Model-T Fords struggling up Market Hill


In the first part of the 20th century Old Rectory Farm, also called Church Farm, prospered by growing apple, pear, plum and greengage trees. Charles Page, the farmer had a reputation for innovation and applied his engineering skills across the business. He developed his own bottle-washing machine using wind power and water from his own well to produce plum and greengage jams commercially.

He was said to be the first person in the village to own an automobile and acquired several Model-T Fords to deliver his produce to customers and make regular deliveries to the West Station goods yard in Maldon. This involved going up Market Hill, however early Ford Model-Ts could not make it up the hill when fully loaded, so they had to go up backwards! Two reasons have since been given for this phenomenon: the vehicles had a reverse gear ratio that was lower than first gear, and early Model-Ts had no mechanical fuel pump so with the petrol tank at the rear the fuel didn't reach the engine on a steep hill going forwards when fully loaded. The Model-T was developed in Detroit, Michigan which is very flat with no hills.

Charles Page later converted his Model-Ts into crop sprayers, one of which can be seen in this month's cover photo.

This piece of local history has recently been corroborated by a similar recollection... When Osborne's buses first started taking

local school children to Maldon they too had Ford Model-Ts with the same problem. Their solution was to ask the pupils to get out at the bottom of the hill and walk up. The bus drove up empty and the children re-joined it at the top.







Village Hall Opening Ceremony - Sunday 25th August

It was village life at its best in Goldhanger on Sunday 25th August, a beautiful day and a grand turn-out from villagers and our funders in celebration of the completion of our Village Hall improvements. The ceremony started with a welcome from chairman Anton Jermy and resident Dorothy Chaplin cutting the ribbon. Dorothy was present when the foundation stone of the original hall was laid in 1937 and has been a supporter of the Village Hall all her life. As the crowds flowed through the new spacious and sunlit entrance foyer, filling the bunting-clad hall, Chris Joslin (Improvement Project Manager) gave an uplifting thank you speech to our funders, our community and to Dorothy who was presented with a bouquet of flowers.

Aquanera the contractors had a special gift for little Ren Harris, a three year old neighbour of the hall, who had also been 'project managing' the works on a daily basis, especially checking that the digger was working. Ren couldn't make the opening ceremony but was presented the next day with a Bosch toy set including chainsaw, hard hat, ear defenders and gloves. You can see Ren showing off his building kit in the photos below.

When the speeches were over Dorothy cut the celebration cake, which Barbara had made from no less than 4 cakes! Along with this and a bumper selection of other home made cakes there was plenty to keep us going. Thank you to all the cake makers and helpers. The Four Blokes band (actually two blokes and two ladies!) entertained us with their cheery summertime music.

The Art Society had kindly loaned their display boards, so, with the help of David Newman (History Group) we were able to show photos and documents from 1936 to the present day, including the original hall and management committee, the many clubs, organisations and events that have brought our hall to life over the years, the 1995 improvements of the kitchen and toilets, culminating in a few progress photos of the 2019 improvement works.

In 1937 when the Village Hall was formally opened, there were 4 speeches each limited to 3 mins (by order!) ...well we didn't quite manage that but there was still plenty of time to enjoy the refreshments, listen to the band and take pride in what has been achieved.



Recipe of the month

Halloween biscuits

Prep 20 mins
Cook 15 mins
Makes 16 sandwiched, or 32 single

200g unsalted butter, very soft
140g golden caster sugar
1 large egg yolk
1 tsp vanilla extract
300g plain flour, plus extra for rolling
100g raspberry jam (or use lemon curd or chocolate spread)



140g icing sugar, sifted Food colourings (optional)

Method

Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4 and line 2 large baking sheets with baking parchment. Put the butter, sugar, egg yolk, vanilla and ¼ tsp salt into a large bowl and beat with a wooden spoon until smooth. Stir in the flour to make a stiff dough, then shape into 2 discs, cover with cling film and chill for 10 mins.

With plenty of extra flour on the work surface and rolling pin, roll a batch of dough to the thickness of a £1 coin. Stamp out as many 7cm rounds as you can. In half of the rounds, stamp out 2 eye sockets with an apple corer, then use well-floured fingers to pinch the jaw shapes. Lift onto the baking sheets. Bake for 15 mins or until pale golden, then cool for 2 mins before lifting onto a wire rack.

Sandwich the cold biscuits together with the jam. Mix the icing sugar with 4 tsp water until smooth, divide into 3, then colour as you like. Put into piping bags, snip off the tips, then pipe spooky patterns and faces onto the skulls




