

Jacob Mickelfield's Goldhanger Clocks

Jacob Mickelfield lived in The Square between the 1760s and 1780s, and worked as a clock maker there. He also spelt his name as "Micklefield" on some of his clocks. The deeds for the property show his profession as "whitesmith" and that he purchased the house for £134, which today is called "The Clockmakers" He moved to Southmister in about 1790 and continued to make clocks from there.

Over his working life he would have constructed, re-built and repaired many clocks, but so far just eleven have been identified. The first we learnt about his clocks was from a small brass Lantern clock that belonged to a Goldhanger family in the 1980s. It was inscribed: *Jacob Mickelfield, Goldhanger* (shown top middle on the front cover). All the others, found on the web, have been long-case clocks. His name is on the dial and most also have "Goldhanger". The ones found have been offered for sale at auctions and antique shops around the UK since 1998, with the most recent being auctioned in December 2022 at Canterbury (top-right on the front cover).

The quality of the cases, dials and attractiveness has varied greatly, and the prices have reflected that, plus if they have the original mechanisms, and are in working order. The most expensive one seen was in 2014 at Gutlin Clocks, in the Kings Road, London, with a price of £14,500 (lower left on the cover, and on the left below). Today (Feb. 2023) it is still on offer, but now with a price tag of £125,000 !

In 2013 one was for offered on Ebay with a starting price of £1,500 (lower middle on front cover). The Ebay wording was "Jacob Michelfield - Coldhanger", not difficult to confuse with the old English script on the dial.

In 2015 one sold at a Rayleigh Auctions in Essex for £600 (not shown).

In 2017 another was offered at auction at Dorchester in Dorset with an estimate of £100-200 (lower right on the front cover).

The clock auctioned at Canterbury last December sold for £80. Why now so cheap? It's probably because clocks from the 1700s are now ornaments rather than time pieces, as they have loud ticks, need regular winding and might not keep good time.



Reverend Donald Allan Former Rector of Goldhanger and Little Totham The Rev Donald Allen has died

He spent some 14 years in the parish from 1987 to 2001and was a reforming presence. He set up the Ministry as Partnership team in both parishes, where a group of lay people work alongside the parish priest.

It was an idea that followed ideas put forward by the Diocesan Synod – the | Church's equivalent of a County Council – and accepted by the Bishop of Chelmsford.

Donald's interest in people led to an increase in church numbers. His ideas and initiatives shaped the way both All Saints, Little Totham and St Peter's, Goldhanger developed over almost 20 years.

All Saints Church Organist, Toni Philpott, remembers Donald as a good friend and adviser.

"He guided Laurie (Toni's husband) through Confirmation, conversations usually conducted seated in the Rectory garden. His was a cheerful household full of boys and pets, usually large dogs Old English Sheepdogs or Labrador crosses, "I remember Amy and Benedict well."

"Donald was a fearless visitor who could get through a packet of dark chocolate biscuits in one sitting as we chose the next month's hymns."

"I once saw him sitting on the settee in Val (my neighbour)'s house underneath a Rottweiler and a Staffordshire Bull Terrier with a Jack Russell draped round his neck. As I said, fearless."

George Bunting, Churchwarden at Goldhanger, said: "Donald was very sincere in his faith, always putting his vocation and service to others before anything else."

"He made a point of visiting and getting to know members of both villages. I am sure he knew where everyone lived, sadly something that does not happen today.

"He could see changes in the church coming and encouraged members of the congregation to lead the intercessions, lead services and to preach."

"Both parishes formed Ministry as Partnership teams which stood us in good stead after he retired and our parishes joined Great Totham in a united benefice.

"Bishops and safeguarding regulations have, sadly, rather limited what MAP teams can do now.

"He always turned up to help in all our church's fundraising and social events. I'm not sure he ever took a day off, I cannot remember any time when he said, I'm sorry, it's my day off, I can't do that. (This was especially true with funerals, an undertaker said to me, I don't know how we will cope when Donald retires, he is always available, we depend on him).

"Personally, in times of crisis, I found in him a great source of strength."

Lorna Key spoke of his sincerity and his love for Little Totham where his ashes will be interred.

Pat Sargeant says: "He was meticulous in his safety precautions before Christingle candles were lit!

"He disliked the hymn Lord of the Dance

"For several years, he let the village use his Rectory in Church Street for Fireworks Night.

I always felt he was very sincere with his faith."

Elaine and Anthony Clark say: "Our family remembers Donald with great affection. He married both girls and christened their children.

"It was in the days when vicars had time to visit their parishioners so we were able to get to know him and Margery.

"After Fred's christening, he blessed Washfields with health, happiness and love. Victoria said it was such a nice thing to do especially as they had just moved into their new home.

Kim Evans says: He was a lovely Man and he would come and have chats with both Trevor and me. He always refused a cup of tea at first but we soon learnt (after about an hour or two) he would change his mind.

Maldon District Residents Need Photo ID To Vote At Elections On 4 May 2023

For the first time, residents in Maldon District will need to show photographic ID to vote at this year's local elections. Residents are being urged to make sure they are ready to vote in May by checking they have an accepted form of ID.

Accepted forms of ID include a UK, European Economic Area (EEA) or Commonwealth passport; a UK, EEA, or Commonwealth drivers' licence; and some concessionary travel passes, such as an older person's bus pass or an Oyster 60+ card. Voters will be able to use expired ID if they are still recognisable from the photo.

Anyone who does not have one of the accepted forms of ID will be able to apply for free ID online at www.voter-authority-certificate.service.gov.uk/ or by completing a paper form.

The full list of accepted ID is available on the Electoral Commission's website, along with more information about the new requirement and details of how to apply for the free ID, at electoralcommission.org.uk/voterID.

Ailsa Irvine, Director of Electoral Administration and Guidance, said:

"Anyone voting at a polling station in England this May will need to show photo ID before they can be given their ballot paper. It's important that everyone understands what types of ID they can use, and how to apply for free ID if they need it. You can find information about the new requirement and what to expect at the polling station on the Electoral Commission's website."

Paul Dodson, Returning Officer at Maldon District Council, said:

"With elections taking place in Maldon District on 4 May 2023, it is important that those who want to vote make sure they have an accepted form of ID. It may seem early but checking now means you will be ready to vote in May.

"Residents who do not have one of the accepted forms of ID can apply for free ID either online or by completing a paper application form and sending this to Maldon District Council's electoral services team. If you need any help with applying for the free ID or want to request an application form, contact the electoral services team on elections@maldon.gov.uk

Anyone who wants to have their say in the elections this May must also be registered to vote. It only takes five minutes to register online at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote. Voters wishing to apply to their council for free ID should first make sure they are registered to vote.

The requirement to show photo ID at the polling station, is a new requirement, introduced by the UK Government's Elections Act which was passed last year and comes into effect for the first time this May.

Ministry Team's Message for Lent 2023

Lent is a Christian observance that many people are aware of whether they are believers or not. Many people associate Lent as a time when Christians stop eating chocolate!

Lent has nothing to do with dietary requirements. Lent is 40 days of self-examination and reflection of re-examining our own values all of which are a whole lot harder than giving up chocolate.

For 40 days before beginning his work as a preacher, teacher, and healer Jesus went off by himself into a wild uninhabited area together with his thoughts to prepare for his new life.

Jesus was faced with many temptations, the power to turn stones into bread, a miraculous escape if he jumped off a tall building, and control of the whole earth.

Of course, if he had given in, he would have not had to die an excruciating death to show us the real miracle that death is not the end.

Fortunately, none of us has to face such temptations, but our own temptations may also be of major importance in our lives. We are not told whether Jesus wrestled with his answers but the human side of him, I'm sure would have paused for a moment.

Of course, we are all facing temptations every day of our lives, but Lent is an opportunity to stand back and refocus.

One of the temptations we all face is not giving ourselves time to think, probably this is one of the greatest challenges that we all face in the 21st century. We all tend to dash through life not giving ourselves any space to pause and catch our breath.

Many of our conversations are reduced to the length of the tweet. And if illness curtails the frenzy it takes a very long time to accept just sitting and thinking. For Christians that quiet time is spent talking to God. But even if you don't count yourself a Christian, you need to find that quiet space it will help you just as much as a session at the gym.

Psalm 105 is worth reading in full as it goes through the story of God's wonderful deeds and calls on us to be glad that we belong to him. The whole psalm is a reminder of God's faithfulness and his dealings with his people. The middle verses speak of God's provision through Joseph in a time of famine in Egypt, the history of their life in Egypt, God's deliverance, and the way that he provided for their needs in the desert.

They left Egypt with shouts of joy but then had to cope with forty years of traveling through the wilderness before reaching the promised land. There were many times when they must have asked 'Are we nearly there yet?' Throughout the uncertainties of the journey, there were reminders of God's care and provision, with the visible signs of the pillars of cloud and fire, food sent from heaven, and water gushing and flowing like a river through the desert.

The way ahead for us may be uncertain despite these fragile shoots of hope and it may certainly have felt like a desert experience for many of us. But as we move into the new future, we need to remember what we have experienced and learned of God and ourselves. And perhaps we are the people who have been given the responsibility to sing praises to the Lord for his constant, loving presence.

May your faith be nourished, and your hope increased as we journey with and through this season of Lent together.







Tomato and Pasta Soup

Make our simple, budget-friendly tomato, pasta and chickpea soup in just 30 minutes. This easy, vegetarian family meal is healthy and even low fat

Serves 4

Prep 5 minutes, cook 25 minutes

Ingredients

- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 1 onion, chopped
- 2 celery sticks, chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 1 tbsp tomato purée
- 400g can chopped tomatoes
- 400g can chickpeas
- 150g orzo or other small pasta shapes
- 700ml vegetable stock
- 2 tbsp basil pesto
- · crusty bread, to serve

Method

- Heat 1 tbsp olive oil in a large saucepan. Add the onion and celery and fry for 10-15 mins, or until starting to soften, then add the garlic and cook for 1 min more. Stir in all the other ingredients, except for the pesto and remaining oil, and bring to the boil.

- 3. Stir the remaining oil with the pesto, then drizzle over the soup. Serve with chunks of crusty bread.




