#### **Snowdrop in Goldhanger Creek**

The barge called "Snowdrop" was ignominiously abandoned in the Creek in the 1950s and has been steadily deteriorating there ever since.

This is the earliest picture of it we have... It was part a postcard sold in the Village store in The Square in the 1950s...





...this shows the Kelly Family onboard Snowdrop at Greenwich in 1928.

Here is Snowdrop being unloaded in Heybridge Basin, probably in the 1940s. "Snowdrop" and "Harwich" are carved in the stern...





...Snowdrop in Ipswich docks, probably also in the 1940s. "Snowdrop" is carved on the bow.

The scene in the Creek in the 1970s at a time when the bow, stern and rudder were still visible. There is also a wheel just visible near the bow...



#### Help for people from Ukraine and their sponsors

There is a lot happening locally with people welcoming family members through the Ukraine Family Scheme and also hosting visitors as part of the Ukraine Sponsorship Scheme. At the time of writing there are 29 confirmed matches of sponsors and guest families within the Maldon District.

Good networks are building up within our towns and villages of people preparing to welcome guests to their homes as they work out the practicalities, including visa applications, having their homes checked by Maldon District Council and finding schools. Through social media and attending meetings we are aware of many offers of wider support for families when they arrive including help with translation, language lessons, social groups, and sports and activities for the children.

The Migrant and Refugee Community Hub will have had its first meeting on 26<sup>th</sup> April at the Fullbridge Church in Heybridge. Information packs, local to the Maldon District, in both Ukranian and English are being produced to cover many of the issues likely to arise.

#### Is your child starting primary school?

Starting primary school can be scary for children and their families. You can take the scare factor out by coming to one of our Big School Meet Ups before the big day in September. You can get the chance to meet other children and their families who will be starting at your own child's school.

There have been several of these events already, but they'll be continuing until the end of August. See <u>what's happening at your local library</u> for details. And if you've missed the event for your own local school, don't worry – you can still come along to one of the others, chat, listen to a storytime and get some tips and tricks.

#### Recycling at your local library

Here's a tip about disposing of your empty ink cartridges in an eco-friendly way. Take them to your local library.

Every library has a new Ink Bin recycling box to put your empty home-use ink cartridges in. Once they're collected, they'll be sorted, refilled and put back on the market as remanufactured ink cartridges. This will stop them ending up in landfill.

What else does your local library recycle? Most will take old batteries; some take small electrical items too. Save yourself a trip to the recycling centre!

If you're running short of recycling sacks or caddies for roadside collections, your local library may be the place to help. Food sacks, garden sacks and recycling boxes can all be found at some of our libraries.

Coverage does vary, so check out the recycling facilities available at your local library.

#### **Book groups and Essex Library Service**







# **Ministry Team Message for August**

Just as life seemed to be getting back to normal we are facing a new crisis. And, there is no doubt, for some people it will be the straw that breaks the camel's back.

Christians, however, should be better prepared than most. We have a faith that stems from the unexpected.

The Jews might have expected God to send them a great leader but they didn't expect his arrival to be via an unmarried teenage girl. And they certainly wouldn't have expected his birth to be among animals in a stable.

A group of fishermen going about their daily business certainly didn't expect a wandering teacher to be so charismatic that when he called them away from their work they left it to join him.

John the Baptist knew his role was to baptise people who professed their belief in God but he didn't expect to baptise the man he believed came from God.

The ministry of Jesus is full of people who find themselves in situations they would never have expected.

When Zaccheus climbed a tree to get a better look at the passing teacher he never expected not only to be noticed but to be called down and given a job to do.

When the Samaritan woman met Jesus at the well she never expected not only to be speaking to a man but a Jew as well. Nor would she have imagined believing him when he said he had the water of life.

Yet in the end she was so sure that Jesus might be the Messiah that she convinced others to come and see him. And, we are told, he spent two days with them.

Then there was the woman caught in adultery who fully expected to be stoned for her sin. The last thing she would imagine would be Jesus's words:" Whichever one of you has committed no sin may throw the first stone." And then to find that all her accusers had slunk away.

Just as surprising was that Jesus did not condemn her either but, instead, told her to go on her way and not sin again.

Very early on in John's gospel we are told that there was no need for people to tell him about themselves because he already knew what was in their hearts.

That could be a comfort or a warning, dependent on which way you look at it. But for most of us it is a comfort to know that God is aware of our innermost thoughts and the influences on our daily lives.

This doesn't mean that we are puppets. We have free will and everyone in the previous examples could have made a different choice. But the effect of Jesus on them was clearly so great that they opted for the right one.

We cannot see Jesus as they did. He is not sitting with us. He is not looking into our face, telling us our past and foreseeing our future. But he is even closer.

We don't have to wait for the opportunity to meet him. He is always with us if we bother to lift the curtain that we so often bring down between us.

The unexpected will always be with us – for good or for ill – but we can face it with confidence. The appearance of Jesus in their lives was not always expected by the people we have read about. But it made all the difference to what happened next.

If we let him Jesus will make all the difference to our lives as well whatever the world throws at us.

# Recipe of the month

# Green bean parsley pesto gnocchi

Preparation time: 10 mins Cooking time: 3 minutes

# Ingredients

- 100g flat-leaf parsley , leaves only
- 1 garlic clove
- 40g cashew nuts, toasted
- 120ml extra virgin olive oil
- 40g grated parmesan or vegetarian alternative, plus extra to serve
- 1 lemon , zested
- 500g bag gnocchi
- 450g green beans, halved

# **Method**

- 1. Roughly chop the parsley leaves and whizz in a food processor with the garlic, nuts and oil to a smooth consistency. Transfer to a bowl and stir through the parmesan and lemon zest, season and set aside.
- 2. Bring a large pan of lightly salted water to the boil. Add the gnocchi and beans, and boil for 2-3 mins or until the gnocchi floats to the top of the pan. Drain and toss the gnocchi and beans with the pesto, then divide between four bowls. Finish with a little extra shaved parmesan, if you like.
