The Goldhanger Stone – the sequel

One of our earliest parish magazine history articles (March 2015) was an extract from a paper about the Goldhanger Stone published in the Essex Archaeological Society Transactions in 1909, written by Essex historian Miller Christy. A 3-page sequel to this has been discovered published later in 1911. Here are some extracts...

Two years ago, I described and figured in these pages the very remarkable, semi-circular, trough-shaped stone which has lain for many years on the village green at Goldhanger, near Maldon, where it has afforded, both to the villagers and to passers-by, a standing puzzle to account for its presence there and to explain its former use.

The suggestion that the stone might have been part of a cider-mill was one which I myself had put forward, but had rejected as untenable. It now proves, however, that my suggestion was perfectly sound, for there is in the grounds of the Museum of the Natural History Society, at Torquay, a complete example of an old granite cider-mill, closely similar to the Goldhanger stone.

In the Torquay example the trough of the mill consists of a single circular mass of stone, instead of being divided into two semi-circular halves, as is that at Goldhanger. It is 8 feet 2 inches in diameter and 19 inches in thickness, while the circular hollow or trough in it is 18 inches wide at the top, 10 inches wide at the bottom, and 9 inches deep. The curator of the Museum, says that similar old granite cider-mills may still be seen occasionally lying around Devonshire farm-houses.

Both the trough and the crushing-stone of the mill in the Museum at Torquay are of an exceedingly hard black-and-white stone, which is granite from Hey Tor, on Dartmoor. As the stone at Goldhanger is of exactly the same kind of granite, there can be no doubt that it also came originally from Hey Tor.

This explains why the Goldhanger stone is in two semi-circular halves, instead of in one circular whole. The stone was, without doubt, brought round by sea from Devonshire to Goldhanger. The task would be greatly facilitated, however, by cutting it, or making it originally, in two halves. The existence of this old cider-mill at Goldhanger can only mean that it was formerly used there, or in the immediate vicinity, for making cider.

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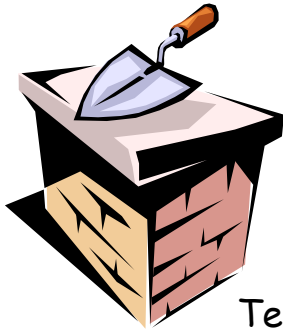


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GOLDHANGER GALA WEEKEND 2018

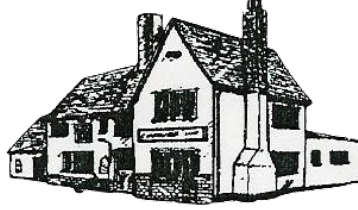

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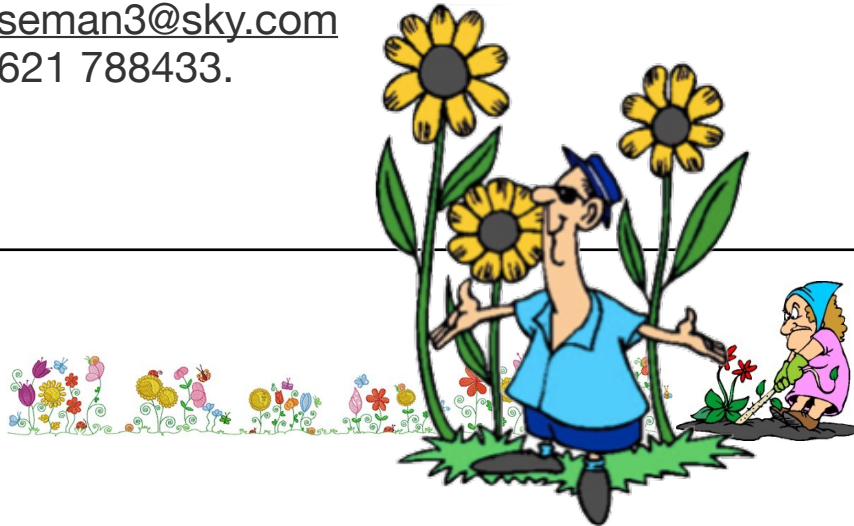

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GOLDHANGER PARISH COUNCIL

Report of the Ordinary Meeting held on 12.6.2018

Planning

It was noted that the application to fell a Scots Pine at 20 Fish Street has been refused by Maldon District Council, and the Tree Preservation Order remains in place.

New applications: Cobbs Farm Maldon Road – continuation of the construction of an agricultural reservoir to allow an amended restoration scheme including revised planting, increased agricultural land, altered reservoir profile and wetlands swale. The Parish Council supported these applications.

Various enforcement issues are currently being investigated by the District Council (Gardeners Farm, The Old Rectory and Benham Close).

The Council is considering new names for the development in Maldon Road (currently being marketed as The Saltings).

Parking Enforcement and Trucam speed monitoring

Trucam was not available during April as it had been returned to Essex Police for recalibration. However, the Parish Council will request it for future use in Maldon Road. Car parking patrols have been carried out in Fish Street and Thistley Close with two PCNs issued, and the patrols will continue.

Highways

Damage to the passing places in Little Totham Road has now been marked for repairs.

Nothing further has been heard from the Local Highways Panel regarding schemes for Goldhanger, but the two Ward Members will bring this up at a meeting with the LHP at the end of June.

General Data Protection Regulations

The Parish Council has now approved its General Data Policy and this will be published on the website - <http://www.essexinfo.net/goldhanger-parish-council/>. The Privacy Statement has also been published. Please note that any queries for the Council should be sent to the parish clerk (contact details on the website or in the parish magazine).

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Tuesday 10th July at 7.30 pm. Everyone is welcome to attend. The agenda will be published on the website shortly before the meeting.

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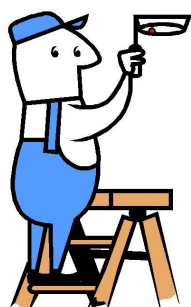

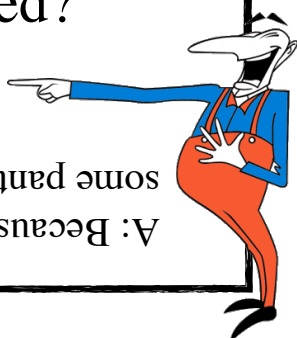

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Recipe of the month

Butter-poached egg in a vegetable nest

Serves: 2

Preparation time: Less than 30 minutes

Cooking time: Less than 10 minutes

INGREDIENTS

- 20g/ $\frac{3}{4}$ oz [butter](#)
- 1 tsp [olive oil](#)
- 250g/9oz baby [spinach](#)
- 10 [cherry tomatoes](#), halved
- 2 large free-range [eggs](#)
- $\frac{1}{2}$ [lemon](#), juice only
- salt and freshly ground [black pepper](#)
- 2 x 100g/ $3\frac{1}{2}$ oz slices wholegrain [bread](#), to serve



DIRECTIONS

1. Melt three-quarters the butter with the oil in a small frying pan over a medium heat. Add the spinach and tomatoes and season. Stir, cover with a lid, turn down the heat and cook for 2–3 minutes, or until the spinach has wilted.
2. Push the vegetables around the edge of the pan into a wide ring with a gap in the middle for the eggs, like a nest.
3. Melt the remaining butter in the centre of the pan and let it mix with some of the juices that have come out of the vegetables. Break the eggs into the middle. Cover and cook until the eggs are done to your liking (3–4 minutes for a runny yolk and 5–6 minutes for firm).
4. Meanwhile, toast the bread on both sides.
5. Season the egg and squeeze over the lemon juice. Serve immediately with the toast.

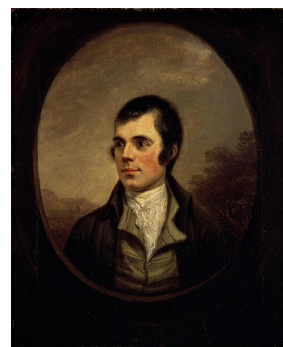
