


The financial support of all these organisations for our village project in an incredibly competitive arena has been **made possible by the**

Village School magazine from 1935

A copy of the School magazine commemorating the King's Jubilee in 1935 has recently and kindly been donated to our archive. The "Editorial" written by Miss Ault the Headmistress explains that it is the first time the school has produced multiple copies of a magazine. The editorial also says "it is entirely the work of the children" and all the text appears to be in the children's own handwriting with their names and ages given in a contents list.

It is a charming 36 page booklet with, poems, coloured drawings and articles about the school and the village, produced by 23 children between the ages of 6 and 13. Here are three of the poems included in it:



GOLDHANGER PARISH COUNCIL Report of the Ordinary Meeting held on 12.3.2019

The damaged sign for Little Totham Road has now been repaired.

As from September the Parish Council meeting will move to the second Wednesday of each month.

The Parish Council will now make the grant of £5,000 towards the improvement works at the Village Hall. These works will commence on 8th April and should be completed by the end of July.

It was noted that the Village Hall Management Committee has put up a "Permissive Footpath" sign from the Village Hall to Marigold Wood.

The Parish Council will purchase three new dog bins to go on various locations in the village.

A reminder was given that local council elections take place on 2nd May and any resident interested in becoming a councillor can obtain nomination papers from the District Council.

Councillor Mrs Bamford advised that she will be standing for the Tollesbury Ward at the forthcoming elections and will therefore not be representing Goldhanger: However, Councillor Mrs Thompson will be standing for the Tolleshunt D'Arcy Ward as before.

Planning

The following decision by Maldon District Council was noted:

6 Fish Street – Single storey side extension and first floor rear extension – approved.

The following amended application was considered:

1 Benham Close – proposed partial conversion of existing double garage to habitable accommodation and a rear and side extension – The Parish Council has no comment to make.

Maldon District Council will be asked what enforcement it intends to take on the recently refused variation of condition for the footpath link from Maldon Road and Church Street via BClose. This link was required by the Planning Inspector when the application went to Appeal.

<u>Highways</u>

Essex County Council is making available a sum of money for footway repairs, and each parish in the district has been asked to nominate two schemes. The Parish Council will put forward repair works to the footpath on the Maldon Road between the old village shop up to just opposite the telephone exchange.

A resident expressed concern at parking issues on the corner by the church. The history of the imposition of yellow lines in the Square and Fish Street was explained.

Play area

The annual play area inspection has now been carried out and work will take place to deal with any problems reported.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will take place on Tuesday 9th April.

Report of the Annual Village Assembly held on 12th March 2019

Mrs Hazel Steele from the Tolleshunt Major Community Speed Watch group gave an interesting talk on the setting up of a group and how it operates. This is relevant to Goldhanger as a group will be set up in the village in the summer.

Mrs Steele explained how Essex Police help in setting up and registering new groups by providing training, equipment (calibrated speed gun, high viz jackets and signage) and selecting suitable sites for the group to work. She felt that a minimum of twelve committed volunteers is a good number, which allows rotas to be drawn up to provide regular coverage. The volunteers can work in groups of three or four – one to use the speed gun, another to take registration numbers, car colour and make (if possible) and a third to record these details. Records are then put on line with information checked from the DVLA website, and the police can also check the records to see if vehicles have appropriate insurance cover and MOT certificates. The police will then send a letter to offenders, and if the same vehicle is reported twice the police can then visit the keeper. The information supplied by the Speed Watch group can also be used to deal with drug driving.

Mrs Steele felt that the Tolleshunt Major group had made a difference with speeding in the village, and residents appreciated the work that the group does. The group averages about five to six captures per session, and is most effective when used in conjunction with Maldon District Council's Trucam team.

Mrs Steele then answered questions from residents who have already expressed an interest in joining the new Goldhanger group, and the Chair of the meeting thanked her for a most informative talk.

The Chair's report on the work of the Parish Council in the past year was then read out (for report see next page).

GOLDHANGER PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 12 March 2019

I deliver the Chairman's report of Parish Council activities over the past year. We are running a month earlier than usual because of the timing of the forthcoming elections including both District & Parish Councils. So, if you wish to put yourself forward then now is your opportunity.

1. Council Composition

Rachel Smith left the Parish Council in November last year. Other positions have remained the same.

2. Planning

There have been various applications for the council to consider and report their view to Maldon District Council, who make the decisions.

New housing applications have been as follows:

- (Further application 18/00868/FUL) Land Adjacent Falcon Hall, conversion of nissen hut to residential dwelling Objected & refused
- The Chequers Inn Car Park, Erection of one detached house Objected & Refused

3. Highways

During last year Highways implemented, 'improvement' works associated with 30MPH repeater signs around the village, at best Goldhanger Parish Council considers this maintenance, and does not reflect the programme of traffic calming that was originally requested many years ago!

Local Highways Panel consider all works in Goldhanger Parish closed out.

Parking within the village

It is over a year since the parking restrictions in Fish Street and the corners of the junction within the Square were put in place last summer. The village remains busy with visitors at times but the Parish Council is not aware of any parking related issues at present. South Essex Parking Partnership carry out enforcement visits.

Accidents

Again this year we have seen a number of accidents in our Parish on the road between Wash Bridge and our boundary on the D'arcy side

We remain keen to keep track of accidents as this data is not held by any other parties. Collecting this data will give us an evidence base which we can call upon, should we request any safety improvement works in the future.

So please email myself or other Councillors details of any accidents you may see.

4. Playing Field, Woodland and Leisure

A number of Dog bins in the village require maintenance, this is being expedited. We are still considering park path improvement works along the park to the seawall but quotes obtained to date are disproportionate to our annual income from precept and so we need to consider funding applications.

The play equipment inspection showed that some play equipment could benefit from replacing, an amount has been put aside in the budget for this, but high costs of replacing equipment will likely require a fund to be accrued over a few years

Marigold Wood,.

The trees continue to establish well and we have started to cut a verge strip beside the circular path

Allotments

Councillor Clive Cheesman has continued to administer the allotments and if you are interested in having a plot, please contact him.

5. Neighbourhood Watch

Malcolm Holmes with his team has continued to keep us all informed of the latest scams and circulatedrelevant Police crimes reports for the Maldon District. Please see the Parish Magazine for further details and contact Malcolm if you wish to receive emails.

6. Precept

The Parish Precept is a tax charged on each property to fund the activities the Parish Council undertake for the benefit of the community, our budget is mainly taken up with our legal obligations associated with Parish assets, and can be found on your Council tax bill. The Parish Council work hard to keep this as low as possible for residents.

The Precept for 18/19 was £13,200 which included a pledge of £5000 towards the village Hall improvements and general increases in our recurring expenditure. For the coming year 19/20 the precept will be £8600

In view of our low turnover it is considered prudent to maintain one year's expenditure in reserve for the unexpected.

7. Defibrilators

Plaques are planned to be installed in each phone box to thank all those who have made donations.

The light in the box on the main road has been intermittently faulty and while bulbs have been replaced the light continues to fail, this will be investigated.

8. GDPR

New General data protection regulations became law in 2018, which required the council to review their administration procedures.

9. Solitary Soldiers

MDC provided all parishes with solitary soldiers as a remembrance of 100 years since the end of WWI, many people in the village embraced this project and I would like to thank everyone who decorated our soldier with poems and personal tributes of remembrance. We plan to display our soldier again around Oct/Nov as an act of remembrance.

10. Speedwatch

We are in the process of setting up a speedwatch group for Goldhanger, the minimum of 10 persons has been reached and when there is space available on the training programme from the co-ordinator at Essex fire and rescue service, this project will progress.

11. Village Hall

While the Village Hall is a separate entity to the Parish Council, the hall is an important element to our village, community and the Parish Council, who are reliant on its availability for meetings.

The village hall improvement plans were approved last year and a start date during this year is anticipated.

The plans for improvement of the village hall facilities require a lot of work and fund raising by the Village Hall committee and I would encourage all residents to support events.

I understand that the Village Hall Committee now have sufficient funding to allow construction to start

I would like to thank Vysian, our Clerk, for another year of devoted service supporting and guiding us, and all Councillors for their dedicated work which enables us to continue to minimise the precept.

Recipe of the month

Pistachio, chilli and lemon spaghetti

Prep **5 minutes**Cook **12 minutes**Serves **4**

Salt

100g fresh basil, leaves picked 1 garlic clove, peeled 100g pistachios



2 red bird's eye chillies (or less, depending how comfortable with chilli heat)

Zest and juice of 1 lemon 80ml olive oil 400g spaghetti

- 1. Put a large pan of water on to boil and add two teaspoons of salt for every litre of water. In the meantime, finely chop the basil, and do the same with the garlic, pistachios and chilli. Run the knife repeatedly over all the chopped ingredients, until they're very, very fine, then transfer to a large bowl. Add the lemon zest, three tablespoons of lemon juice, the olive oil (if you like, use a little more, to loosen the sauce) and half a teaspoon of salt (or to taste), and mix well.
- 2. Cook the pasta in the boiling water for seven minutes (or according to packet instructions), until al dente. Scoop out 100ml or so of the pasta water with a ladle, then drain the pasta. Add the cooked pasta to the pesto bowl, toss to coat thoroughly, adding a little pasta water, if necessary, to loosen the sauce, then serve.






