Great War evacuation instructions for Goldhanger

In 1917 Dr Salter, the local GP, magistrate and head of the Voluntary Aid Detachment issued evacuation instructions for the local area to be carried out in the event of an invasion. Here are extracts relating to Goldhanger...

THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM — GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS. Local Executive Committee

Mr. J. H. SALTER (Chairman) Tolleshunt D'Arcy.

SPECIAL DIRECTIONS.

Invasion though possible, is somewhat improbable. It will be notified by the Military Authority through the Police and, from them, to the Headmen of the Parishes, their Aids.

The Signal of Invasion will be continuous ringing of the Church or other alarm bells, on which the Headmen, Aids, and Special Constables will proceed to a central spot,

Their Duty will be to assist people into waggons, carts, and other vehicles; direct them at the cross roads; regulate the traffic; suppress panic; supervise the removal and slaughter of cattle; destroy supplies.

Food for 48 hours, an extra blanket or two, warm clothing and thick boots.

Cattle. Farmers should slaughter, or cause to be slaughtered, their own cattle which are not driven away, on receiving an order to do so from the Police Authority,

Horses and other valuable stock to be moved first, milking cows last, pigs to be destroyed.

Motors, vehicles and horses of military value must be taken to Chelmsford to the General Officer Commanding as soon as they have conveyed people to destinations in Oxfordshire.

Coldhanger. By Follyfaunts or Bobbetts Hole to Penny's Brook, then Tiptree Fair Green, thence to Youngs End.

Submitting articles to the magazine

Some helpful hints and tips.



We love making your magazine look good, but we also need your help to do this. Hopefully these tips will make things quicker and easier for you as well as for us.

Sending articles and notices

If you are just sending us text, please write your article directly into the body of an email. We can simply copy it out. There is no need to send a text document attachment.

We use Apple computers and Word Documents don't always look the same to us as they will to you (we don't have Word installed) - fonts change, positioning of paragraphs and photos can change.

If you have a particular layout in mind, or you're sending images with an article, it would be helpful if you could create your article in your document in the way you would like it to appear and then convert it to a PDF (Portable Document Format) to send us. We are able to insert a PDF straight into the magazine (in the same way we add photos) without having to copy anything out and without any changes to the appearance of your article.

If the software you use will not convert to PDF, there are a number of free online services you can use, such as: www.freepdfconvert.com/ and convertonlinefree.com/

Capital letters

Please do not use all capital letters in your article - it is more difficult to read when in long passages. Capitals are fine for headings and titles.

Advertising

We accept PDF, JPG, PNG files as this will preserve your layout and design. If your advert only contains text then a simple email will do. You will be able to format the size and layout of the text in your email for us to copy out.

Proofreading

Please check your submissions for accuracy and spelling as we do not always have time to do this for you.



Honouring those killed in the Great War recorded on our memorial.

Regular readers will know that this is being done by raising the Union Flag on the Church on the 100th anniversary of their death and ringing the bells for a short time during that day.

1918 was the worst year of the war for Goldhanger with six deaths being recorded in the Parish Magazine of the time.

The last local man to die during the war was Lionel Hover who was killed on 18th October 1918.

Lionel was a signaller with the 11th Battalion Essex Regiment aged 21 and the son of Beatrice and Henry Hover of 12 Spring Crescent, Tolleshunt D'Arcy. He is buried in St. Souplet British Cemetery in France.

The Parish Magazine of December 1918 records:


The deepest and truest sympathy has everywhere gone out to Mr and Mrs Hover, in their loss of one of the most promising of sons. Lionel has been killed in France. He was lying in his shelter in the act of writing to his mother at the very end of October. Full particulars are not yet to hand. He was thoroughly good and beloved by everyone. He was the first to volunteer to offer himself at our recruiting meeting at the outbreak of war, and turned out to be such a keen and efficient soldier. So Soon he might have been home, with the laurels of victory upon him, but God willed it otherwise. Fuller particulars may be given next month, meanwhile we all mourn his loss. R.I.P

The Magazines in January or February 1919, which both had articles about war memorial meetings and subscriptions for its construction said nothing further about Lionel.

A study of the origin of the graves at St. Souplet, which is near Le Cateau and Cambrai indicates the Lionel was killed during the the final attacks on the Hindenburg Line when Allied forces encountered some of the fiercest fighting of the war, even though an armistice was already being discussed by then.

Restoring St. Peter's boundary wall

A master builder and some venerable volunteers

Waist high walls in soft red Essex bricks are characteristic of the old centre of the village and the longest continuous run of walling is the boundary of St Peter's churchyard.

On a windy night in autumn 2016 an eighteen metre long section of wall, already leaning outwards, collapsed. Volunteers made the site safe; salvaging and cleaning any re-useable bricks of which 1200 including saddleback copings were placed in secure storage.

However, not all the fallen brickwork could be re-used. Unfortunately, illadvised repairs had been undertaken in the past using ordinary Portland cement instead of lime-mortar. This cannot be removed from our porous Essex bricks.

In the spring of 2017 St Peter's PCC took the decision to re-build the fallen wall. We contacted **Essex Heritage Trust** who very kindly agreed to fund half the cost with the PCC to fund the other half.

Fundraising events and donations managed this by May. In June our own master builder, Mark Owers, was appointed to carry out the restoration working within the strict guidelines of the Essex Heritage Trust and the diocese of Chelmsford. Mark started in mid-July just as the hot weather really set in. Work was completed in four weeks exactly on schedule. Again, volunteers helped with getting the bricks out of storage and with site clean up on completion.

Design was straightforward within the constraints of brick choice and correct lime mortar. In the event we did not need to purchase additional bricks. By the simple expedient of burrowing deep we unearthed the original foundation brickwork which was cleaned and used afresh above ground; the below ground structure we replaced with solid concrete blockwork. Result: a finished wall of homogeneous brick work identical with our existing walls.

So it's all done. Good for the next 200 years; thanks to **Essex Heritage Trust.**

And thanks too to our trusty volunteers.



GOLDHANGER PARISH COUNCIL

Report of the Ordinary Meeting held on 11.9.2018

There is currently a vacancy on the Parish Council. If anyone is interested in joining the Council they should contact the clerk or speak to a Councillor for further details.

Planning

The following decisions by Maldon District Council were noted:

27 Maldon Road – additional windows to lobby following grant of planning permission – approved.

20 Fish Street – works to Scotts Pine – approved. Note: this tree is now protected by a permanent Tree Protection Order.

The Parish Council will ask MDC Planning for a list of protected trees in the village.

New planning application:

6 Fish Street – single storey side extension and first floor rear extension – the Parish Council approved this application.

The Parish Council is yet to receive any updates on various enforcement issues in the village.

Councillors heard of problems with the brick wall at the Old Allotments site in Fish Street. This had accidentally been knocked down by a contractor working at a neighbouring property, and the landowner does not at present wish the wall to be reinstated. Although in a conservation area the wall is not listed but residents have expressed concern that it should be rebuilt.

Other issues

Councillor Mr Sargeant has undertaken some trimming of vegetation in both the playing field and in Marigold Wood. Councillors are also going to redecorate both bus shelters in the village.

The sea wall has now been fenced off for repair work to be carried out.

Quotes are being obtained for hedge cutting at various locations in the village.

The Council ratified the new Risk Assessment Policy, and will adopt the draft Standing Orders at the October meeting.

Highways will be asked when it intends to carry out gulley clearance in the village as some are now blocked.

Moat will be asked to clear the vegetation from the path leading from Head Street to the garages at the rear of Hall Estate. The overgrown brambles are causing difficulties for those residents using mobility scooters.

The overgrown hedge at the top of Church Street and opposite to Benham Close has been reported to Highways. A number of residents have reported near misses at this location due to the hedge and the parking of contractors' vehicles outside Benham Close. This has also been reported to Jenny Moody Homes.

Commemoration of the end of the First World War:

The British Tommy silhouette has been put up near Hall Estate and will remain there until late October when it will join others at Promenade Park in Maldon for the 11th November event

A resident who wishes to put a memorial bench on the sea wall was given advice on how to proceed with the project.

The Environment Agency has advised that it will no longer be clearing overgrown vegetation from the brook at Wash Bridge on the Maldon Road. This is now the responsibility of the landowner.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Tuesday 9th October at 7.30 pm. Everyone is welcome to attend. The agenda will be published on the website shortly before the meeting.



Recipe of the month

Frozen banana ghosts

Serves: 8 (1 each!)

Preparation time: 10 minutes

Freezing time: 4 hours

INGREDIENTS

- 200g bar white chocolate
- 4 medium-large ripe bananas
- 85g desiccated coconut (you won't use it all))
- Handful dark chocolate drops



DIRECTIONS

- In a small bowl, gently melt the chocolate either in the microwave in short bursts on high or over a pan of simmering water (make sure the bowl isn't touching the water). Set aside for a moment while you get the bananas ready.
- Peel the bananas, cut in half, and push a lolly stick into the middle of each piece. Spread the coconut out in a shallow bowl. Line a large baking tray with baking parchment, and make sure there is room for the tray in the freezer.
- 3. Using a pastry brush, coat a banana half in chocolate, letting excess drip away. Sprinkle with plenty of the coconut until coated, then set it on the prepared sheet. Now add two chocolate eyes and a mouth, and if you like, cut a few little eyebrows from the chocolate drops too. Freeze the lollies for at least 4 hrs, and up to a week.


