Origins of the bell tower

St. Peter's bell tower is a very prominent and significant feature of the village. However little is known about its history other than it was constructed in the 1400s. We know the history of the bells, but we have to turn to other sources to learn how and why the tower was built, and there are many similar towers in East Anglia that have good historical records.

Bell towers with thick walls were expensive to build, needing both expertise and a large labour force. The wealthy Higham family, who lived at Highams Manor at the time, were most likely to have funded it.

Our tower is built entirely with Kentish Ragstone from Maidstone, in contrast with the rest of church structure, which is a mix of types of stone. The name Ragstone has its origins with early stonemasons who noticed that this stone produced a ragged surface when split, unlike other UK limestones. It is easy to assume that the tower was built just to house bells, but similar towers in comparable locations were also built for other reasons...

To impress - a demonstration of the important and dominant position the Church and the Higham family had at that time. It is difficult to imagine our Church without a tower. This sketch helps to convey how it would have looked without it both then and now...



As a majestic entrance and exit – directly from the centre of the village for special occasions. When there were fewer bells special guests would have processed in through the bell ringers and straight down the aisle.

An observation and signalling tower - at times of threatened invasion from the sea and the river. In the middle ages there were many battles that would have raised local fears of an attack and justified keeping a lookout.

For fortification - The crenulated battlements on the tower, the heavy door and small windows (the large gothic style windows came later) all help to give an impression of fortification not unlike medieval castles with turrets.

For time keeping - from Saxon times on, churches used sundials so that a bell was rung at the correct time for services. On the south face of the tower there are signs of a small round fill-in that could have once had a simple sundial. There are also signs on the north face that the tower once had a clock face, but restoration and re-pointing has lost most of the evidence.

Finally, for bells - when the tower was first built it may have had just one bell. An inventory of Church goods at the time of the Reformation in 1549 lists four bells. More bells have been progressively added over the centuries and today with eight it is a very tight fit.

This month's cover is of a postcard from 1905 and is the earliest photo of the tower we have. Tourists were obviously around then. How's your French?





We are looking for all types and styles of trees to decorate the church over the whole weekend.



Our theme for this year is 'Pantomime'.



My favourite event with him will always be his 40th Birthday when we spent 3 days just eating and drinking, starting at St. Margarets at Cliff in Kent and then progressing on the ferry to Calais and eventually coming back 2 days later having missed at least 2 ferries after the one we'd originally booked. I'm rambling I know, but there are so many happy memories.

Maybe you'll remember him holding court, telling funny stories, his jokes, being 'DJ porky sausage' at New Year, his BBQ cooking at Gala weekend, his falling asleep in the tap room with a pizza or Ozzy or both in his lap, his ability to down a pint in one and rattling his empty glass on the bar, for putting up 'no Malcolms in the Tap Room', his love of sport, his love of music, his putting his head to one side when in a mood, where do I stop. I'm sure we'll all be chatting about him and reminiscing about him in the weeks to come and for long after that as well.

I'll finish by saying I just want to send all our thoughts, love and prayers to Natalie, his Son Daniel and all his family.



Village Defibrillators

A question came up recently about the suitability of adult defibs being used on Children (1-8 years) and infants (under 1 year) and there is a lot of different advice depending on where you are in the country! However, I have chatted to our AED (defib) providers who advised as follows:

"The chance of using a defibrillator on a child under the age of 8 years old in an average community in the UK is about 1 in 3000 years. The chance of that defibrillator being used on an adult in the community (ie over 8 years old) is 1 in 1000 people per annum."

These statistics show how rare it is for an AED to be needed by a child.

Our village AED units are Lifeline DDU2000 series units with video screen which guides the user step by step with adult pads. Our provider, The community Heartbeat Trust, has lots of further information on their website if you want to find out more (link below).

The resuscitation council advice document 'Paediatric Basic Life Support' (link below) advice on using AEDS on children is as follows:

- A standard AED can be used in children over 8 years.
- Purpose-made paediatric pads, or programs which attenuate the energy output of an AED, are recommended for children between 1 and 8 years.
- If no such system or manually adjustable machine is available, an unmodified adult AED may be used for children older than 1 year.
- There is insufficient evidence to support a recommendation for or against the use of AEDs in children less than 1 year.

GOLDHANGER PARISH COUNCIL Report of the Ordinary Meeting held on 9.10.2019

Planning

Maldon District Council decisions:

32 Head Street – Proposed front/side extension, garage conversion, roof lights and removal of side lean to. Approved.

1 Benham Close – garage conversion. Refused.

There were no new applications to consider.

Highways

There is still no date from Essex Police for the training of the new Goldhanger Community Speedwatch team.

Councillors Julia Bourn and Mike Sargeant walked around the village with representatives from Essex County Council Highways to discuss various issues. The Local Highways Panel scheme to increase the speed limit to 40mph in parts of the village will not now go ahead, and the Parish Council questioned how such a scheme was ever put forward. The speed limits will now remain as at present, with an advisory 20 mph maximum limit at the Tolleshunt D'Arcy end of the village. The faded speed limit signs at the Maldon end will be replaced with chevrons, road marker poles and "Please Drive Carefully" signs, and drainage at the Charity Farm bends will be investigated. The Highways representatives pointed out that although new signs will be put in, there is no budget to repair or replace them in the future.

Other issues mentioned were that HGVs are using Little Totham Road which has a weight restriction; and the overgrown hedge at the junction of Church Street and Maldon Road. This will be reported to the Highways Rangers who it is hoped will cut it back although this is not guaranteed. Flooding issues in Fish Street due to blocked gulleys will also be investigated.

Other issues

New pads will be obtained for the defibrillators. Councillor Mrs Bourn will seek clarification as to whether a standard defibrillator can be used on babies and very young children.

Due to the closure in 2020 of the current host for the Parish Council's website, other arrangements will be looked into.

Concern was expressed that the grass triangle at the junction of Maldon Road and Little Totham Road is being used to park vehicles which are for sale.

At the next meeting the Council will look at the general provision and location of dog waste bins in the village.

The next meeting of the Parish Council is the Ordinary Meeting on Wednesday 13th November.

Recipe of the month

Gingerbread cake with orange icing

Prep less than 30 mins Cook 1 - 2 hours

Serves 10 - 12

For the cake

225g/8oz butter, softened

225g/8oz light muscovado sugar

225g/8oz golden syrup

225g/8oz black treacle

225g/8oz self-raising flour, sifted

225g/8oz wholemeal self-raising flour, sifted

4 tsp ground ginger

2 tbsp stem ginger (from a jar), chopped

2 free-range eggs, beaten

300ml/101/2fl oz milk

For the orange icing

150g/5oz icing sugar

1 orange, juice and zest

Method

Line a 23cm/9in square cake tin at least 4cm/1½in deep with baking parchment.

Preheat the oven to 160C/325F/Gas 3.

Place the butter, sugar, golden syrup and black treacle into a pan and heat gently until the mixture has melted evenly. Set aside to cool slightly.

Sift the flours, ground ginger and stem ginger into a large mixing bowl and mix gently. Pour the cooled butter mixture into the flour. Add the eggs and milk and beat with a wooden spoon until well combined.

Pour the cake batter into the tin and level the surface with a palette knife or the back of a spoon. Bake for 50 minutes, or until the cake has risen and is golden-brown and a skewer inserted into the middle comes out clean. Set aside to cool slightly in the tin, then transfer the cake to a wire rack and set aside to cool completely.

Meanwhile, for the orange icing, sift the icing sugar into a bowl. Add about two tablespoons of the orange juice and mix to a smooth paste. Add more orange juice, as necessary, until you get a smooth icing of the consistency you desire.

Pour the icing over the cooled cake and spread lightly, allowing it to ooze over the edges. Sprinkle over chopped orange zest and set the cake aside until the icing has set.




