


Stanley Wilkin at Bounds Farm

As the strawberry picking season starts at Bounds Farm, it is perhaps timely to look back to the early days of Wilkin & Sons at Bounds Farm. The company bought the farm in 1923 and Stanley Wilkin moved into the farmhouse to manage the farm, while his oldest brother Charles ran the factory at Tiptree.


As well as developing many varieties of soft fruits on the farm over the next 20 years Stanley also bred many pedigree animals including horses, dogs, pigs, sheep, cows, chickens and ducks. He was probably best known as an international breeder of Whippets.

In those days the strawberries were grown in the open and picking times were all important, so picking started at 4am. Many Goldhanger residents took part in this annual activity as the photos on this month's cover testify. The fruit was taken to Tiptree by horse and wagon where boiling would continue until 3am the next day. The photos are from a book entitled *The Story of Tiptree Jam - the First Hundred Years*, which was written by local historian Maura Benham in 1985, with encouragement and assistance from Stanley's son John.









Stanley was an enthusiastic benefactor and preacher of the Wesleyan Chapel in Head St. Stanley was also a keen horseman and member of the local hunt. He was frequently seen riding his mount to the factory at Tiptree on weekdays and to the Wesleyan Chapel on Sundays.

On his death in 1946 Stanley's remains were carried from Bounds Farm to St.Peters Church on an open wagon drawn by two Suffolk Punch heavy horses. John then became director of the factory at Tiptree, a role he maintained until the late 1980s. John continued to live at Bounds, keeping a strong interest in the business for the rest of his life.



Village Hall Improvements - Latest News



So the digging has finally begun and we excitedly look forward to seeing the improvements take shape over the next few weeks.

A few items of note regarding access:

- There will be no access to parking at the back or front of the hall during the works, if you need to drive please car share when possible and park on Head Street but please be courteous to neighbours with regard to space and noise
- The permissive footpath from Marigold Wood through the Village Hall grounds will be closed temporarily from the following inclusive dates

23rd April - 10th May

4th June - 7th June

- From 7th May the existing toilet facilities will be removed. A temporary toilet / wash room will be in place outside the hall.
 There will be no disabled access to this temporary facility.
- The hall remains open to hirers and events with the temporary entrance at the back. Assisted disabled access is available via a temporary ramp, please ask if you need assistance.

Works are expected to complete early August and we'll keep you updated. We hope you can bear with us whilst these much needed improvements are developed - it will be worth it!



Election results

Due to the uncontested election the following have been returned as new Councillors with effect from 2nd May:

Julia Bourn, Clive Cheeseman, Stephen Ellis, Sarah Jane Holmes, Hugh Reynolds and Michael Sargeant.

Planning

There were no decisions from Maldon District Council.

New applications:

St Peter's Church Church Street: Turkey Oak, American Oak and English Oak – Lift lower branches (not above 2.5m ground clearance). All branches taken back to trunk. Remove ivy. Supported.

14 Maldon Road: Proposed loft conversion with velux windows to front and rear elevations.

Supported.

Audit of accounts year ended 31.3.2019

As the Council's gross income and expenditure did not each exceed £25,000 it has exempted itself from a limited assurance review by the external auditor. The accounts are currently with the internal auditor and the information required by law will be posted on the Council's web site in due course.

Highways

The Speed Indicator Device in Maldon Road is working only intermittently. The Council will seek to obtain new parts for repair work.

Training for the new Community Speed Watch Group is scheduled to take place in May.

Play area

Following concerns expressed by residents, pigeon spikes will be installed on the play equipment to prevent bird fouling.

New dog bins have been ordered to replace those which are damaged. Moat will be asked to ensure that the frontage to its properties in Maldon Road is kept maintained during the growing season. It will also be asked if there are plans to replace the tree which was knocked down in the past.

The next meeting of the Parish Council is the Annual Meeting on Tuesday 14th May.

Recipe of the month

Italian lentil soup



Prep Less than 30 mins Cook 30-60 mins Serves 2



100g green lentils
olive oil, for frying
1 onion, finely chopped
3-4 garlic cloves, finely chopped
handful fresh basil, leaves left whole and stalks finely chopped
400g tin chopped tomatoes
400ml stock
salt and freshly ground black pepper

- Add the lentils to a large saucepan and cover with 5cm/2in water. Cook over a medium heat (you don't want to boil the lentils) for about 20 minutes. To test if the lentils are cooked crush one between your fingers, it should feel creamy not starchy. Season the lentils with salt and pepper.
- 2. Heat a large saucepan and add the oil. Add the onions and cook over a medium heat until soft and golden.
- 3. Add the garlic and basil stalks. Be careful not to burn the garlic. Once the dish starts smelling strongly of garlic add the chopped tomatoes.
- 4. Add the lentils and stock and stir. Leave to cook for 5 minutes for all the flavours to marry.
- 5. Season with salt and pepper and ladle the soup into bowls. Top with grated pecorino or parmesan cheese (if using), basil leaves and a drizzle of olive oil.






