

If the software you use will not convert to PDF, there are a number of free online services you can use, such as: www.freepdfconvert.com/ and convertonlinefree.com/

Capital letters

Please do not use all capital letters in your article - it is more difficult to read when in long passages. Capitals are fine for headings and titles.

Advertising

We accept PDF, JPG, PNG files as this will preserve your layout and design. If your advert only contains text then a simple email will do. You will be able to format the size and layout of the text in your email for us to copy out.

Proofreading

Please check your submissions for accuracy and spelling as we do not always have time to do this for you.

GOLDHANGER PARISH COUNCIL

Report of the Ordinary Meeting held on 13.11.2018

There is currently a vacancy on the Council caused by the resignation of Councillor Rachel Smith. If anyone is interested in becoming a Councillor they should contact either the parish clerk or Julia Bourn (Chair).

Planning

The following decision by Maldon District Council was noted:

6 Fish Street – single storey side extension and first floor extension – approved.

The District Council has advised that it will take no further action on issues at the land adjacent to 15 Fish Street.

New application:

Pine Lodge 11A Head Street – Scots Pine – reduce laterals by 1m. Remove deadwood. The Parish Council has no difficulty with the removal of deadwood or the removal of any branch ends by up to 1 metre which are touching the roof, but the height of the tree should not be reduced as its amenity value would then be lost.

Highways

The Council is looking into the setting up of a Community Speed Watch group to help reduce the speed of traffic in the village (see the separate article in this magazine).

In October the Trucam patrols made eleven captures of speeding vehicles in Maldon Road and steps have been taken to set up a police approved site for the cameras to be used in Church Street.

The Local Highways Panel has replaced speed limit repeater signs in Maldon Road and has now signed off the scheme for traffic calming measures in that road. However the Parish Council asked for speed roundels on the highway and the Ward Members will raise this with the LHP. Maldon District Council has been made aware of the parking of contractors' vehicles outside Benham Close which is causing difficulty for passing traffic.

<u>Marigold Wood</u> A small (children's) tent was found and has been packed away. It may be collected by the owners.

A contractor has now been appointed to trim various hedges in the village. Vehicles parking in the vicinity of the bus stop at the Maldon Road end of Head Street are causing difficulties for passengers alighting from the buses at this point. This will be monitored.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held in the Village Hall on Tuesday 11th December at 7.30 pm. Residents are welcome to attend.



Leave to stand for 1 hour then remove the tea bags

Reboil for 15 minutes (reducing it by 1/3). Strain and serve hot.




