Second World War casualties and heroes

It is 80 years since the start of the Second World War, and with commemorations coming up in June for the 75th anniversary of the D-day landings, it is timely to look back at Goldhanger's involvement in that war. In 1946 the *Essex Newsman* reported: "Goldhanger, with a population of 360, sent 50 men and women to the services, all of whom returned to receive a gift of 17 guineas". Many villages put the names of WW-2 casualties onto their WW-1 memorials, and as no names were added to ours, it is assumed there were no deaths on active service from this village. Largely due to the internet, we now know of two men with strong local connections who lost their lives and a local hero.

Lieut. Eric Kempson, RNVR lost his life at sea in 1942 near Sumatra. This was recorded in an obituary in The Times in 1945:

ON ACTIVE SERVICE

KEMPSON.—On Feb. 16, 1942, at sea, near Sumatra,
ERIC JOHN (ROBIN) KEMPSON, Lieut., R.N.V.R., formerly
of H.M.S. Prince of Wales, second son of Mr. and Mrs.
Eric Kempson, Corner Cottage, Goldhanger, Essex,
aged 25.

He was reported "missing at sea" from *HMS Prince of Wales* when it was attacked by the Japanese. Corner Cottage is close to Rockleys and is today in the parish of Tolleshunt Major. Maud McMullen who lived at Rockleys and was well known in our village was his aunt. There is an oak chair dedicated to her in the village hall. His sister was the actress Rachel Kempson so he was the uncle of Vanessa, Lynn and Corin Redgrave.

Fusilier Henry John Hawkins is recorded in the Commonwealth War Graves Commission website as a WW-2 casualty and is buried in Naples war cemetery. He was killed in 1943 at the age of 26 and was: "Husband of Joan Isabel Hawkins, of Goldhangar, Essex". A photo of his grave and these details are at... www.twgpp.org/photograph/view/1953924. The Hawkins family have not been identified at Goldhanger, but genealogy searches have identified a: "Joan Isabel Sweetland, spouse of Henry John Hawkins" of Goldhanger, who it seems later remarried into the Campe family, who were farmers at Falcons Hall.



Major Bill Hopwood married Winsome Page of the Old Rectory. He participated in the raid on St Nazaire in 1942. The raid was successful in demolishing the large lock-gate, but the lives of many British commandos were lost. Hopwood survived, was captured and spent the rest of the war as a POW. After his death the family donated his medals and papers to the Chelmsford museum. Today there are many references to Lieutenant "Hoppy" Hopwood on websites and in books that describe that raid.

As the result of contributions from former residents, past newspaper reports, local W.I. minutes and the internet, much about the village involvement in WW-2 has now been learnt and recorded, which perhaps in the past was eclipsed by WW-1 involvements. The *Goldhanger in the Past* book published in 2016 has 5 pages about WW-2, and the *Goldhanger Past* website currently has 15 pages if printed, including much more about Bill Hopwood.



Planning

You'll be relieved to know that the bunch in the first photo aren't working for the contractor Aquanera, but you may spot some familiar faces!

As you can see good progress is being made with the scaffolding and roof cover now on so that the existing roof can be replaced.

The footings, base and lower brickwork for the new extension are also in situ. The existing toilets are now gone and there are two temporary toilets situated outside near the back of the hall.

Just to remind you of a few other items regarding access:

- There is no parking at the back or front of the hall during the works, if you need to drive please car share when possible and park on Head Street but please be courteous to neighbours with regard to space and noise
- There are temporary toilets only available at the rear of the building until July 11th.
- The permissive footpath from Marigold Wood is being reopened on 10th May but closed again from 4th June - 7th June when scaffolding is due to be taken down
- The hall remains open to hirers and events with the entrance at the back. Assisted disabled access is available via a temporary ramp, please ask if you need assistance.
- Work is going to plan and expected to complete early August, we'll keep you updated of progress.

We hope you can bear with us whilst these much needed improvements are developed - it will be worth it!





Recipe of the month

Tuna Fish Cakes

Prep Less than 30 mins Cook 30-60 mins Makes 6

- 2 medium floury potatoes (peeled and quartered)
- large knob of unsalted butter
- 1½ tbsp mayonnaise
- 1 unwaxed lemon, finely grated zest only
- 3 spring onions, thinly sliced
- 150g tin of tuna, drained
- 2 slices bread
- 1 egg, lightly beaten
- plain flour
- sea salt and freshly ground black pepper
 - 1. Preheat the oven to 200C/180C Fan/Gas 6.
 - 2. Put the potatoes in a saucepan, cover with cold water and bring to the boil. Reduce the heat to a simmer and cook for 15–20 minutes, or until tender.
 - 3. Drain the potatoes and return them to the pan with the butter, mayonnaise, lemon zest, spring onions, salt and a generous amount of black pepper. Mash together until smooth. Stir in the tuna and set aside.
 - 4. Put the bread in a food processor and pulse until it crumbs. Put the egg, flour and breadcrumbs into three separate shallow bowls.
 - 5. Shape the tuna mixture into six fishcakes. Coat each first in flour, then in egg, then in breadcrumbs.
 - 6. Place on a baking tray and bake for 15 minutes, or until the breadcrumbs are just golden. Serve.






