The Goldhanger Players and Maude McMullen

The Goldhanger Players drama group performed originally between the 1930s and 1960s, and it was one of the major activities in the new Village Hall which opened in 1937. It seems the hall was built with the drama group in mind, having a large extendable stage and two green rooms or dressing rooms behind.



The Players main benefactor was Mrs Maude McMullen who lived at Follyfaunts and later moved to Rockleys Farmhouse. She and her Husband Mac were members of the first VH committee and took part in the Hall's opening ceremony. Maude was president and producer of many of the Players productions. Many plays were performed over the 30 year period, involving many residents. The oak chair, still on the stage, is dedicated to her.

This month's cover shows a curtain-call photo with Maude in the centre and four programmes. We have copies of several other programmes, including:

J B Priestley's When we were Married Anyone at Home? Ours is a Nice House

What a Treasure Broadacre Farm comedy thriller: Who Lies there

There were many complimentary reports in local newspapers at the time about the performances. They typically ran for two or three evenings and included a Saturday, after which the cast and helpers would enjoy socialising in the Rockleys Barn, which the McMullens had converted into an impressive "music room" employing Goldhanger builders Charles and Bernard Mann.





The McMullens were part of a family of very successful members of the acting profession. Maude's niece was Rachel Kempson and her husband was Sir Michael Redgrave who was president of the Goldhanger Players in the 1950s. Their children were Vanessa, Corin and Lynn Redgrave.

This photo shows Rachel at a village Hall event in the 1950s with Maude just behind. The lady in the foreground has not been identified. Perhaps you know who she is?

The current clerk will resign from the post as from 1st July and a new clerk will be appointed.

Planning

Decisions by Maldon District Council:

The Old Parsonage 12 Head Street. Proposed single storey rear extension. Approved.

Rectory Cottage Maldon Road – Alteration to the rear roof slope to provide a gable feature with Juliet balcony. Approved.

35 Church Street – Proposed replacement link building between house and previously converted garage and changes to front of converted garage. Approved.

18 Head Street – Rear extension, glazed verandah, dormers to front and rear and pitched roof to garage. Approved.

New applications.

15 Peartree Close – Claim for lawful development certificate for a proposed single storey side extension. Supported.

16 Head Street – Proposed single storey rear extension. Supported.

Other issues: The Council will apply for a bus cage at the bus stop near the Head Street/Maldon Road junction.

Enforcement issues at 1 Benham Close and the footpath from the Close to Maldon Road are being investigated by the District Council.

Audit.

The audit of the Parish Council's accounts for the year ended 31.3.2021 has now been completed and the documents can be found on the Parish Council's website.

The Council will investigate the move to internet banking.

Playing field, play area and sea wall

The new slide and springers have been put up in the play area.

The Salcott to Maldon section of the English Coastal Path is now open. As this new route will lead to more people using the sea wall, the Council is trying to get a handrail put up on the steps up to the wall from the playing field.

The footpath from Fish Street to the sea wall needs to be cleared of some vegetation so that it can be resurfaced. Councillors Mr Ellis, Mr Reynolds and Mr Sargeant will look into this.

The play area inspection will now be booked as the new equipment has been installed.

Highways

Councillors considered a letter from a number of residents in Church Street and St Peter's Close concerning parking issues when parents drop off or collect their children from the Nursery School and block people's driveways and the road. Residents feel that the nursery is avoiding addressing the problem of irresponsible parking. The South Essex Parking Partnership advises that photographic evidence of inconsiderate parking (with dates and times) should be sent to its on-line portal and they can then try to find a solution. Obstruction of the highway is a police matter but it has proved very difficult to

get a police presence on site. The Parish Council will send a letter to the nursery to advise that it is aware of the problem.

The Parking Partnership has been asked to attend in Fish Street over the summer months to carry out parking enforcement. Recent patrols issued five penalties to motorists.

Councillor Mr Sargeant reported that he is making little headway with Essex County Council regarding drainage issues in the village but will continue to pursue Cllr Durham to get things moving. He advised that Highways know that their drains are blocked in two places, and once this has been cleared the problems with the Moat drainage should be rectified.

Councillor Mr Bishop has been looking at Speed Indicator Devices in other villages and is awaiting information from Highways. He will look into the cost of a new solar panel.

Village pump

Further work was scheduled for mid June but has not yet been carried out. Councillor Mr Sargeant will chase up the contractors.

Marigold Wood

The wood is looking very healthy at the moment. Two new padlocks for the gates have yet to be obtained.

Bus shelters

The Council agreed the quote from Broadleaf Fencing for the replacement of posts and fence panels at the bus halt at the junction of Maldon Road and Head Street.

Other issues

The Council was approached by Sky TV who wanted to put up a drone over the village as part of a film on the White House Farm murders. The request was declined.

At the next meeting Councillors will discuss the possibility of obtaining a Tree Protection Order for the oak tree on the Moat frontage opposite 3 Maldon Road.

The overgrown verges at the junction of Head Street and Maldon Road will be reported to Highways as they are causing visibility problems for drivers entering and exiting Head Street.

Next meeting

The next meeting of the Council will be held on Wednesday 14th July at 7.30 pm in the Village Hall.








CARPET BOWLS Starting up again

Kick off at 13:45.


All welcome especially new members. Just come along and join in.

Serves 2




Ingredients

- olive oil 3 tbsp
- courgette 1, sliced
- garlic 2 cloves, thinly sliced
- dried chilli flakes a large pinch
- eggs 4, beaten
- goat's cheese 100g
- spring onion 1, thinly sliced
- leafy green salad to serve



Method

- Preheat the grill. Heat the olive oil in a 20cm ovenproof frying pan and add the sliced courgette. Fry for 4-5 minutes over a high heat or until browned. Add the garlic and dried chilli flakes, and cook for 1 minute.
- 2. Lower the heat to medium. Tip in the eggs, and season generously. Cook until set around the edges.
- 3. Dot the top with the goat's cheese and slide under the hot grill. Cook until browned on top then scatter with the spring onions and serve with a leafy green salad.



Information on Goldhanger Neighbourhood Watch

You may have read or heard of NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH schemes but are still not sure what they are or whether you would like to be involved in one. It is worth stressing that is **not** a vigilante organisation and that participation is passive. Members are encouraged to act as the *eyes and ears* of the community. However, it is the job of the police to patrol the streets and *NOT* Neighbourhood Watch members.

What is Neighbourhood Watch? The aims of a NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH GROUP are as follows:

- It's a free, confidential service and it is up to you how involved you want to be
- To reduce opportunities for crime by deterring would be thieves and vandals
- To establish a community spirit so that everyone can contribute to the property by mutual co-operation
- To inform the Police of any suspicious activity
- To make members more aware of local crime problems and be more security conscious about their homes and property
- To encourage neighbourliness

What's in it for me?

- 1. Many home contents insurance companies offer a discount to the members of registered Neighbourhood Watch groups
- 2. Property prices can rise in areas where and area has little or no crime
- 3. Crimes against property can be reduced
- 4. A better community spirit can be created
- 5. Neighbourhood Watch groups have frequent contact with their local policing teams
- 6. Information and crime alerts can be quickly circulated to Neighbourhood Watch groups thus raising awareness and the opportunity to prevent crime and from members from being victims of crime
- 7. You don't have to be actively involved to participate. Many members simply register their email addresses with us so that they can receive crime alerts and crime prevention advice via their computers in their own homes. Registered e-mail addresses are held securely and NEVER divulged to outside agencies etc.

In short, forming a Neighbourhood Watch group will lead to a greater shared awareness of local problems and a better understanding of practical steps that can be taken to tackle them. If you want to know more, contact
