"My stay in Goldhanger was a very special time"

an abridged letter from a Mrs Betty Sydes recalling an experience of 80 years ago in a booklet entitled: "Migration to Maldon" published in 1995 by Maldon District Council

In September 1939, expectant mothers, of which I was one, and mothers with children under five, had to report to the school in Woodford. Several double-decker buses arrived - none of us had the slightest idea where we were going. We eventually arrived at Goldhanger. The people of Goldhanger had been led to expect that they would be getting a group of unaccompanied schoolchildren, but despite this they turned up trumps and billets were found for everybody.

I was sent to the pork butcher Mr Scobell, who had a house in Fish Street. He didn't have a shop, adjacent to his house he had a small newly constructed building, where he cut up the carcasses for him to deliver in his van. He was a German who had been a prisoner of war during the First World War, had married an English girl and he had remained in England since. Mr and Mrs Scobell had two sons, one of 21 who was in the Army and Alfred who was 14. It was a lovely billet.

We ate various cuts of pork, I didn't ever find it too rich as there were always plenty of home grown vegetables. Mr Scobell had an allotment at the top of the street. All the water had to be fetched from the pump at the top of the street, and I have a lovely snapshot of Mr Scobell and Alfred standing by the pump, with the water container on wheels.

One occasion which stands out in my mind, was when we were invited to tea by the novelist Marjorie Allingham. She lived in Tolleshunt D'Arcy, in a lovely old house, which I remember as having a very big kitchen with an Aga cooker in it. Marjorie herself looked rather like a figure from a fairy tale, wearing a long black dress and she had a little white apron over it.

Where were expectant mothers to go during confinement? The powers that be solved the problem by taking over an empty house between Goldhanger and Tollesbury. The idea was that the mothers would do the cooking and look after us mothers with new babies. A retired nurse came each day. One month arriving in Goldhanger my son was born. After the birth, Mrs Scobell came in Mr Scobell's delivery van to visit and brought me a little stone coloured vase with some honeysuckle.

My stay in Goldhanger was a very special time for me. The weather had been perfect.



St Peter's Bells

Last month's Parish Magazine featured the refurbishment of our Church Bells in the 1950s and also the planned refurbishment this year.

We are pleased to say the current refurbishment has already started with the rebuilding of the large tenor wheel as the cost of this was within our finances.

There are only three companies in England that do this sort of repair work, and all are very busy. However the Nicholson Bell Hanging Company in Bridport Dorset agreed to do this in two days providing we did the removal and transportation.

The wheel is a large wooden structure bolted to the side of the bell. Similar to a narrow cartwheel, but split in two halves. No problem to unbolt and remove – we thought! We found the two halves were located together by mortice and tenon joints which after over sixty years had seized together. However, after much levering and hammering (and a few choice words) we managed to free them.

The next problem was getting them down. This was solved by removing the shuttering of one of the Belfry windows and lowering the by rope.

They just fitted in a large car and we drove them down to Dorset.

Nicholson's factory was like stepping back in time, full of classic engineering machines, and bells of many different sizes which they machine as necessary and tune to suit.

Their carpentry shop had a wonderful smell of wood, and they wasted no time in stripping the flanges that hold the bell rope in place (known as shrouds) and repairing the rim of the wheel (known as the sole). Two days later we collected the rebuilt wheel which now had solid oak shrouds and was beautifully finished. The work of a true craftsman.

The wheel was rushed back, pulled up through the window as shown, with a rope below the wheel to ensure no damage from hitting the side of the church tower.

The wheel was refitted in time for Sunday service bell ringing.





GOLDHANGER BELLRINGER'S OUTING









Weather on Saturday will be the hottest day of the year so far, according to the weather forecast this week. Well that was Saturday 29th June this year.

Clare, Vicky and I decided long before that we would participate in the bell ringing tour that Helen had arranged for all that would like to come and join in.

Saturday at 8.15 am dawned bright but not too hot ,Clare picked us up and with Vicky navigating we motored to the .north west of Kent . Yes we did get

over the bridge without any problems, this bodes well for a good start of the day.

9:45am was our first ring at St George of Wrotham. This being an eight bell tower with quite heavy bells ,the tenor being 20 cwt. This 13 century church had a 15century bell tower ,it stood on the north side of the square A stone once held a sanctuary ring that granted safety to any criminal that grasped it ,thankfully we haven't got this now

After a good ring thoroughly enjoyed departed to Addington St. Margarets church where we were so surprised with a 4 bell tower and so very light. The contrast from the tower before was so great some of our ringers couldn't manage. Well us stalwarts from Goldhanger showed them just how to do it. The tenor bell was only 5cwt so you see the difference.

At St Mary the Virgin of Kemsing our next tower we encountered more light bells 4 cwt this tenor ,obviously porridge for breakfast wasn't needed this morning. A lovely sounding set of bells.

The rude screen was the most outstanding feature of this church along with the crinkle-crankle wall outside.

What with the heat and hunger we walked to the pub," well you have to don't you". A great meal with the chef coming out to chat with us.







At St Edith well a feature of this village supposed to have healing properties if you drank it. Needless to say it isn't available on the NHS, but interesting to see. A cool ice cream went down with relish at this point. Right off to St Peter and Paul of Seal.

Gathering in the church waiting for the person to open up we noted this was a 14th century church but rather a bleak place. After frantic calls on yes the modern cell phone someone came to let us in the bell tower. this camber had a long

draft and the tenor was 9cwt, going up in weight!.

Off to Mereworth after a shorter ring at Seal, Oh what a magnificent church most impressive tower and entrance. On entering the beauty of this place was outstanding with pillars from front to back it reminded me of a synagogue. A long draft for these bells and a 10.cwt tenor, a lovely sound from the bells too.

After a long drive to our next venue at Olford, St Bartholomew. A new entrance greeted us and entering the church dated before the 11th century it was a great contrast. We were taken by the extremely beautiful small green panel at the front of the church this was also dated before the 11th century. The tenor was 10 cwt but as we were getting tired we started to flag a little. Perhaps it was the end of the day or the amount I rang but sorry to say I cannot recall any real features about this tower as I was thinking about the journey home, the dreaded tunnel.

So we left the church having had a wonderful day in spite of the heat. So much to see and remember it would take up the entire magazine so why don't you go and see for yourselves just how lovely these places are.

Well what a bonus we didn't get stuck at the tunnel but we did encounter a low amble to it for a short time but no hold up!. Glad of the air conditioning in the car yet another modern invention. So here we are back at our beloved village of Goldhanger happy but tired ringers having achieved experience with different bells and seeing wonderful churches ,what a grand day!



GOLDHANGER PARISH COUNCIL

Report of the Ordinary Meeting held on 13.8.2019

Planning

Councillors received the formal decision from Maldon District Council that it has refused permission for the proposed dwelling in the car park at The Chequers.

New applications:

St Peter's Church, Church Street; Reduce the height of a mature horse chestnut by 10m. It was noted that the application form states a reduction of 20%, and this will be pointed out to the District Council. The Parish Council has no objection to a reduction of 20%.

Amended application for 32 Head Street (proposed front/side extension, garage conversion, rooflights and removal of side lean-to). The Parish Council noted that some amendments had been made but its objections remained as before.

The Parish Council is still pressing Maldon District Council on various enforcement issues in the village.

Highways

Details had been received of a Local Highways Panel scheme to increase speed limits in various parts of the village. The origin of this scheme is not known and the Parish Council has made it clear that it totally against any such proposals and it would be interested to hear why public money has been spent on devising such a scheme.

A resident has expressed concern that cyclists have been accessing Marigold Wood from St Peter's Close. Access at this point is in fact only for pedestrians.

As yet there is no date set for the training of the new Speedwatch Group in the village.

Other issues

Due to the withdrawal of the essexinfo.net website provision in 2020 the Parish Council will be looking into alternative web site provision.

The "Meet Up Mondays" group is now meeting in The Chequers every Monday from 10 am until noon. It provides residents with an opportunity to meet others and enjoy refreshments.

Please note that as from September 2019 the Parish Council will meet on the second **Wednesday** of each month.

The next meeting of the Parish Council is the Ordinary Meeting on Wednesday 11th September.







Recipe of the month

5-ingredient Moroccan-style veggie traybake

Quick, easy, cheap and cheerful

Prep Less than 10 mins Cook 30 mins Serves 2 generously



Ingredients

- 2 large red or orange peppers, seeds removed, cut into bite-size chunks
- 2 sweet potatoes, scrubbed and cut into bite-size chunks
- 2 red onions, peeled and cut into bite-size chunks
- 200g/7oz cherry tomatoes
- 1 tbsp harissa spice mix
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- freshly ground sea salt and black pepper

Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 220C/200C Fan/Gas 7.
- 2. Put the peppers, sweet potatoes, red onions, whole cherry tomatoes, harissa spice mix, oil and a generous amount of salt and pepper on a large baking sheet. Toss well.
- 3. Roast for 30 minutes, or until everything is soft and charred, turning in the tray halfway through.




