Queen Victoria's 1887 Jubilee – a link to Goldhanger

Since the publication of the booklet on past Goldhanger Jubilee celebrations, another connection to Queen Victoria's Golden Jubilee 1887 has been uncovered...

The vigorously growing oak tree in the churchyard near the south door of the Church was grown from an acorn by a Goldhanger resident and planted there in the 1960s. The acorn was collected from beneath the huge oak tree on Sandon village green near Chelmsford. That very large and once famous "Sandon Oak" was planted to celebrate Queen Victoria's Golden Jubilee 1887 and was a hybrid of Persian and Spanish oaks. The Sandon Oak was cut down in 2001 when it became diseased.

No photograph of the Sandon Oak from just before it was cut down has been found, however this picture shows what it was like in 1915 when it was just 28 years old....



Scams awareness and how we can keep safe

Scams and the Cost of Living

We've seen time and again that scammers seek to exploit vulnerability – from the coronavirus pandemic to recessions, times of difficulty often see a corresponding increase in related scams.

The increased financial pressure many will be facing has put more people into difficult situations, with many facing issues with debt and being unable to afford essential goods and services. Scammers are likely to exploit these issues, so being empowered to protect yourself and others will have heightened importance.

There are lots of different types of scams emerging. Examples to look out for include:

- Scammers pretending to be energy companies, luring people with "too good to be true" deals in order to steal their money
- Fake sales representatives selling counterfeit shopping vouchers
- Fraudsters sending out phishing emails pretending to offer an energy rebate or government support in order to steal people's personal information

Spotting a scam

It's important to always keep an eye out for scams. They can and do affect anyone. Here are some of the main warning signs to look out for:

- It seems too good to be true like an email saying you've won a competition you don't remember entering
- Someone you don't know contacts you unexpectedly
- You're being urged to act quickly so you don't have time to think about it or talk to family and friends
- You've been asked to pay for something urgently or in an unusual way for example by bank transfer or gift vouchers
- You've been asked to give away personal information

Simple steps to help protect yourself

- Don't be rushed into making any quick decision. It's okay to take your time
- Never give money or personal details, like passwords or bank details, to anyone you don't know, trust or have only met online. If someone pressures you for these, it's likely to be a scam
- Before you buy anything, check the company or website you're using. Read reviews from different websites, search for the company's details on Companies House and take a look at their terms and conditions

- Pay by debit or credit card. This gives you extra protection if things go wrong
- Be suspicious. Scammers can be very smart. They can appear like a trusted business or government official, have a professional website andsay all the right things. Take your time to work out if this is a real organization. Ask them for ID or contact the organization on a number you know and trust
- Don't click on or download anything you don't trust
- Make sure your antivirus software is up to date
- Keep you online accounts secure:
 - Use a strong password for email accounts that you don't use anywhere else
 - Some websites let you add a second step when you log into your account

 this is known as "two-factor authentication" and can make it harder for scammers to access your accounts
- If you're not sure about something, get advice from a trusted source

What to do if you have been scammed

1. Protect yourself from further risks

To stop things getting worse, contact your bank immediately to let them know what's happened. Change any relevant log-in details and check for viruses if you were scammed on a computer.

2. Check if you can get your money back

If you've paid for something by card, bank transfer, Direct Debit or PayPal, depending on the circumstances your bank may be able to help you get your money back.

3. Report the scam

Reporting helps protect others from being scammed.

- Call the Citizens Advice Consumer Service on 0808 223 1133 who can pass on details of the scam to Trading Standards and can give you advice
- Report to Action Fraud, the national reporting centre for fraud. They will give you
 a crime number

It's also important for us all to talk to family and friends about our experiences. Don't feel embarrassed. Together we can help to put a stop to scams.

St Peter's Church.

St Peter's Church is the oldest building standing in the village. Parts of the current building originate in the 12th century but it is likely that it replaces an earlier church building, possibly a timber one.

The church building stands high and proud in the centre of the village. It began its life as a Catholic church but witnessed the formation of the Church of England during the reign of Henry VIII followed by the period of the commonwealth and Puritan rule and settling back into the Church of England with the restoration of the monarchy. It has witnessed the reigns of many kings and queens and numerous jubilees.

The building is only part of the church, the church is really the people, the community. The church has always been at the centre of the community. Welcoming new life at baptism, encouraging stable family life through marriage and celebrating life and laying to rest the mortal remains of those whose life has run its course.

This the church still does but as times change, so has the involvement of the church in the community. The building has changed over the centuries, growing larger as the population of the parish grew, adding a bell tower to call people to worship. More recently, in the last century the community room was added with toilet and catering facilities, which makes the building so much more useable and able to serve the village community in ways other than just as a place of worship. Help for people from Ukraine and their sponsors

There is a lot happening locally with people welcoming family members through the Ukraine Family Scheme and also hosting visitors as part of the Ukraine Sponsorship Scheme. At the time of writing there are 29 confirmed matches of sponsors and guest families within the Maldon District.

Good networks are building up within our towns and villages of people preparing to welcome guests to their homes as they work out the practicalities, including visa applications, having their homes checked by Maldon District Council and finding schools. Through social media and attending meetings we are aware of many offers of wider support for families when they arrive including help with translation, language lessons, social groups, and sports and activities for the children.

Recipe of the month

Dalgona coffee (hot or cold)

Preparation time: 8 mins Cooking time: 0 minutes

Ingredients

- 3 tablespoons instant coffee
- 2 tablespoons of sugar
- 400-500ml of (whole) milk



Method

- 1. Whisk the coffee, sugar and 3 tbsp boiling water in a bowl for approximately 5 mins until the mixture is thick and fluffy with stiff peaks. This is easiest done using an electric whisk but can be done by hand.
- 2. For hot coffee, heat the milk and pour into two heatproof glasses. For cold coffee, pour the cold milk into two glasses.
- 3. Divide the coffee mixture in half and spoon evenly on top of the glasses.
- 4. Serve and stir thoroughly before drinking.


