#### The Parish Rooms

A single "Parish Room" was built in the early 1900s by the then Rector, the Revd. Frederick Gardner, and was located in the grounds of The Parsonage,


between No's 10 & 12 Head Street.


The Revd. Gardner bought No 12 in 1906 from the estate of his predecessor, the Revd. Charles Leigh when twenty of his Goldhanger properties were put up for sale. He re-named it "The Parsonage", installed his curates there, and had the Parish Room built next door. It originally provided a reading room for



residents and was initially known as the "Church Room" and later as the "Parish Hall". This 1930s postcards scene shows the small building to the right of the parsonage.

A reason for its demolition in 1980 was that it had started to lean over, giving it a not unattractive appearance of a much older building which, together with its beamed gable and leaded windows, looked like one of the leaning buildings at Lavenham. It developed the lean because it was built on the site of a previous "Smithy" which had an ancient saw-pit. Here are extracts from early maps that show the Smithy and then the Parish Room...





The name changed to "Parish Rooms" after a second small room was built at the rear to accommodate a full size snooker table, which was donated by a local benefactor. After the extension was completed, it was discovered that the law required a rear fire exit, so a door was added but with no route to the road available it always opened straight onto a brick wall.

The many uses of the Parish Rooms included: Mothers Union and Women's Institute meetings, the Goldhanger Players, village dances, the Fire Warden's centre during WW-2, and the Youth Club. In 1937 the much larger Village Hall opened and from then on the Parish Rooms were used mainly by the Youth Club.

The loss of the Parish Rooms also meant the loss of a section of the Goldhanger ancient red brick walls including an attractive curved entrance to the building that was, and still are a significant feature of the village.







# Maldon District Residents Need Photo ID To Vote At Elections On 4 May 2023

For the first time, residents in Maldon District will need to show **photographic ID** to vote at this year's local elections. Residents are being urged to make sure they are ready to vote in May by checking they have an accepted form of ID.

Accepted forms of ID include a UK, European Economic Area (EEA) or Commonwealth passport; a UK, EEA, or Commonwealth drivers' licence; and some concessionary travel passes, such as an older person's bus pass or an Oyster 60+ card. Voters will be able to use expired ID if they are still recognisable from the photo.

Anyone who does not have one of the accepted forms of ID will be able to apply for free ID online at <a href="https://www.voter-authority-certificate.service.gov.uk/">www.voter-authority-certificate.service.gov.uk/</a> or by completing a paper form.

The full list of accepted ID is available on the Electoral Commission's website, along with more information about the new requirement and details of how to apply for the free ID, at electoralcommission.org.uk/voterID.

#### Ailsa Irvine, Director of Electoral Administration and Guidance, said:

"Anyone voting at a polling station in England this May will need to show photo ID before they can be given their ballot paper. It's important that everyone understands what types of ID they can use, and how to apply for free ID if they need it. You can find information about the new requirement and what to expect at the polling station on the Electoral Commission's website."

#### Paul Dodson, Returning Officer at Maldon District Council, said:

"With elections taking place in Maldon District on 4 May 2023, it is important that those who want to vote make sure they have an accepted form of ID. It may seem early but checking now means you will be ready to vote in May.

"Residents who do not have one of the accepted forms of ID can apply for free ID either online or by completing a paper application form and sending this to Maldon District Council's electoral services team. If you need any help with applying for the free ID or want to request an application form, contact the electoral services team on <a href="mailto:elections@maldon.gov.uk">elections@maldon.gov.uk</a>

Anyone who wants to have their say in the elections this May must also be registered to vote. It only takes five minutes to register online at <a href="www.gov.uk/register-to-vote">www.gov.uk/register-to-vote</a>. Voters wishing to apply to their council for free ID should first make sure they are registered to vote.

The requirement to show photo ID at the polling station, is a new requirement, introduced by the UK Government's Elections Act which was passed last year and **comes into effect for the first time this May**.

#### Ministry Team's Message for Easter 2023

**EASTER!** For many people Easter is a time of chocolate eggs, and Easter bunnies, and Bank Holidays. I think the first time I noticed Easter eggs in our local supermarket this year was just after New Year! It seems they're never slow to act on a commercial opportunity.

For those of us who are followers of Jesus – Christians, as we're often called – it's the most important time of the year. Even more so than Christmas. Admittedly, had Jesus not been born, then Easter would not have happened. But it is the manner of his dying – and *rising again* – that makes this time of the year so very special.

To get to Easter Sunday, we have journeyed through 40 days of Lent, with 6 additional Sundays of reflection; a time usually of self-examination, maybe of self-denial, a time of spiritual cleansing. Then the week before Easter Sunday we have Holy Week, which begins with Palm Sunday. That's the day we recall Jesus entering Jerusalem on the back of a donkey, showing his humility and peace. That day the people welcomed him with Hosannahs and Hallelujahs – acclamations of joy, adoration and praise. Only 5 days later the same crowd would be baying for his blood...

Thursday of that week is known as Maundy Thursday. It's the night Jesus celebrated the Passover festival with his closest friends (disciples), and outed Judas, the man who had already betrayed him. It's also the night Jesus goes to the garden of Gethsemane with his friends, to pray. He knows what's coming: they don't. And then he's confronted by an armed, angry crowd. Judas betrays Jesus with a kiss, and Jesus is arrested. His friends desert him in fear.

Good Friday follows. Jesus is condemned to death, flogged and crucified. He is punished Roman-style as a common criminal – a hideous, tortured death. Why then do we call it *Good* Friday? Because what happened that day led to what happened on Easter Sunday, and from that comes all the good in the world.

'On the third day he rose again'... The miracle of the resurrection is what we celebrate at Easter. Death could not hold Jesus, the Son of God. He rose to new life, and appeared to his disciples in their fear and isolation. He gave to them, and to us, the Great Commission – 'to make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you.' (Matt 28:18-20) Above all he gave us all HOPE, by showing that this earthly life is not all that there is; that there's eternal life on offer for all who choose to follow Jesus.

That fills me with joy and gratitude, and gives me a purpose to my life. I choose to follow Jesus, so it's something I will never stop celebrating. I'd love to see you at one of our services within the Benefice this year. Do check out the timetable of services on offer, and come and celebrate with us. Meantime, I hope that as you bite into your Easter eggs this year, you will remember the new life that Jesus offers to all of us when we invite him into

our lives....







#### **Bus Shelters and Defibrillators**


It was noted that quotes had been difficult to obtain and an alternative solution was being investigated.



# Recipe of the month

# Garlic butter gnocchi with purple sprouting broccoli

This flavour-packed garlic gnocchi dish with cheesy sauce and crispy charred broccoli **Serves** 3 (or two if extra hungry)

Time 30 minutes

#### Ingredients

- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 200g purple sprouting broccoli, trimmed
- · 500g gnocchi
- ½ lemon, juiced

#### Sauce

- 1 tbsp olive oil
- · 1 onion, finely chopped
- · 4 cloves garlic, finely chopped or crushed
- 1 red chilli, finely chopped
- 75g butter
- 1 lemon, juiced
- 30g parmesan (or veggie alternative), finely grated, plus extra to serve
- 1/2 tsp Dijon mustard

#### **Method**

- 1. Heat the olive oil in a pan over a medium heat and fry the broccoli for 5-10 minutes or until it begins to crisp up.
- 2. medium/large frying pan over a medium heat and add the olive oil. Cook the onion until turning translucent, then add the garlic and chilli, and cook for 5 minutes. Add in
  - the butter, lemon juice, parmesan, mustard and plenty of seasoning, and cook on a low-medium heat until the cheese is melted and everything is combined (reserve a little sauce to drizzle over the broccoli). Simmer over a low heat while you cook the gnocchi following pack instructions. Drain the gnocchi, saving a little of the cooking water, and tip everything into the sauce, adding a little of the reserved cooking water to loosen if needed.
- 3. Serve in warm bowls topped with the broccoli, a squeeze of lemon juice and extra parmesan, if you like.

#### **Hate Crime in Essex**



Hate Crime is the generic term we use to discuss both Hate Crimes and Hate Incidents.

Hate crimes are any crimes perceived by the victim or any other person to be motivated by hostility or prejudice.

Hate incidents feel like crimes and often escalate to crimes or tension in a community.

Both can be toward personal characteristics:

- Race: including Ethnicity, Nationality, National Origin, Colour, Gypsy, Roma and Traveller Communities
- Religion or Belief: including Non-Belief
- · Gender Identity: including Trans, Non binary and Gender Fluid
- Sexual Orientation: including Gay, Lesbian and Bisexual
- Disability: including Learning, Mental Health, Physical and Sensory disabilities

Essex Police co-ordinate a network of Hate Crime Ambassadors and Hate Incident Reporting Centres (HIRCs) throughout Essex. This was to meet with one of the recommendations of the Inquiry by Sir William Macpherson into the horrific murder of Stephen Lawrence in 1993.

The role of HIRCs is to provide a drop-in service that can be accessed by victims and witnesses of hate crimes and incidents, with an option to report confidentially. HIRCs are also intended to support and encourage reporting of hate crime within the community by providing an environment in which victims of hate crimes and incidents will feel safe and supported. HIRCs effectively provide third party reporting facilities for victims and witnesses. HIRCs endeavour to improve information sharing between partner agencies and to increase community safety).

The network consists of 60 Hate Incident Reporting Centres, which are community based organisations and locations. The Hate Incident Reporting Centres have some staff who are Hate Crime Ambassadors, but most Hate Crime Ambassadors are not associated with a Hate Incident Reporting Centre. https://www.essex.police.uk/advice/advice-and-information/hco/hate-crime/how-to-report-hate-crime/

There are about one thousand Hate Crime Ambassadors in the network, who are front line people, volunteers and professionals who can identify victims of hate crime
