The Chequers Inn

from . . . "Pub Walks in Essex", by Norman Skinner

The page in this book about The Chequers, which was published in 1980, has the photograph shown on this month's front cover. There are two things are of interest in the article: The pub sign is very unusual and could well be unique. It is shown here restored and enlarged...

At the time, the Chequers was owned by Trumans brewery and one of their brand names was "Eagle Ales". Many of their other pub signs showed eagles in one form or another, but none have been found that are similar to this one which also shows a chequered board inside a heraldic shield all supported by columns and an lonic capital.



The article is also interesting as it gives us some very useful history. Here are some extracts from the article (leaving out the menus from the time)...

Location: in Church grounds and in the village centre three twin rooms

The Chequers Inn started life in 1410 as a court house wherein the unfortunates of the time were tried, executed in The Square and buried in the adjacent churchyard. Being in the proximity of Blackwater the odds are that a fair share of smugglers travelled this short but eventful journey.

Prince Nicolas of Russia, an altogether more regarded person, had a somewhat happier time during his visit here.

Inside some concessions have been made to the present day — the tap room is now carpeted. The ceilings throughout are of oak beam and an interesting collection of fishing rods and animal traps is to he found around the public bar, which also has a large log fire crackling when needed.

A talkative parrot will amuse the children with which at times there seems an affinity, and other pets are welcome. Saturday sees 'Live' Piano night and monthly the venerable timbers rattle to the irreverent strains of Jazz nights. To the rear is a beer garden. Car park.



Be Prepared In Case of Flooding

As we head into the Autumn and Winter the risk of flooding increases, so Maldon District Council is urging residents to 'be prepared' in case they are faced with flooding in the future.

The Environment Agency will place any Flood Watch Alerts on their web site https://check-for-flooding.service.gov.uk/plan-ahead-for-flooding where you will also find some useful advice and information should this be necessary.

Cllr Mrs Penny Channer, Leader of Maldon District Council, said; "Flooding will always be a risk for the Maldon District and residents should always be prepared to take any reasonable precautions to protect themselves and their property.

"However, residents can be reassured that we have a well-rehearsed plan to deal with flooding, working in partnership with other agencies, and we endeavour to support residents of the District in the best possible way."

"There is no statutory requirement for the Council to provide sandbags and householders and landlords need to protect their own property. Sandbags can be purchased in advance from DIY or hardware stores locally and advice is also avaiable from www.nationalfloodforum.org.uk.


If you own land that is adjacent to a watercourse, or land which has a watercourse running through or underneath it, you are by law considered to be a 'riparian owner'. As well as certain rights to the watercourse, a 'riparian owner' is responsible for keeping the watercourse maintained and free flowing to minimise the risk of the watercourse flooding.

Surface water flooding incidents should be reported to the Essex County Council Flood team <u>Essex Flood and Water Management</u> or call 03457 430430 (Mon-Fri). You can also register with Floodline to <u>Sign up for flood warnings - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</u> which is a free service and provides warnings by phone, text, or email.

Preparing an emergency grab bag will ensure that you take your most essential belongings with you, should you be asked to leave your home. It is one simple thing you can do to make sure you and your family are ready. It will need to be easily found by all family members and should be checked every six months.

Some of the things you could include are: -

- First aid kit
- Copies of documentation, e.g., insurances
- Prescription medication
- Toiletries and sanitary supplies
- Mobile phone and charger
- Spare clothes
- Children's toys
- A battery torch with spare batteries or a wind-up torch
- Bottled water and emergency food
- Extra set of house and car keys
- · Cash and credit cards
- A book







- tomato ketchup or brown sauce, to serve




Method
