Early history of the Cricketers Inn

The Cricketers Inn is older than one might imagine. The earliest record of the building is on the 1820s Tithe map for Goldhanger where it is identified as a carpenters shop and it was first named as the "Cricketers Inn" on the 1870 Ordinance Survey map.

It is said that during the 1800s two sisters opened their cottage to give refreshments to the cricketers returning from the cricket pitch in The Park along the track just opposite. This could have been the beginning of an unlicensed but legal alehouse - one of five in the village in those days.

The Tithe map and "Awards" of 1838 show that Caleb Chaplin owned both the bakery and the Alehouse next door.

The business was developed into an inn by Caleb, who was living next door (now called Elms bakery) when he applied for the first full spirit licence in August 1869. In that year he was also the captain of the cricket team.

THE CRICKETERS. GOLDBANGER.-Mr. Caleb Chaplin, of the Cricketers beerhouse, applied for a spirit licence for his house. He had kept that house for some time and during the time he had kept it no complaint had been made against him.

There was only one licenced house in Goldhauger—The Chequers kept by a person 76 years of age.

Mr. Caleb Chaplin had a memorial signed by the churchwardens and many other respectable inhabitants of the parish. The cricketers' meetings were always held at his house, and had been for some time.

Application granted.

In 1870 the bakery and inn were put up for sale.

In 1872 the new landlord applied for permission to stay open until 12.30pm for the annual Goldhanger Regatta held in the Creek and Estuary...

PERMISSION TO KEEP OPEN

Permission was given to Edward Green, of the Cricketers Inn, Goldhanger, to keep his house open till 12.30 on the night of the 5th Sept, that being the date of Goldhanger Regatta.

Caleb Chaplin took the job of baker at Chelmsford prison where he worked for 30 years. In an obituary in the Essex Newsman of 1908, it was revealed that he had participated in the Australian gold rush in the 1860s!

Until the 1950s the Cricketers benefited from having a wheelwrights next door and a blacksmiths opposite, so customers could take refreshments while their carriages, wagons and wheels were being repaired, and their horses were being re-shod.

Goldhanger, the Police, and new information.

Goldhanger Neighbourhood Watch has been running successfully for some years now and a new initiative has added a more direct connection to the Police.

Unfortunately, there is no longer a dedicated Police Officer or PCSO linked to Goldhanger. However, Essex Police have created a new mobile phone WhatsApp group to link Neighbourhood Watch Coordinators, like me, to the Essex Police Community Policing Team (CPT). This is a new tactic with very positive results and arrests.

This new scheme does not replace the 999 and 101 system. Ring 999 for emergencies like threat to life, someone in need of immediate care, or a crime occurring. If it is not an emergency then phone 101 or report online. The WhatsApp group is used to report current/live intelligence relating to suspicious vehicles, people, and suspected drug dealing.

If a member of our Goldhanger Group sees suspicious vehicles or people, they can send a WhatsApp message, as it is occurring, to my mobile number. This should include as many details as possible, e.g., location, description, number plate etc. This can then be forwarded to the Police.

The police will be monitoring WhatsApp: Sunday-Thursday 0800-2200 and Friday-Saturday 0800-0200.

The Goldhanger Neighbourhood Watch email system is confidential, and receives and sends information to keep you safe and up-to-date. Email goldhangernw@outlook.com to be added to the contact list or find out more. Because our village is a relatively safe place, the emails are usually infrequent.



Ministry Team Message

The feeling that September is the real start of a new year never leaves you. All those Autumn terms were such a significant part of growing up. New class. New teachers. New subjects. Even, on occasion, new school. And then new friends and new routines.

But as Christians we know that our New Year can – and does – start at any time.

The ministry of Jesus was full of people being given a new start in life. Sometimes they sought him out, especially if they were suffering and had heard of his reputation to heal.

Sometimes they were reticent about coming forward like the woman with a haemorrhage. Her belief was so strong that she knew all she had to do was touch the hem of his garment.

Others were desperate like the madman living rough in the tombs. He wanted rid of his demons and didn't care how public his appeal was or how dramatic his cure.

There were those who might have seen Jesus as a last resort as they lowered their friend through a roof in a bid to gain the attention of Jesus and his healing touch.

Some may well have doubted it was possible. Others knew without a shadow of doubt that their interaction with Jesus would change their life forever.

And we are no different. We know the power of Jesus. We know the enormity of God's love. But do we entirely trust it?

We can understand the puzzlement of Nicodemus. As a Pharisee he was a man of faith, educated in religious belief. Which is why he asked Jesus to explain his physically impossible statement that we need to be born again in order to experience the Kingdom of God.

With hindsight the answer no longer seems enigmatic because we understand Baptism as part of our Christian journey. But Nicodemus didn't have that luxury.

And it didn't help when Jesus – possibly with a hint of exasperation – added that, since people didn't always believe what he described about this world, it was hardly surprising that they weren't receptive to his description of the next.

He reminded Nicodemus that we hear the wind and see its effect without understanding from whence it comes or where it's going. And, he added, the Holy Spirit can enter our lives in the same way.

These words often seem as confusing now as they ever were. Yet we know that this does occur. Our lives can alter radically. Our paths swerve in a diametrically opposite direction.

This may not happen in a way that we expected or hoped. The last 18 months have certainly demonstrated that. There have been good outcomes and bad. But we know we have always had Jesus at our side.

But are we always alert to the intervention of the Spirit? Take time to look back and see when the Spirit took charge and try to remember your reaction. It might not have been immediately favourable.

It might not be a path you wanted to tread. Or one you believed you could even attempt. But, even though you ignored the prompting on some occasions, there were other times when you had the courage to press ahead.

And those are the born-again times, the new beginnings of our lives. They may not be dramatic, only visible within ourselves. Or they may be life-changing.

Jesus said that if we believe what he said and did in this life then we shall know what he told us about the next must be true. And that is surely the greatest comfort of all every time we tackle a new chapter in our lives.





Recipe of the month

Mulled spiced apple juice

Preparation time: 20 minutes

Cooking time: you choose

Serves 4



Ingredients

- 2 cloves
- 2 star anise
- 6 crushed cardamom pods
- A shard of cinnamon
- 10 juniper berries
- 4 black peppercorns
- 750ml apple juice
- Peel of 1 orange minus the pith, plus an extra spiral of peel to garnish
- · 400ml water
- 50g sugar

Method

- 1. Heat all the spices in a large pan until they begin to caramelise. When they do, empty the bottle of juice into the pan along with the orange peel.
- 2. Add the water and sugar, then bring to a gentle simmer. Keep the juice at a constant temperature of 60°C







Information on Goldhanger Neighbourhood Watch

You may have read or heard of NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH schemes but are still not sure what they are or whether you would like to be involved in one. It is worth stressing that is <u>not</u> a vigilante organisation and that participation is passive. Members are encouraged to act as the *eyes and ears* of the community. However, it is the job of the police to patrol the streets and *NOT* Neighbourhood Watch members.

What is Neighbourhood Watch? The aims of a NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH GROUP are as follows:

- It's a free, confidential service and it is up to you how involved you want to be
- To reduce opportunities for crime by deterring would be thieves and vandals
- To establish a community spirit so that everyone can contribute to the property by mutual co-operation
- To inform the Police of any suspicious activity
- To make members more aware of local crime problems and be more security conscious about their homes and property
- To encourage neighbourliness

What's in it for me?

- 1. Many home contents insurance companies offer a discount to the members of registered Neighbourhood Watch groups
- 2. Property prices can rise in areas where and area has little or no crime
- 3. Crimes against property can be reduced
- 4. A better community spirit can be created
- 5. Neighbourhood Watch groups have frequent contact with their local policing teams
- 6. Information and crime alerts can be quickly circulated to Neighbourhood Watch groups thus raising awareness and the opportunity to prevent crime and from members from being victims of crime
- 7. You don't have to be actively involved to participate. Many members simply register their email addresses with us so that they can receive crime alerts and crime prevention advice via their computers in their own homes. Registered e-mail addresses are held securely and NEVER divulged to outside agencies etc.

In short, forming a Neighbourhood Watch group will lead to a greater shared awareness of local problems and a better understanding of practical steps that can be taken to tackle them. If you want to know more, contact
