Essex - Goldhanger A historic pub interior of regional importance Listed Status: II Church Street Goldhanger





A 16th-/17th-century pub which in Victorian times consisted of the little-changed public bar and tap room in the wide red and black quarry-tiled passageway that runs from the front door. Both tap room and public bar have Victorian bar counters.

The public bar has a splendid fitted settle on the passageway side that has some windows at the top and bench seating attached. Partitions like this existed in great numbers in pubs throughout the country but are now very rare. This small room has an ancient brick fireplace, old dado panelling with benches attached and a tongue-and-groove ceiling over part (possibly the area to the right near the bar was a cellar in the distant past).

The large rear bar clearly came into use at a later date possibly in inter-war times. The floor is much higher than that of the bar so the counter is one of the lowest in the country! This room has one old panelled wall, a 1930s brick fireplace and has been extended to the rear.

The rear right small room was formerly part of the domestic accommodation and is still like someone's front room with its armchairs and small early-20th-century tiled fireplace. The far right small room near the entrance has also been brought into use and contains a bar billiards table.

Ministry Team Message June 2021

June is one of my best loved months. The days lengthen. There is light, lots of it. The roses bloom, the barbeques come out. We cook and eat outside. Smell the smoke and savour the company. Spread the picnic blanket and begin the feast. We watch the sunset. Spinnakers bloom into balloons of bright colour running over the water in light winds. In fields and gardens, strawberries slowly ripen. It all seems more than a bit wondrous to me; a chance to be on the bright side of life for a while.

I have a long-held June ambition to gather a group of friends together and read through A Midsummer Night's Dream in the garden in the evening on the longest day as the night slowly gathers in to darkness. The play, like June itself, is wondrous. It is a topsy turvy sort of play, of meetings, of parting and pairing and wedding, of transformation, of acting, reality and identity, of celebration and fun and madness and dreaming. My dot-to-dot description of 'A Midsummer Night's Dream' reminds me of what it is to come to believe in Jesus. Believing comes first. Faith follows belief as a gift that we can't manufacture for ourselves however much we try. Shakespeare often asks us to suspend our disbelief and open the door of our imagination to be entertained and engaged by the unfolding of the play coming to life on the stage.

Reading the bible for the first time, I felt that God was asking me to do much the same. *Suspend your disbelief. Let my word come to life in you.* So, I did and I was quite frankly amazed by what followed. I felt like I was becoming a part of what God was saying in his word. Jesus turns us upside down and inside out. We end up topsy-turvy and the world looks new made. We find ourself parting from some things and pairing with others yet remaining essentially ourself. Transformation is on the agenda woven through with a topsy-turvy madness, celebration and fun. God does have a script for each life. It's not imposed but an invitation to improvise in God's great play of life. In Jeremiah 29.11 God tells the exiles, 'I know the plans I have for you, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you a hope and a future.'

I hope it will be a good June this year with good news on the pandemic front not just here but around the whole world. The pandemic has woken us to some things we knew about but were dreaming through as if they weren't that real. Now we seem to be catapulted in to a time of necessary change. Pandemics, we have learned, underline unfairness and injustice, need and poverty of many different kinds. The natural world is overburdened by our demands on it and in its own way is crying out for our attention and action before it's too late.

The situation we find ourselves in needs transformational change. As Christians, we believe Jesus can help each one of us with that. Even though it seems impossible, he is always hanging around us, close to our heart knocking on its door. His love for us all - every single one - is beyond all our hopes, beyond our imagining. But he's there saying, 'Come and see.' Inviting us to hang out with him and see another side to life that might just have us standing on our hands. Try the walking on the water act of suspending your disbelief for long enough to catch Jesus' hand that's reaching out across the waters to save not only you but sheep number 99 to infinity; and, to save the earth on which we walk, live and breathe.



Julia Bourn was re-elected as Chair and Hugh Reynolds as Vice Chair for the year 2021-2022. Clive Cheeseman remains as Allotments Officer.

Planning

Decisions by Maldon District Council:

Beehive Cottages Fish Street – Proposed porch to kitchen door. Approved and Listed Building Consent granted.

Land to the west of Thistley Close – Tree Preservation Order granted for T1 Oak but not Pine tree. Three Thistles Thistley Close – T1 Oak remove the northern limb and 2.5 crown reduction to the top of the crown – refused. T1 Oak reduce the remainder of the crown by 2m. Remove the lowest limb on the northern side. T2 Leylandii reduce the canopy by 2m. Approved.

The Old Parsonage 12 Head Street. Proposed single storey rear extension. Approved.

New applications.

Rectory Cottage Maldon Road – Alteration to the rear roof slope to provide a gable feature with Juliet balcony. Supported.

35 Church Street – Proposed replacement link building between house and previously converted garage and changes to front of converted garage. Supported.

Enforcement issues at 1 Benham Close and the footpath from the Close to Maldon Road are being investigated by the District Council.

The Council discussed a resident's request to support an extension of the dropped kerb outside her Moat bungalow in order to provide better visibility when entering and leaving the property. It was decided that the resident should approach Highways herself, but the Parish Council is aware of parking issues at the bus stop at the Head Street/Maldon Road junction, and it will make a request for bus stop markings to alleviate this problem.

It was noted that some residents have asked that the green area in Hall Estate should be used for extra car parking, but this issue was raised some time ago and residents then did not want it.

Maldon District

Heritage Assets

This scheme means that if any planning application comes up on a heritage asset it would need to be considered in the planning process. To date there has been no response from Maldon District Council.

Audit. As a smaller authority the Parish Council is exempt from external audit and the Certificate of Exemption was approved. The internal audit has now been completed.

Playing field, play area and sea wall

The new slide will be erected in the play area in the week beginning the 7th June.

Recipe of the month

One pan nachos with black beans

- 1 red pepper, quartered, cored and finely chopped
- · 400g can black beans, drained
- 1 avocado, diced
- · soured cream, to serve




Method

- 1. Heat oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Arrange the tortilla chips over two-thirds of the tray, spoon most of the salsa on top and scatter over half of the cheese.
- Mix the remaining salsa with the red pepper and beans, and tip onto the empty third of the tray. Scatter over the rest of the cheese. Bake for 10-15 mins or until the cheese has melted. Scatter the avocado over the beans and add dollops of the soured cream to serve.





Information on Goldhanger Neighbourhood Watch

You may have read or heard of NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH schemes but are still not sure what they are or whether you would like to be involved in one. It is worth stressing that is <u>not</u> a vigilante organisation and that participation is passive. Members are encouraged to act as the *eyes and ears* of the community. However, it is the job of the police to patrol the streets and *NOT* Neighbourhood Watch members.

What is Neighbourhood Watch? The aims of a NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH GROUP are as follows:

- It's a free, confidential service and it is up to you how involved you want to be
- To reduce opportunities for crime by deterring would be thieves and vandals
- To establish a community spirit so that everyone can contribute to the property by mutual co-operation
- To inform the Police of any suspicious activity
- To make members more aware of local crime problems and be more security conscious about their homes and property
- To encourage neighbourliness

What's in it for me?

- 1. Many home contents insurance companies offer a discount to the members of registered Neighbourhood Watch groups
- 2. Property prices can rise in areas where and area has little or no crime
- 3. Crimes against property can be reduced
- 4. A better community spirit can be created
- 5. Neighbourhood Watch groups have frequent contact with their local policing teams
- 6. Information and crime alerts can be quickly circulated to Neighbourhood Watch groups thus raising awareness and the opportunity to prevent crime and from members from being victims of crime
- 7. You don't have to be actively involved to participate. Many members simply register their email addresses with us so that they can receive crime alerts and crime prevention advice via their computers in their own homes. Registered e-mail addresses are held securely and NEVER divulged to outside agencies etc.

In short, forming a Neighbourhood Watch group will lead to a greater shared awareness of local problems and a better understanding of practical steps that can be taken to tackle them. If you want to know more, contact
