
Oliver Warin





Oliver Warin was born in 1931 and spent his childhood in Goldhanger. He attended the village school where his mother was the well liked and respected headmistress. He lived with his mother and brother in the tiny cottage provided by the

Parish at No.10 Head St. which was the former village Poorhouse. He went on to Maldon Grammar School and then to Cambridge University, where he gained

a degree in Natural Sciences, specialising in geology.








He left the UK in 1955 and spent seven years field mapping with the Australian Bureau of Minerals. In 1962 he joined the Utah Development Company as senior geologist, and was in charge of the search for iron ore, tin and phosphate deposits in Australia and around the world. In 1980 he was leading the worldwide exploration activities of Utah International, and continued in that role from San Francisco until his retirement.


In 1994 the Australian Academy of Sciences awarded Oliver the Mawson Medal, recognising his outstanding contribution to earth science in Australia. The citation for the award recorded: "Since taking over Utah International and under Warin's direction, BHP has become one of the most successful of all mineral exploration companies". He gave the Mawson Memorial lecture at the Australian Geological Convention in Perth in September of that year.



Goldhanger, Lt Totham & Tolleshunt Major October WI Meeting March 2020



Our President welcomed us to the meeting, and reminded us of a busy March ahead with the Lent Lunch taking place and also a trip to the theatre in London to see 9-5 later in the month.

We were introduced to our speaker from the Colne Valley Tea Company who had purchased the company seven years ago when it had 35 blends of tea available. The company has grown and has now approximately 85 varieties. Ann gave us an interesting talk about the history of tea which began with the Emperor in

China. Tea was then imported to Japan and using a camel caravan it came into Europe via Russia, reaching London in 1657. In the 20th century we dominated the market and tea is now grown in Cornwall.

Ann spoke about the most popular varieties and advised that loose-leaf tea has a better taste, with the second cup from each tea infusion or bag usually more flavoursome than the first. A staggering 165 million cups of tea are drunk each day in the UK and Ann made a variety of infusions for tasting.

Each group of members were given a small pot of a dry tea blend and Helen, Padma & Linda correctly guessed the most ingredients, each winning a packet of tea. Pat O' Sullivan won the prize for the nearest estimate of the number of cups drunk.

After social time, birthday posies were given out, the raffle was drawn and won by Maria, and the flower competition was won by Carol with a very seasonal Mimosa.

We have all the relevant information you will need and Morag is happy to give guidance where needed.


The editors have taken on the advertising at the moment as an emergency measure but we cannot continue this long-term.



GOLDHANGER PARISH COUNCIL

Report of the Ordinary Meeting held on 11.3.2020

Planning

The following decision from Maldon District Council was noted:

Longwick Farm Joyces Chase - Maldon Salt. Single storey salt processing plant with associated hardstanding and external water and gas storage. Approved.

New planning applications:

Inglenook 52 Maldon Road – Proposed new garden building. The Parish Council supports this application.

Land east of Bradwell Power Station Downhall Beach Bradwell-on-Sea. Application to carry out ground investigations, load test and associated works in connection with a proposed new nuclear power station at Bradwell-on-Sea, together with the creation of two site compound areas and associated parking areas. The Council noted that this was not an application for the new Bradwell B plant but only a proposal to carry out ground investigations. It was therefore supported.

It was noted that Maldon District Council has now given the Chequers pub the status of an Asset of Community Value.

Nothing has been heard from Maldon District Council about various enforcement issues raised in the parish. This situation has now been going on for some considerable time and a letter will be sent to the District Council's chief executive asking for an explanation.

Fly tipping

Fly tipping of glass bottles in Blind Lane was reported to the District Council and one pile was removed. However, a second pile on the opposite side of the road was not dealt with. This was reported again and has now been removed.

Playing Field

Goldhanger Sailing Club has recently been installing a new water pipe from Fish Street to the Club building, and has asked for permission to dig a trench in the playing field to complete the work by 1st April. However, as this will involve the use of a JCB to carry out the work it was felt necessary to ask for this to be deferred until ground conditions improve.

Highways and drainage issues

Some signage improvement works have been carried out in Maldon Road but the Local Highways Panel will be asked if any further work is expected and a copy of the plan of the full scheme to be sent to the Parish Council. Councillor Mr Sargeant updated the Council on his investigations regarding flooding in Maldon Road. He advised that a number of companies are involved in this but are reluctant to accept ownership or responsibility for the problem. He is now liaising with Moat concerning the drains inside the Maldon Road estate to see if the problem lies on that site or further down Maldon Road.

Community Speedwatch – No date has yet been given for the training of the new group. As there has been a considerable delay in getting this scheme up and running the Fire and Police Commissioner will be asked to justify this delay.

The Council agreed to go back to Bakers of Danbury to ask for a reprice of the original quote. There is some rotten wood in the sign which needs to be dealt with before the situation worsens.

Footpaths

The fingerpost at the Blind Lane end of the footpath alongside the allotments has rotted at the base and fallen down. This will be reported to Essex County Council.








Recipe of the month

Baked bean shakshuka

Prep time less than 30 mins Cooking time 10 to 30 mins Serves 1





Method

Heat the oil in a frying pan. Fry the onion and pepper over a low heat for 5 minutes, or until softened and beginning to brown, stirring regularly with a wooden spoon.

Add the cumin and chilli flakes and cook for 20–30 seconds, stirring constantly. Tip the beans into the pan and cook for 2 minutes, stirring occasionally.

Make two dips in the beans and break an egg into each one.

Reduce the heat to low, cover with a lid and cook for 5 minutes, without stirring, until the egg whites are set but the yolks are still runny.

Sprinkle with the cheese, if using, and serve with toast on the side for dipping.




