An extract from the Jubilee booklet

This month's article is just a short extract from the booklet currently being offered for sale to raise funds towards the Goldhanger celebrations...

a local newspaper article recording the village celebrations for the Coronation of King George VI in 1937

GOLDHANGER

After a service in the morning, a procession, formed in the Square, and headed by Britannia, marched to a meadow lent by Mr. C. Page. Later the old people sat down to a meal in the schoolroom of beef, ham, etc. with a drink of beer for the health of the King, and cigars.


All then went to the meadow, where a programme of sports was successfully carried out. In the evening a bonfire was lit in the meadow, and there was dancing in the school. The festivities were organised by members of the Goldhanger and Little Totham Women's Institute, under the supervision of Mrs. G. Bunting.





Hello everyone,

We have had some volunteers come forward. But need more please.

We have also seen concerns posted online about speeding in the village. Over the years the Parish Council have applied to Highways for various schemes to reduce traffic speeds, in particular on the main road. However, the last scheme proposed by highways was to increase the speed at the D'Arcy end of the village which the Parish Council successfully appealed!

One way to build a case for any future scheme is to collate an evidence base, one way this can be achieved is from collected speed data.

If anyone is interested in being part of a community speed watch group please email the Parish Council Clerk.

I enclose the commitments of the group below, however you will note that one unresolved issue is the provision of the equipment.

- Number of volunteers required : Minimum of ten, ideally more, as we recommend that monitoring takes place in groups of three.
- Commitment of volunteers: There are no restrictions and we ask volunteers to do whatever they feel comfortable with. Each group works their own rota depending on availability of volunteers.
- Coordinator: Each group will need a dedicated person to coordinate them. This
 person will be responsible for the equipment, the volunteers and ensuring log
 sheets are completed and returned to the police for processing.
- Sites: Ideally there should be a minimum of two sites within the community. These should be in a 30mph or 40mph zone. They must be evaluated and approved as being suitable for CSW activities. Sites must be visible, consideration must be given to the safety of volunteers and motorists when choosing sites. There must be a safe place to stand off the road which does not obstruct any pedestrian right of way. If there are no pavements you may be able to use a village green or wide verge. Access to that site must be safe, do not expect volunteers to walk along the road or put themselves at risk at any time. Where can volunteers park if they have to drive to the site? You don't want them parked in the line of vision? Signage needs to be placed approximately 100 meters in each direction and in a suitable location.
- Equipment: We can loan a device subject to funding where groups fulfil the criteria (we do however, currently have a waitlist). Hi-Vis jackets, signs and training will be provided.

- Monitoring: We would expect a minimum of two hours monitoring a week
 whenever possible. This can take place at any time during day light hours and
 subject to weather conditions. Volunteer safety is paramount and we ask you not
 to carry out monitoring during poor visibility or slippery road conditions.
- Objectives of CSW: To educate road users to speed restrictions and the effect
 that their speeding is having on local communities. All offenders recorded by
 CSW are processed by Essex Police and the car details are checked on the
 police system. A letter is sent for the first offence and second offence and on the
 third instance they are added to a tasking list to be dealt with by Essex Police
 Casualty Reduction department. Information provided may also be used for
 police intelligence.





Sadly it is a known fact that the suicide rate amongst farmers goes up at that time of year. We felt we would like to offer a social event for the farmers in our Benefice to give them an opportunity to get



together to support one another and just to have a nice evening out. We wanted to be able to give something back to those without whom the rest of us would have no food.

The evening was a great success. We had around 50 guests, including a representative of the Farming Community Network who brought information for farmers on where to get help should they need it. We were greatly indebted to Tescos at Tiptree and Morrisons at Maldon who donated all of the food, except the cakes, which were made by ladies from around the Benefice!

We were keen to support local businesses as well as farmers and were very blessed that a local vineyard at Purleigh, New Hall Wines, provided award winning English wine at trade price and on sale or return. Beer was provided at trade price by Red Fox Brewery in Coggeshall. Tolleshunt D'Arcy, one of the parishes in our Benefice, is famous for the D'Arcy Spice Apple and the juice of the apple was provided at trade price by Jacobs Farm Shop in Heybridge.

We wanted to ensure as much as possible of the food and drink was British and even the supermarkets obliged with British cheese and butter! The Farming Community Network also supported us with additional funding. 



Wildlife Ponds - Funding Available!

Ponds are a cherished part of the parish landscape; familiar historic features found at the heart of most village centres and in the wider countryside. Sadly, due to changes in land use and agricultural practices, the UK has lost around 50% of ponds in the 20th Century. Those remaining are often threatened by pollution. This means the many species of plant and animal that rely on them are also under threat.

Excitingly, funding is now available in certain parts of Essex for the restoration and creation of clean water wildlife ponds capable of supporting great crested newts. The funding is part of Natural England's District Level Licencing scheme (DLL), a new strategy for compensating the loss of newt habitats, which seeks to provide new ponds and bigger, better, more joined-up habitat for this orange-bellied amphibian at a landscape scale.

In Essex there is a high demand for such wildlife ponds through the DLL scheme. Most of the 150 or so pond projects we have delivered to date have been fully funded under the scheme. You can view some of these projects at: www.fwageast.org.uk/ponds.

We are seeking local farmers, smallholders, large rural garden owners, land-based businesses and parish-owned land to create and restore more such ponds. If you have a location in mind in your parish, please email ponds@fwageast.org.uk to receive further information or arrange an informal chat. Let's do something brilliant for wildlife!

April 2022

Last year our April meeting and general assembly was not held due to the Duke of Edinburgh statutory mourning period which cancelled all such meetings. Parish Council meetings which had been conducted via video conferencing throughout Covid continued until the temporary law allowing remote meetings ended during May and face to face meetings commenced in June.

1. Council Composition

There has been no change to the Council composition, but we welcome a new Parish Clerk, Julie Webster to our 'team'.

Council meetings continue to be held on the second Wednesday of the month.

2. Planning

There have been various applications for the council to consider and report their view to Maldon District Council, who make the decisions.

In addition, proposals for the local development plan update were available for public consultation and Cllr Sargeant reviewed these in great detail to make our Parish response as meaningful as possible. (applications upto March meeting included) (format:- address, details, GPC comments, MDC decision)

- MDC served 2 TPOs to trees in the conservation area.
- 4 tree work applications, inc WTPO allowed to proceed.
- Hofflands, Vehicle access to adjacent land no objection, Approved
- Longwick farm Goldhanger reapplied to be consultees after being removed from consulting list. Various applications for expansion and demolition of farm house – not consulted, salt works approved, demolition of farmhouse refused and 2nd application approved.

3. Highways

While the current SID (speed indicating device) continues to limp along with much effort from Councillors who take the time to charge the batteries to keep SID working, a funding application has been made for a new device which we should hear about soon.

Parking within the village

Parking around the village is becoming more problematic year on year as the numbers of residents vehicles increases and the numbers of visitors also increases.

During last year residents local to the Nursery school in Church street asked for Parish Council assistance in tackling inconsiderate and dangerous parking by parents dropping of children at the nursery. The Parish Council entered into correspondence with the nursery and discussions with South Essex Parking Partnership (SEPP), however, there was insufficient support from residents to pursue additional parking restrictions (double yellow lines).

Parking patrols were booked for various locations in the village during busy periods and additional advice from the Essex Association for Local Councils (EALC) was to suggest residents write polite notes and leave on cars parked illegally, or inconsiderately. Bus cage markings have been applied for at the bus halt on Head street (near the junction with Maldon Road) to improve sight lines on the corner and to benefit residents.

Parking on the verge in front of the Moat development on Maldon road causes problems with sight lines pulling in and out of the development, Moat have been asked to review what can be done to improve the situation.

Parking at the bottom of Fish street is problematic when cars (typically visitors) block the access to the park gate (needed for grass cutting vehicles and emergency access to the seawall) and also park on double yellow lines, which can cause obstructions for larger traffic accessing the farm.

The Parish Council appeals to all residents and visitors to park legally and considerately.

Accidents

Again this year we have seen a number of accidents in our Parish on the road between Wash Bridge and our boundary on the D'arcy side.

We remain keen to keep track of accidents, as this data is not held by any other parties. Collecting this data will give us an evidence base which we can call upon, should we request any safety improvement works in the future.

So please email myself or other Councillors details of any accidents you may see, you do not need to have witnessed the initial incident.

Bus stops

The fencing around the bus stop in Head street was replaced and the damage sign was reported and replaced.

4. Playing Field, Woodland and Leisure

MDC installed an information board at the head of the creek, following the official opening of the 'coastal path' route from Maldon to Salcot. New gates have been fitted to both the playing field and also Marigold Wood where you will soon see a new park bench and picnic table

A contractor has completed work repairing the village pump rising main which suffered unusual corrosion and perforation near the water line and failure of the non return valve.

Park and playground

The Parish Council successfully applied for a grant towards the cost of repair works to the footpath along the side of the park to the seawall, which should be completed later this year when weather permits re-routing the path onto the field. Also, the slide has been replaced.

Coastal region

The outfall beacon which had fallen over, likely due to corrosion, was reported and eventually replaced by the Environment agency.

Marigold Wood.

Minor work was carried out on the woodland, to raise the canopy and thin out some of the trees as their size increases

A flowering cherry was donated and planted in memory of a much loved resident, Gwenda.

Allotments

Councillor Clive Cheesman has continued to administer the allotments and if you are interested in having a plot, please contact him.

5. Neighbourhood Watch/Goldhanger Matters

Malcolm Holmes with his team has continued to keep us all informed of the latest issues and circulated relevant Police crimes reports for the Maldon District, these have recently restarted after MDC had not issued any for some time.

Please see the Parish Magazine for further details and contact Malcolm (goldhangermatters@outlook.com) if you wish to receive emails.

Goldhanger Matters emails are also a way of keeping in touch with anything local, particularly at this time.

6. Precept

The Parish Precept is a tax on each property to fund the activities the Parish Council undertakes for the benefit of the community and forms a very minor part of your total Council Tax charges. The Council Members work hard to keep this as low as possible by undertaking many tasks themselves.

Circa £7,000 pa is required to meet our recurring expenditure for our legal obligations associated with Parish assets. To allow for other projects considered desirable for the Parish the 22/23 precept was set at £10,000,

In view of our low turnover it is considered prudent to maintain one year's expenditure in reserve for the unexpected.

7. Defibrillators

The village defibrillators continue to be monitored and maintained by volunteer councillors.

8. Maldon Road, Moat Development flooding

I include the same paragraphs as last 2 years report, with a minor update! (2020)Maldon Road drain flooding/overflowing, during sustained rain or flash downpours, has been an issue for a number of years.

some work was carried out on the drains in the verge in front of the moat development during 2021, but the Parish Council believe a blockage exists further downstream in the ditch system, so the situation will continue to be monitored and progressed where necessary.

(2021)In the last few weeks after a year of accelerating our issues upward and finally to our local MP we have had some investigative works started by highways on various problem flood spots throughout the village.

The investigative works were interrupted by more urgent issues and to date have not been completed!

Fish street flooding

The surface water drains in Fish street have also been problematic for a long time and are included in the unfinished investigative works described above. In addition, the Parish Council have proactively investigated some of the drain routing and causes of the issues during 2021 and are chasing the relevant bodies for a resolution.

9. Website

Thanks goes out to our host Christopher Smith for maintaining our website.

10. Speedwatch

In January 2019 there was interest from the community in setting up a community speedwatch group for Goldhanger. We obtained the required number of volunteers, However due to various issues with the organisers, followed by covid we were told training had been delayed, time and time again.

Having enquired again in late 2021, we have been told that the previous organiser has left and there is no access to historical emails and so Goldhanger would need to reapply to go back on the bottom of the waiting list.

As significant time has passed since the original volunteers came forward, I appreciate circumstances change and so I'm suggesting we start a fresh. If anyone is interested in being part of a community speed watch group please email the Parish Council Clerk.

11. Village Hall

The Parish Council have continued to support the village hall during this difficult time and have also recently contributed funds towards the kitchen refurbishment project.

12. Fibre broadband

Fibre broadband was rolled out late 2021 and provided the improved infrastructure needed, particularly by those who require the faster speeds to make working from home or hybrid working possible and generally for families that need greater speeds for streaming services etc

13. Jubilee

Preparations have been underway for the village celebrations of the Queens Platinum Jubilee, and after these difficult couple of years of dealing with Covid, we are looking forward to a real community event, and encourage everyone to get involved in the events. Goldhanger has a terrific community and these events bring everyone together.

I would like to thank Julie, our Clerk, for her service supporting and guiding us, and all Councillors for their dedicated work which enables us to continue to minimise the precept.

Recipe of the month

Mexican bean stew

Preparation time: less than 30 mins Cooking time: 30 mins to 1 hour

Serves 2

Ingredients

- 1 onion, thinly sliced
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 1 yellow pepper, deseeded and cut into 3cm/1in chunks
- ½ tsp hot <u>chilli powder</u>
- 1 tsp ground cumin
- 1 tsp ground coriander
- 400g tin chopped tomatoes
- 2 tbsp tomato purée
- 400g tin mixed beans, drained and rinsed
- 100g/3½oz Greek yoghurt, to serve
- 1 lime, cut into wedges, to serve
- salt and freshly ground black pepper

Method

- Add oil and place over a medium heat. Add the onion and garlic and cook gently for three minutes, stirring regularly. Add the pepper and cook for two minutes.
- 2. Stir in the spices and cook for a few seconds, then add the tomatoes, tomato purée and mixed beans. Pour over 300ml/ 10fl oz cold water and bring to a gentle simmer. Season with a little salt and lots of ground black pepper and cook for 30 minutes, stirring occasionally until thick.
- 3. Cook the rice
- 4. Serve with the rice and lime wedges.



Ministry Team Message for May

As I write this towards the end of March the weather has become warm and sunny and nature, taking the hint, is bursting forth with new growth. The earth and plants have been dormant through the winter, they have awakened with lengthening hours of daylight and warmer temperatures. (Snow is forecast for tomorrow!)

By the time you read this in May the fields surrounding us will have crops growing strongly as will allotments and gardens. May is a time when one can walk out into the countryside and really appreciate all that God does for us. As it says in Genesis 'God saw that it was good'. We should see that too!

May has one of the four agricultural festivals, Rogation tide. It is traditionally a time when the church asks God's blessing on the land and farms, praying for a good harvest to provide food that would last through the year.

Rogationtide starts on Rogation Sunday, which is the fifth Sunday after Easter just before Ascension Day. It takes place in the springtime, when there is an awakening of the earth with plants and animals moving through their annual reproductive cycle. Renewing their species for the future. It also falls into the Easter cycle, the season of resurrection. Renewal and resurrection go together.

Many churches will take their services outside on Rogation Sunday for a Parish walk stopping at various places to ask God's blessing on farms, the food produced, farmers and all who work in the countryside.

But is that all we should ask for? Perhaps we should include:

Asking for a reconnection between nature and humankind.

Thanking God that He has given us enquiring minds so that we can appreciate the balance of nature and are able to recognise when we may have taken steps in the wrong direction and the ability to reverse the harm done.

Reflecting on our part in managing the earth. In the Bible we are told that humankind will have "Dominion" over the fish in the sea, the birds of the air, the cattle, the wild animals, and the reptiles, the plants bearing seed, the trees bearing fruit, the green plants. Perhaps "dominion" is a bit outdated, stewards or managers are words which more accurately reflect humankind's part in managing the earth. We should be striving to pass the earth on to the next generation in a better condition than when we received it from our ancestors.

Stopping to pray outside a local pub, giving thanks for hospitality and friendships.

Praying outside a local school or nursery, praying for the staff and children.

Stopping to pray at the Village or Parish Hall, giving thanks for the volunteers who run it and the organisations who use it.

Remember, 'the Earth is the Lord's and all that is in it', (Psalm 24).

We are simply the temporary tenants and stewards.




