






The Essex Costal Climate

If you have ever spent long periods in the mid or west of the UK you will know how different our climate is: It is a lot dryer here. The MET office quotes Shoeburyness as the driest place in the UK, but the reason for choosing there is because that's where the weather station is located. Many other Essex coastal places are just as dry, including Goldhanger.

The most significant meteorological phenomenon affecting us in the East is called "rain shadow effect"...





...and perhaps surprisingly on average our part of the east coast also has more sunshine. The sun is out more here often in the mornings than in the afternoons, also a result of the "rain shadow effect".

Local farmers have a further benefit from a warmer sea in winter months which is a meteorological phenomenon known as "Marine Influence". Large estuaries such as the Blackwater bring that effect further inland so crops located close to the estuary,

or on it also benefit. Here are some examples:

Tiptree Strawberries from Bounds Farm, Maldon Salt from Longwick Farm sweetcorn, pumpkins and squashes from North Maldon Growers Ltd. Pacific oyster cultivation near Lauristons farm by Maldon Oysters Co.

The village was also once surrounded by apple and plum orchards but most were destroyed by an early Common Market EU decree.

In recent years there have been two surprising beneficial effects of climate change in our region in comparison with other parts of the UK...

- 1 Very few hosepipe bans during summer droughts this goes back to the 1800s & 1900s when local water companies realised that the growing holiday populations in Southend, Clacton and Felixstowe needed more water supplies. The solution was to build very large reservoirs such as at Hanningfield and Abberton that are filled by deep aquifer wells.
- **2** *Very few sewage leaks recorded into our rivers and beaches* for rivers this shows up in https://theriverstrust.org/sewage-map and for beaches in https://www.sas.org.uk/water-quality/sewage-pollution-alerts. The hillier regions increasingly suffer from periods of heavy rain and their sewage systems cannot cope with the flash flooding from fast flowing rivers.

Parking Issues – Ongoing Moat Housing problem

Concrete posts had been damaged and were reported

Flooding and Drainage – After heavy rain recently foul drains were overflowing and utilities company visited the site. It was later discovered that wet wipes had caused this and residents need to be reminded too not flush wet wipes of any type in the toilet system.

Sid and Solar Panels- still awaiting outcome of grant application to no avail

All working well at the Moment

Letter received regarding Wash Bridge

The footbridge in Blind Lane had been demolished and had been reported. Footpath from the garages to Head Street had been reported as having overhanging foliage.

A Maple tree in Maldon Road (near the bus stop) had died which was on Moat land. Moat to be advised that this needs felling to avoid it becoming a danger to general public and road users.

Flytipping in garage area Hall Estate had been reported

Marigold Wood – a resident backing onto the wood had queried the hedge cutting date as it had started to encroach into his garden. The hedge is cut in the autumn by MDC, the resident was quite at liberty to cut back any overhanging branches. Cllrs Sargeant and Bishop had done some maintenance work in the wood recently and it was all looking good.

Bus Shelters and Defibrillators - Funding would be required if another defibrillator was purchased. This could be discussed at a future meeting if anyone was able to submit a grant application

A letter of thanks had been sent to a young resident in the village who had done an excellent job of litter picking

A resident had approached the Council regarding the siting of a plaque on the sea wall bench in memory of a deceased resident. This was agreed unanimously, with a request to see the proposed wording

Sometime during 2003, following a conversation with his good friend Ken Wood, a plan was hatched for a show of classic cars to be held in the Chequers car park. From this the Goldhanger Classic Car Club was born.

Phil will be remembered for his generosity, knowledge, advice and above all his kindness to everyone he knew.





August Ministry Team Message

And so we come to August when we have some free time, and, if we are lucky, the days are hot and sunny. In the Christian calendar, there's not that much going on either, and in these hazy days it is quite easy to miss some of the events that the church does celebrate at this time of year. One of these is on 6 August, and has one of the most star studied cast lists of all that we commemorate in the Bible: the Transfiguration of our Lord.

Star of the show, as usual, is Jesus, and he has with him not just his disciples, of whom we may have recognise one or two, and they may have had small speaking parts, but this time we go straight to the A list where just three of them get a back stage pass, so to speak: Peter, James and John. Peter is....Peter, James the son of Zebedee and John his brother, possibly the author of the eponymous gospel, and possibly the beloved disciple who was appointed the foster son of Mary by Jesus himself at his crucifixion.

And as if that wasn't enough, there is also Elijah, the great old Testament prophet, who witnessed God as a still, small voice - or in sheer silence, as another translation has it - in 1 Kings 19, and Moses who had been similarly transfixed when collecting the recast 10 commandment tablets from God himself in Exodus 34.

Transfiguration sounds like an old Testament thing; something fantastic that never actually happened in real life, but if you believe that God created everything, and loves everything he created, then it stands to reason.

So Jesus was transfigured, meaning that in Matthew, 'his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white', while in Luke, 'the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white', and in Mark, 'His clothes became dazzling white, whiter than anyone in the world could bleach them.'

So that's what it looked like, but what did he say? Well, he said exactly the same as what he had said when the Holy Spirit in the form of a dove anointed him while John the Baptist was baptising those less holy in the river Jordan, namely, 'this is my beloved son in whom I am well pleased', but this time he adds, *listen to him*. For my - God's – sake, listen to him.

You can read this as a universal message, or you can read it as an individual message; is this for the world, or is it just for me? Peter must have felt it was for him, he had, after all, been babbling away about building something for the three illustrious visitors - Jesus, Moses and Elijah. In Mark they're shelters, in Matthew and Luke they're dwellings. That was all he could think of. Luke says, 'not knowing what he said' and Mark, in brackets, '(He did not know what to say, they [he and the two other disciples] were so frightened.)'

Though maybe this was prophetic and what he was thinking of was the church, Peter being the rock on which it is built. Except that Peter maybe did listen, but he didn't take it in, as evidenced famously when he shrugs Jesus off rather than share the gospel, thus denying Christ and hearing the cock crow a third time. He also doesn't mention the importance of listening in his second letter where he writes,

'For he received from God the Father honour and glory, when, there came such a voice to him from the excellent glory, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I a m well pleased." And this voice which came from heaven we heard, when we were with him in the holy mount.'

Which doesn't segue into his failure to take it on board, nor the horrors he felt at denial (or maybe the Jordan), though Graham N Stanton, Lady Margaret's Prof of Divinity at the University of Cambridge, does say that, 'the writer [Peter] knew oral Jesus traditions rather than the written Gospels'.







Recipe of the month

Penne al'arriabata

A spicy pasta al'arrabiata - or spicy tomato sauce to you and me - an easy storecupboard pasta dish for a weeknight supper

Serves 4

Time Prep under 30 minutes, cook 10-30 minutes

Ingredients


- 6 tbsp extra virgin olive oil
- 2 red chillies, finely sliced
- 2 garlic cloves, chopped
- handful basil leaves
- 600g/1lb 5oz tinned chopped tomatoes
- salt, to taste
- 400g/14oz penne pasta
- parmesan shavings (or similar vegetarian hard cheese), to serve

Method

- 1. Heat the olive oil in a frying pan. Add the chilli and garlic to the pan. After about a minute, add the basil leaves and gently wilt them in the flavoured oil.
- 2. Remove the garlic, basil and chilli from the pan and set aside. Add the chopped tomatoes to the frying pan.
- 3. Put the garlic, basil and chilli back in the pan with the tomatoes. Simmer for at least 10 minutes, until the sauce has thickened a little. Add salt to taste.
- 4. Meanwhile, cook the pasta according to the packet instructions in large saucepan of boiling, salted water until al dente.
- 5. Drain the pasta and the tomato sauce to it. Serve with shavings of parmesan.
