



Ancient Goldhanger maps and documents

Although the village has existed for well over a 1000 years we know very little about what it was like in earliest times. Cities, towns and stately homes tend to have ancient paintings, lithographic drawings, maps and literature that reveal something of their early life, but our relatively small and once isolated community did not seem to produce any of these. We do however have access to local area maps and a few documents held in the Essex Records Office and others on the internet.

This month's cover shows sections of four of the earliest maps seen. They show that for centuries the short route to Maldon went over the salt marshes and flooding areas(shaded). The 1805 OS map shows the longer inland alternative route via Chappel Farm and Scraley Rd. to Heybridge.

Here are some of the early documents that tell us something about the village...

- The Domesday Book of 1085 named Goldhanger as "Goldhangram", which suggests a Latin spelling so may well have had some Roman origins. The land ownership was split between 3 Norman Counts, and had 2 Freemen, 33 housholds, 22 smallholders, 10 "slaves", many animals and 1½ saltworks.
- Beeleigh Abbey & Monastery documents refer to Goldhanger from 1180 onwards, it was then part of their estate and rents and income from the lands were listed.
- "Feet-of-Fines" preceded Deeds giving many names of Goldhanger landowners from the 1200s onwards.
- Church records from the 1200s name all the previous Goldhanger Rectors.

 Maura Benhams book gives many details of past Church activities in the village.
- Customs documents from the 1300s refer to many local smuggling activities.
- Court records of local criminal & civil cases appear from the 1500s onwards.
- Hearth Tax Records for 1670 show 49 housholds.
- Philip Morant's History of Essex identifies the Manor house owners in 1758 which were Vaulty, Follyfaunts, Highams and Joyces Manors.
- Property sales adverts and posters appeared from the mid 1700s for the manor houses, cottages, farms, pubs, alehouses and the Church benefice.
- The Tithe "Awards" accompanying the 1820 Tithe Map lists the owners of all properties and fields within the Parish boundary at that time with 150 names, 48 houses, 120 male householders, 23 landowners & 6 shops.
- Parlimentary papers from the early 1800s with statistics for the village recorded 108 houses & 496 people:- 74 in farming, 37 in retail, 23 labourers & 20 servants.
- Electoral Registers for the village appear from the mid 1800s onwards, only 19 males could vote:
 12 Landowners, 6 copyholders and the Rector.
- Trade directories for the village began to appear from the late1800s, listing the shopkeepers & farmers, plus details of the post office, school and Church.
- The first national census that included everyone in Goldhanger was in 1841 showing a population of 520 adults & children, in 104 houses.



Ministry Team Message

"The Church is the only organisation that exists primarily for the benefit of those who are not its members." William Temple, (one time Archbishop of Canterbury.) He was educated in the Victorian era but his words have such a modern ring.

So you ask, "What can the church do for me?" Well! I'm going to focus on three quite traditional responses; baptisms, weddings and funerals which represent the happiest and the saddest times of our lives.

Baptism is a wonderfully happy occasion when the church welcomes new members with open arms. The church is always ringing with happy voices and full of joyful faces. But just occasionally someone says, "We don't come to church very often, we're not baptised so I don't suppose you'd be interested in baptising my baby and the answer is, "OH YES WE WOULD!

We do ask that you help your child to understand what a great thing it can be to be a member of a church but we can help you with that too.

Weddings are also incredibly happy occasions. There's nothing like a church full of flowers, music and amazingly happy relations to set a young couple on a new path in life. But just occasionally someone says, "We don't come to church very often, we're not baptised so I don't suppose you'd be interested in marrying us. The answer is, "OH YES WE WOULD! I always ask couples, "Why do you want to get married in church?" There are no wrong answers but I'd rather it wasn't that the church doors will make a nice background for the wedding photographs!

One bride said, "I want someone to help me really mean it when I say, "I DO". I don't want it to be like I'm signing a hire purchase agreement that you can tear up later". Well we can help you talk through what marriage might mean. We'll help you make your marriage seriously joyful!

Life also presents us with times of great sadness. A death in the family often leaves us not knowing which way to turn. What can the church do then? Well conducting a funeral, whether in church or at a crematorium, is the greatest privilege. But just occasionally someone says, "We don't come to church very often, we're not baptised so I don't suppose you'd be interested in conducting our funeral. But the answer is, "OH YES WE WOULD!

The funeral service explains exactly what it sets out to do, "It's about, remembering our loved one before God, giving thanks for their life and comforting one another in our grief. We're there to help you have the safe space to do that. Whatever you think your love one's beliefs were you may find yourself surprisingly comforted by the words of the funeral service, and others among your friends and relations certainly will. When you contact a funeral director they will contact us if you want the church to be involved or you can contact us directly. We will be there to help you arrange the funeral and to be a listening ear then and after the service. But just occasionally someone says, "We don't come to church very often, we're not baptised so I don't suppose you'd be interested in helping us. But the answer is, "YES WE WOULD!

If you want to talk about any of the things I've mentioned above, or ANYTHING else, get in touch! As we are currently between priests and administrators I am going to give you my telephone number. Ministry Team message

'Jesus Christ definitely existed?', asked the Eton educated celebrity, Spencer Mathews. 'Yes', said his Muslim companion, Eshaan Akbar.

This was part of a conversation during the BBC programme "Pilgrimage" shown earlier this year. It showed seven famous faces from varying faiths and beliefs embark on a 220km route across North Wales that celebrates Celtic early Christian saints. The film showed the group talking about their lives and beliefs as they walked together for two weeks. It was revealing, very emotional at times, and thought provoking as they passed though the beautiful countryside.

It's a cliché to think that we are all on a journey. Seeking answers to questions helps us move on. Spencer's question is one that many people ask. So what evidence is there for Eshaan's answer?

Before we get into the details, let's look at dates and numbers. The idea to count years from the birth of Jesus was first proposed in the year AD525 by Dionysius Exiguus, a Christian monk. However, modern research and archaeology shows that he miscalculated the year of Jesus's birth by about 5 years. Also, the ancient Romans had no number for zero, so the year after 1BC is AD1.

Jesus was a Jew from Galilee, the area in the north of modern Israel and south of modern Lebanon. From modern research, and using the corrected dates, he was born about 5BC and died about AD33, or on earth for 38 years.

Looking back 2,000 years to when Jesus was alive, the eastern end of the Mediterranean was full of conflict, just like today. The Romans had conquered Jerusalem in 63BC, bringing the region under Roman control, although they used local leaders to govern. The most famous was a ruthless military commander named Herod the Great, who was followed by his son Herod. The Jewish people and their leaders resented the Romans, who increasingly ruled their lives, and used local agents to collect taxes. The agents made a profit by adding their own fees, which made most people resent them. In addition, many thought the religious leaders of the time were corrupt and that they cared about control, power and making money at the expense of the people.

The Hebrew Bible, used by Jews 2,000 years ago is virtually the same as our bible's Old Testament. The New Testament books, including the four gospels were written in Greek, and the original Greek definition of the word for gospel is "good news". The Gospel of Mark probably dates from about AD68, Matthew and Luke around AD87, and John AD100. Almost certainly none of the authors were by eyewitnesses, and all are the end-products of long oral and written sources.

Now you may wonder how the authors could be certain about their facts. Thinking about their accuracy, I can look back to an example of an incident 56 years ago. I was in Vienna when the Russians invaded and occupied Czechoslovakia, just 30 miles from where I was. I spoke to Czech people, who had fled across the border, about their experiences, and to Austrians, who feared the Russians would just keep coming. There are many people now who could testify about their own experiences. The Gospel authors would have been in a similar position to gather their knowledge.

Going back to Spencer Mathews' question, historian James Dunn writes: "Today nearly all historians, whether Christians or not, accept that Jesus existed".

We all have questions but to answer some of them you can read Wikipedia articles, as I did, in conjunction with Mark's gospel.

"Managed Migration" to Universal Credit

Many people who currently receive a means-tested "legacy benefit" such as Working Tax Credits, Income Support or Employment Support Allowance will need to claim Universal Credit instead through a process called "managed migration".

How do you know if you need to do anything?

You will get a letter from the DWP and, **if it has a deadline** to claim Universal Credit (which should be at least 3 months in the future), this is a Migration Notice. On the deadline date your old legacy benefits will stop so it is really important not to ignore the letter. **The DWP won't automatically transfer you onto Universal Credit – you need to make the claim yourself.**

If you claim Universal Credit before the deadline, the DWP might pay you extra to stop you being worse off. This is called 'transitional protection'.

This means that if you would get less on Universal Credit than your old benefits, you will get an extra amount to make up the difference. The DWP will reduce this extra amount over time - so you will eventually just get what you normally would on Universal Credit.

Transitional protection also means you might be able to get Universal Credit when you wouldn't usually be entitled to it. If you:

- are a full-time student who wouldn't usually get Universal Credit, you can usually get it until the end of your course
- get tax credits and have over £16,000 in savings or investments, you can get Universal Credit for up to a year - this is a type of transitional protection called a 'transitional capital disregard'.

If you can't claim by the migration deadline

If the deadline hasn't passed yet, you can ask the DWP to extend it. You can only ask for this before the original deadline in the letter. If the DWP agree, they'll send you a new deadline.

If the deadline has passed, you can still get transitional protection if you claim Universal Credit up to a month after the deadline. The end of the month is called the 'final deadline'.

If you claim after the final deadline, you can still claim Universal Credit - but you can't get the transitional protection.

Timing of your claim - tactics

If there is time before the deadline, it is important to make sure you are getting all the legacy benefits to which you are entitled as this will maximise any transitional protection.

Claiming Universal Credit

If you claim Universal Credit, you usually get one payment each month and you usually have to manage your claim online.

It will usually take 5 weeks to get your first Universal Credit payment, but it could take longer.

Your old benefits might stop before your Universal Credit starts. When they stop depends on which benefits you get, and when you claim Universal Credit.

If you claim before the deadline from the DWP:

- tax credits stop the day before you claim Universal Credit
- Housing Benefit, income-based JSA, income-related ESA and Income Support stop 2 weeks after you claim Universal Credit

If you claim Universal Credit after the deadline from the DWP:

- tax credits stop the day before the deadline from the DWP
- Housing Benefit, income-based JSA, income-related ESA and Income Support stop 2 weeks after the deadline from the DWP

You will only get the extra 2 week payments if you're still eligible for the benefit. You won't need to pay back the extra payments and they won't affect how much Universal Credit you will get.

If you won't have enough money to live on while you wait for your first Universal Credit payment, you can ask for an advance payment. The advance payment is a loan which has to be paid back.

Many people are better off on Universal Credit than the old legacy benefits – it is worth checking what you might be entitled to as you can choose to change over earlier and not wait for managed migration.

One afternoon, I went upstairs to use the toilet, and there was Eric standing at the kitchen sink, with a large bundle of teaspoons in his hand.

"What are you up to now?" I laughingly asked. "I'm cleaning these teaspoons, they are disgusting" he replied. A little job, so much appreciated, and never forgotten. Whenever I clean the teaspoons (not often I'm ashamed to say) I think of him.

It must be 5 years or more since I last saw him. The thought of him brought a tear to my eye. Hope I hope he is "at rest" with his wife now, as I heard he had passed away.

One major thing I remember is going to the Irish singer "Dana" at the Church with him and Ann, his wife, a few years back. We wouldn't have obtained the tickets if not for them. It was wonderful, another lovely memory of Eric, only this one made me SMILE!

Recipe of the month

Sticky sausage and potato traybake

Preparation time less than 30 mins Cooking time 30 mins to 1 hour

Serves

Serves 4

Ingredients

4 tbsp vegetable oil

8 pork sausages, separated

1–2 medium onions, cut into thick wedges

1 large red pepper, deseeded and sliced

650g/1lb 7oz potatoes, halved lengthways and cut into roughly 15mm/%in slices 3 tbsp runny honey

4-5 tsp wholegrain mustard

1/4-1/2 tsp dried chillii flakes (optional to taste)

100g/3½oz frozen peas, fully thawed (see tip below)


salt and ground black pepper

Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 220C/200C Fan/Gas 7. Put the oil, sausages, onions, peppers and potatoes in a large baking tray or shallow roasting tin. Season with a little salt and lots of freshly ground black pepper and toss together.
- Roast for 20 minutes. Take out of the oven and turn the vegetables and sausages using tongs or a couple of forks. Return to the oven and cook for 15– 20 minutes more or until the potatoes are tender and crisp in places and the sausages are nicely browned.
- 3. Take the tray out of the oven once more, drizzle the honey over the sausages and dot the mustard over the vegetables. Gently toss together. Sprinkle with the chilli flakes if using, then scatter the thawed peas over the top and return to the oven for further 5 minutes or until the honey melts and the sausages are sticky.
