Crawshay Frost - Fish St. resident between 1925 & 1964





This month's cover photo shows the two Wellingtonia trees in the churchyard, also called Sequoias or California Redwoods. They were planted as small trees in the early 1960s by Crawshay Frost. Mr. Frost, or Frostie as he was known locally, was well known for his eccentricities, which at the time were attributed to his WW-1 head wounds. We now know he came from a long line of eccentric members the Crawshay family, who were the extremely wealthy "Ironmaster dynasty" of South Wales, and despite living in several small cottages in Fish St. he was also known to be wealthy. Here are some more biographical notes about him...

- He was born in Norfolk in 1896 and was the second son of a wealthy brewer.
- After attending Gresham school he gained a degree in history at Oxford.
- He joined the army as an officer directly from University during WW-1.
- Having been wounded in France he spent some time in a London Hospital.
- He suffered the effects of shell shock and gas for the rest of his life.
- 80 of his WW-1 photos are held in the Imperial War Museum and are online.
- After the war he became a teacher at the Brentwood private school.
- In 1925 he moved here and gave private tuition in the Coastguard Cottages.
- Sometimes known as "the professor", he spoke German, Greek & Esperanto.
- He had a strong interest in art and sponsored several local young artists.
- The autobiography of artist Eric Hebborn has a long chapter about Mr. Frost.
- He had a Belvedere built on one cottage and a nuclear bunker below another.
- From the Creek he recovered what he said was the keel of a Roman ship.
- He played the organ in the church, and the piano and a violin in the Chequers.
- He tamed wild birds and regularly carried a crow or jackdoor on his shoulder.
- He wrote many letters to newspapers and magazines in 1940s and 50s.
- After his death several articles were published about him.
- Over 50 letters and articles have been found and copies are in the archives.
- We also have 40 of his photographs of birds and some of his WW-1 photos.
- His eccentric lifestyle meant many residents well remember him and this has motivated us to record much about his life over the years.
- These same residents have been amazed at the breadth of his endeavours.
- Reminiscences and information about Mr Frost continues to surface.
- In 2021 a quantity of Crawshay's "ephemera" was sold at auction.



The Energy Bills Support Scheme and how you will get help.



All households with a domestic electricity connection in Great Britain are eligible for the £400 discount.

How will I get the discount?

- The £400 discount will be paid, by suppliers, to consumers over 6 months with payments starting from October 2022
- households will see a discount of £66 applied to their energy bills in October and November, rising to £67 each month from December through to March 2023
- the discount will be provided on a monthly basis regardless of whether consumers pay monthly, quarterly or have an associated payment card
- households will never be asked for their bank details, and those with a domestic electricity connection will not need to apply
- there is no need to contact your supplier as all domestic electricity customers will be automatically eligible. Electricity bill payers should enquire with their supplier if they have not received their first instalment by the end of October.
 - direct debit customers will get the discount automatically as a reduction to the monthly direct debit, or as a refund to the customer's bank account following direct debit collection during each month of delivery
 - standard credit customers and payment card customers will see the discount automatically applied as a credit to standard credit customers' accounts in the first week of each month of delivery, with the credit appearing as it would if the customer had made a payment
 - smart prepayment meter customers will see the discount credited directly to their smart prepayment meters in the first week of each month of delivery
 - traditional prepayment meter customers will be provided with redeemable vouchers or Special Action Messages (SAMs) from the first week of each month, issued via SMS text, email or post. These customers will need to take action to redeem these at their usual top-up point and should make sure that their provider has up to date contact details for them so as to receive the vouchers and instructions.

The new Energy Price Guarantee is in addition to the measures outlined above so all that information is still relevant. We know that there will be provision within the Energy Price Guarantee to help those who use other forms of energy such as oil, but details of this scheme have not been released at the time of writing.

Replacing the price cap with a new Energy Price Guarantee

The Energy Price Guarantee will ensure that a typical household in Great Britain pays an average £2,500 a year on their energy bill, for the next 2 years, from 1 October 2022.

The consumer saving will be based on usage, but a typical household will save at least £1,000 a year (based on current prices from October).

Proclamation Announcement Chair of Goldhanger Parish Council



We come together this afternoon following the passing of our late Sovereign, Queen Elizabeth the Second. Our sadness at this time is shared by people across the globe, as we remember with affection and gratitude the lifetime of service given by our longest-reigning Monarch.

For many of us here today HM Queen Elizabeth has been a constant in all our lives; I would like to pay tribute to her sense of Duty and the Calm Grace she has shown over the 7 decades of her reign.

The foundations on which our monarchy is built has ensured that through the centuries the Crown has passed in an unbroken line of succession. Today's ceremony marks the formal Proclamation to the people of the Parish of Goldhanger of the beginning of our new King's reign.

The Accession Council met at St. James's Palace to proclaim our new Sovereign. The flags which had flown at half-mast since The Queen's death were raised briefly to their full height to mark the start of His Majesty's reign. The Accession Council also made an Order requiring Lord-Lieutenant of Essex to cause the Proclamation to be read in the areas of their jurisdiction.

All present join in saying:

"God save The King"

The Chair of the Parish Council will then call for three cheers for His Majesty The King



hereas it has pleased almighty God to call to his mercy our late Sovereign lady Queen Elizabeth II of blessed and glorious memory, by whose decease the Crown of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland is solely and rightfully come to the Prince Charles Philip Arthur George.

We, therefore, the lords spiritual and temporal of this realm, and members of the House of Commons, together with other members of Her late Majesty's Privy Council, and representatives of the realms and territories, aldermen, and citizens of London and others, do now hereby, with one voice and consent of tongue and heart, publish and proclaim that the Prince Charles Philip Arthur George, is now, by the death of our late Sovereign of happy memory, become our only lawful and rightful liege lord, Charles III, by the grace of God, of the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland, and of his other realms and territories, King, head of the Commonwealth, defender of the faith, to whom we do acknowledge all faith and obedience with humble affection, beseeching God, by whom kings and queens do reign, to bless His Majesty with long and happy years to reign over us.

Given at St James' Palace, this tenth day of September in the year of our Lord, Two Thousand and Twenty-Two.







Ministry Team Message for October

I'm writing this in August for the October magazine, and this space of time is a bit of a desert in the Church's year as far as festivals are concerned. Trinity Sunday was the 12 June and the final Sunday of October is the fourth Sunday before Advent, and every Sunday in between is defined simply as how many Sundays it is after Trinity.

I know that at the beginning of October gospel of Luke comes near to the Lord's prayer which I can always write about, but this year it's only specific date is on a weekday, so I shall go back to my other mainstay which is the first commandment: to love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind and with all your strength, and wonder if you are all like me and don't love her or him with all of any of them.

Especially soul where I don't even know what it is. The one line I always do remember from Scripture is Mary, Jesus' mother, saying my soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my saviour. What else does a soul do?

In Mark chapter 8 Jesus tells the crowd, which includes his disciples, 'What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul?

Though looking it up now, the New International Version has soul whereas the Revised Standard Version – which I prefer – has life, and what is the difference between soul and spirit? And is Spielberg - as I like to call him - being ironic when he writes in Hebrews, 'For the word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart,' is he not implying that they are, in fact, the same thing?

I'd go along with the soul being our true consciousness; who we really are at root when everything else is stripped away; the one thing of our self we can trust; It is what God made.

In the book of Deuteronomy where Moses ends his ministry of the Jewish people by reminding them of God's love, soul is always mentioned together with heart: heart and soul, a form of words which has stayed with us until now.

My soul has surprisingly few mentions in the Bible; indeed there are more mentions of it in Psalms than there are in the rest of the Bible, old Testament and new Testament, and psalms are very much soul music, and stress the need to do certain things with soul.

Jesus too, rarely uses the word, saving it until near the very end when he realises the necessity of his death, in John chapter 12, "Now my soul is troubled, and what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour?' No, it was for this very reason I came to this hour."

God so loved the world, so shouldn't we be able to give some of that love back? Mary told her soul to magnify the Lord, and throughout the Psalms we often ask our souls to praise the Lord, perhaps it is time to ask our souls to love the Lord. Could not that be our mantra for a while? Love the Lord, my soul.

Recipe of the month

Nutty toffee apples

Studded with crunchy nuts, these grown-up toffee apples work well for a Halloween or Bonfire Night party recipe.

Preparation time: less than 30 mins Cooking time: 10 to 30 minutes

Serves 6



Ingredients

- 6 Cox apples
- 6 small wooden ice lolly sticks
- 225g granulated sugar
- 110ml water
- 30g butter
- 2 tablespoons golden syrup
- 4 tablespoons finely chopped mixed nuts

Method

- 1. Push the wooden sticks halfway into the apples at the stalk end.
- 2. Dissolve the sugar and water in a thick-bottomed pan over a gentle heat.
- 3. Add the butter and syrup to the mixture and bring to the boil. Continue to boil, without stirring, until the toffee reaches 140C/275F (use a sugar thermometer to measure this).
- 4. Remove the pan from the heat and gently stir in the nuts.
- 5. Carefully dip each apple into the toffee, making sure each apple is well coated, and set aside to harden on a baking try lined with non-stick parchment.


