An extract from the History Archives...

The Goldhanger Red Brick Walls

The red brick walls in the centre of the village could well be unique as nothing similar, and to the extent, has been seen elsewhere. In the mid 1800s the Rector, the Revd. C.B. Leigh paid for the village school, a new rectory (now Goldhanger House), restored the Church and built the walls around the Church. He also encouraged villagers to build similar walls to keep farm animals out of gardens.

This was because at that time there were two farms in the middle of the village: Hall Farm and Church Farm, and both had animals that would have been regularly driven through the streets to fields at the edge of the village.

The walls remain a significant and historic feature of the village and the Conservation Area Review produced by MDC in 2007, recognised their importance and referred to them many times throughout the document, for example:

The conservation area is given cohesion and a sense of identity by the common use of low red brick boundary walls to properties... Soft brick, particularly when used with lime mortar, adds warmth, colour and texture to the streetscape.

Over 40 properties in the village still have these red brick walls and if they were all joined end to end would stretch for 3/4 of a mile.

Part of the village old-world-charm is the sense of maturity created by these ancient and partially decaying walls.

The walls in the village are not all of a uniform construction and vary in the style of capping or coping. The walls around the churchyard have angled "saddleback" capping and are clearly some of the oldest.

Two years ago high winds demolished part of the wall at the east end of the churchyard and the PCC has embarked on fund raising to restore it. Their article appears elsewhere in the magazine.



In this edition of the Parish Magazine you will find an informative article by our village historian (p.3), on the rather special red brick walls that are a feature of the village; and indeed a heritage feature. Sadly, the eastwall of the churchyard collapsed two years ago.

The Church PCC is hoping to rebuild the fallen east wall.

Grant aid towards the cost is being sought and two very enjoyable Chinese Feasts were held raising nearly £900. Thank you all so much for participating in these, especially those who provided the desserts.

Re-building work will make use of salvaged bricks, but only those from parts of the wall set in lime mortar can be re-used. We have to buy additional bricks. In the spring, we plan to launch a sponsorship appeal to purchase the special saddleback coping bricks, we will need about 140 of these.

We will give you a further up-date in next months mag.



Honouring those killed in the Great War recorded on our memorial

As the German advance continued and the Allied 5th Army was driven back across the former Somme battlefields another soldier from Goldhanger was killed on the 4th day. John Sidney Wakelin of 10th battalion Essex Regiment aged 27 died on 24th March. John was the third son of Frederick and Fanny Walkelin and from a prominent local farming family related to George Bunting who continues the family tradition in Goldhanger today.

John was killed at Rouen Wood with many others of his battalion who were trying to hold the line as the rearguard to the retreating 18th Division and is remembered on the Pozieres memorial along with 14,000 others who have no known grave and died between 21st March and 7th August 1918 the period of the German advance. Pozieres is a village six kilometres north-east of Albert.

As mentioned last month 1918 was the worst year of the war for Goldhanger with 6 deaths being recorded in the Parish Magazine of the time. This month we remember Ernest Henry Lewis called Harry by everyone.

Harry was killed on the 21st March 1918. He was 25 years old and the son of Maurice and Emily Lewis who lived in Church Street in one of the bungalows near the Cricketers.

He was a member of the Royal Berkshire regiment and joined up in 1914. He is buried along with one other comrade in the churchyard of the village of Ugny-l'Equipee near Albert in France.


The 21st March was the first day of the massive German advance along 70 miles of the front line centred on the Somme but also including part of the Ypres area. At 0440hrs the most massive bombardment of the war by six and a half thousand guns and three and a half thousand mortars including thousands of gas shells began and the Germans advanced in overwhelming numbers with additional troops released from the Russian front. Thousands were mown down by the allied armies but they were unstoppable and broke through ending the years of stalemate. Over the next three and a half months they advanced up to 40 miles in some places and came within range of Paris with their largest guns. Although the Germans were eventually stopped and defeated the 21st March was an unfortunate day for Harry to be in the front line.

Harry's younger brother Fred also joined up in 1916 and went to France with the Essex Regiment and was taken prisoner at Tampoux Arras during the second week of the big German breakthrough. His story is an interesting one and will be told in a future edition.

The Lewis family were related to the Appletons and both families were prominent bell ringers in Goldhanger. Harry in particular was one of the crack peel band of the time and is mentioned in the bell ringers peel records, including one on October 1914 as a farewell to him on joining the army and another by the other members of the band on 28th April 1918 with muffled bells as a last mark of respect to Harry.

A full peel will be rung in his honour by the district band including Goldhanger members, on 21st March the 100th anniversary of his death.

March Letter

By the time you read this letter we will be in the middle of Lent. It's a time of preparation for that ultimate life-giving celebration we call Easter. So how do you make yourself ready for such an amazing event . For Christians it's a time of reflection and prayer; a time of repentance. The word repentance comes from the Greek word metanoia which means to turn; to turn away from all the things that we had done that make us less human, less than the amazing people God created us to be and then to turn towards God who will remake us as we were always intended to be. For the sake of Great Totham who don't have a January letter we pointed out then that in each of the three churches each week we say these or similar words,

"forgive what we have been,

help us to amend what we are,

and direct what we shall be"

Great! The problem is that all this requires change and not superficial change but change at a very deep level. So I ask you a personal question; how do you feel about change? In my experience people react very differently. Some people consistently jump up and down with excitement at the prospect of change hardly stopping to consider its implications or its cost. I think I was less than 20 when I last reacted like that. Some people act reluctantly or fearfully, believing any change can only be for the worst. Well I'm the wrong side of 70 now and it's the reaction I'm trying to avoid even if I do slip into it occasionally. But there is a middle way. It involves looking for the reasons that make change necessary or desirable and then exploring all the opportunities and advantages that change might bring. Realistically it also requires us to understand all the good things that have been achieved in the past and to think how creatively they could be incorporated into the future. It's a counsel of perfection but I suspect that the people who weather change best are those who take that middle way.

Well many of you will understand why am talking about change in this way. On April 25th (date still to be confirmed) Bishop Roger will license Paul Daltry as Priest-in-Charge of our three parishes and the four North Blackwater Parishes so becoming part of a wider family of seven parishes. So how are we dealing with change? Well I haven't seen anyone consistently jumping up and down in the streets with excitement at the prospect of change, hardly stopping to consider its implications or its cost. And I'm pleased about that. It means that we are being realistic about the future. Have I found anyone reluctant or fearful, believing that any change can only be for the worst? Well to be honest I probably have. We have to encourage and support these people because with God's help there's a bright future out there for all of us. Most people fit into the middle category. They want to preserve the good things that have been achieved in the past and to think how creatively they could be incorporated into a new future that with God's help we will be building together. Amen

GOLDHANGER PARISH COUNCIL Report on the Ordinary Meeting held on 13.2.2018

Planning

The following decisions by Maldon District Council were noted:

Norsey House Maldon Rd – retrospective, erection of four garden fence panels – refused.

27 Maldon Rd –two storey side/rear extension. Single storey lobby extension to replace existing lobby structure – **approved.**

Vaulty Manor Goldhanger Rd Heybridge – Alterations to openings and internal partitioning of stable ranges to provide new reception/WC areas in place of existing ancillary guest/staff accommodation – approved and Listed Building Consent granted.

Decisions on new planning applications:

37 Fish St – remove Blossom tree – there is no objection to the felling of this tree but the existing hedge should be retained as the proposed laurel hedge would be out of keeping.

11a Fish St – pollard two Limes – supported.

North Maldon Growers Ltd Little Totham Rd – erection of an agricultural building – no objections.

30 Fish St – fell Macrocarpa to ground – no objections.

20 Fish St - fell Scots Pine - the Parish Council objects to this application as the Scots Pine is an important tree in the street scene and the reasons for felling it are not justified.

11a Fish St – crown reduction of a Walnut tree – supported.

Norsey House – works to garden and fence – the application is supported but a replacement laurel hedge is not thought to be appropriate and another form of vegetation would be more fitting.

Enforcement issues: There is nothing further to report re Benham Close – hedges and hedgerow maintenance issues.

Gardeners Farm is advertising a Caravan Club campsite – enforcement will be asked if planning permission is required for this, and how adverts on the edge of the highway should be dealt with.

There will shortly be a vacancy on the Council as Chris Joslin has announced his intention to resign in May.

A proposal to make parking spaces on the playing field was discussed but was not deemed suitable. It would be difficult to control parking and would require a locked gate, and more parking spaces could lead to further parking problems in the area. The playing field was originally only intended for recreational use.

The Parish Council considered an appeal on the cancellation of the proposed 20mph speed limit in Fish Street, but any appeal would be to the portfolio holder in Essex County Council who had actually made the decision. It is therefore very unlikely that the decision would be overturned. Councillor Mr Sargeant will pursue other schemes for Goldhanger, including speed restrictions in Maldon Road.

It was noted that Highways vehicles which had been carrying out patching work in Little Totham Road had seriously damaged the passing space by North Maldon Growers. This has been reported and Highways will make good the damage.

Councillor Mark Durham (Essex County Council) will look into bottleneck issues on the road through Heybridge to Maldon which is causing serious traffic congestion.

Trucam has been used on Maldon Road and it was reported to have successfully slowed traffic down. Parking enforcement officers have visited Fish Street and issued four parking tickets. Officers will be asked to repeat this and the Trucam again in the near future.

It was noted that the Village Hall Management Committee has obtained a grant of £20,000 towards the work on the Village Hall improvement scheme.

The light in the defibrillator box in Maldon Road is not working and this will be investigated. The Speed Indicator Device in the same location is also not working and repairs will be carried out.

The Council is currently updating its list of Buildings and Land assets, and this will shortly be published on the Parish Council's web site.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Tuesday 13th March at 7.30 pm. The agenda and minutes of previous meetings can be found on the Parish Council's website.





Recipe of the month

Baked burrito

Serves 4

Preparation time: less than 30 mins Cooking time: 30 mins to 1 hour

INGREDIENTS

- 1 small <u>onion</u>
- <u>oil</u>, for cooking
- 600g/1lb 5oz skinless, boneless <u>turkey breast</u> or thigh
- 3 tsp Mexican seasoning, such as mild taco seasoning
- 2 <u>tomatoes</u>, halved
- 200g tin of <u>sweetcorn</u>, drained
- 200g/7oz grated cheese, such as Cheddar
- 4 large soft tortilla wraps
- 4 tbsp natural <u>yoghurt</u>, to serve

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Preheat the oven to 200C/180C Fan/Gas 4.
- Peel and roughly chop the onion. Heat a large frying pan over a medium heat, then add a dash of oil and the onion. Cook for 7-10 minutes, or until soft and translucent but not brown. Reduce the heat if the onion starts to colour.
- 3. Cut the turkey meat into 2½cm/1in cubes and add them and the Mexican seasoning to the onion. Cook for 10 minutes, stirring now and again, or until the turkey is cooked through with no sign of pink juices when you cut into the largest cube.
- 4. Grate the cut sides of the tomatoes into the pan, using a cheese grater, and stir. Discard the skin once the flesh is grated. Increase the heat to medium-high and cook for 3-4 minutes, or until the tomato mixture has thickened and coats the turkey. Add the sweetcorn and stir.
- 5. Put the tortilla wraps on a chopping board and spoon the meat mixture into the middle of the wraps. Sprinkle with the grated cheese. Fold the sides of the wraps over the filling, then roll the wraps up from bottom to top to enclose the filling completely.
- 6. Put the wraps, folded side-down on a baking tray. Put a little oil into your hand and gently rub it over the wraps. Place in the oven and bake for 7 minutes, then turn the wraps over and bake for a further 5 minutes, or until golden and crisp all over.
- 7. Serve each burritos with a tablespoon of yoghurt on the side for dipping.


