Beekeeping in Goldhanger

There are several indications of significant beekeeping at Goldhanger in the past. The postcard on the cover shows Ralph Page's Apiary. Charles and the Page family farmed Old Rectory Farm from 1906 to the 1960s. They had orchards producing apples, plums, greengages, jam and honey. The bees would have had the important role of pollinating the blossom.

This local newspaper cutting from 1926 describes a meeting of beekeepers in the new Rectory grounds, which suggests that the Rector of the day, the Revd. Frederick Gardner and his daughter Cynthia had an interest in beekeeping...



Berneping. — By invitation of Miss C. Gardner, Wickham Bishops and District beekeepers met in the Rectory grounds, and owing to the heat were able to extract comb honey in the open air without being disturbed by the bees. Within three hours the extracting was done, and the combs returned for the bees to re-fill.



The Beehive Cottages in Fish Street clearly have a past association with beekeeping. For many years the cottages belonged to the same family that owned the allotments opposite so would probably have kept their beehives there but would also have moved them around the many orchards around the village at that time.

This Illustrated London News article of 1851 describes Mr Ponder's special beehive design on display in the Great Exhibition in London's Crystal Palace. The Ponder family lived just opposite Beehive Cottages at the Bird-in-Hand.

THE GREAT GATHERING OF THE INDUSTRIOUS BEES

We must now examine the hives contributed by British apiarian exhibitors, which are scattered about in the Agricultural Implement department, We shall take them in the numerical order in which they are named in the official Catalogue...

... 146. W. R. Ponder, of Goldhanger, near Maldon, Essex, exhibits his bee-house or aplary, of wood, having eight windows, with outside shutters, the whole divided into three compartments, with three small semicircular entrances and landing-places. By means of a false bottom and zinc slides, the refuse of the apiary is easily removed.



We can't be sure, but one of the hives in Ralph Page's Apiary postcard image on the cover looks very different to the other more conventional hives shown and may well have been an example of Mr Ponder's glass topped design.

Beekeeping goes back thousands of years to the Chinese, the Greeks and Romans and was prolific

in the UK in medieval times. It involved not just honey but also other products: *Beeswax* for *polish*, *candles* and timekeeping when there were no clocks; *Mead* an ancient alcoholic drink; *Apitherapy* - alternative medicine practices using bee products in many ways from dermatology, cosmetics to health foods and drinks.

Today Graham Johnson who lives in Tollesbury maintains hives all around this area including in fields close to Goldhanger. His honey is available in the local shops.

Pentecost

Grace

The Day of Pentecost occurs on 19 May this year. Described in the second chapter of Acts:

- 1 When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place.
- 2 And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting.
- 3 Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them.
- 4 All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

And we still have access to the Holy Spirit today, the Holy Spirit being part of the holy trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

And we don't need to wait for another Pentecost, when the apostles with great power gave their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, great grace was upon them all, as it was with Stephen in chapter 6 when, "full of grace and power", he performed "great wonders and signs among the people".

What is grace? It is mentioned 112 times in the Bible, nearly all in the New Testament, and mostly in Acts and the various letters of Paul and others. Not surprisingly, perhaps, because grace comes as a result of the holy spirit, although it doesn't appear in Paul's list of gifts of the Spirit in chapter 12 of his first letter to the Corinthians. Perhaps this is because grace is quite hard to define. But I think we all have an idea of grace, and what is graceful, and perhaps it's easier to imagine than some of the other gifts of the Spirit. From it we also get the words gracious and graceful. We probably all know someone who we think of as graceful, and if not among humans, then animals who can be very graceful, especially birds and cats, but not when together!

And when we think of Jesus, we see someone graceful, as he moved around, seemingly effortlessly, healing as he went, and many of the letters end with the wish that, "the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with you". Paul's letter to the Romans is particularly relevant to grace, as he writes in Chapter 11, "But if it [salvation] is by grace, it is no longer on the basis of works, otherwise grace would no longer be grace."

Just about the only place in the old Testament where grace is mentioned is in Psalm 45, verse 2 where the poet says, "You are the most handsome of men; grace is poured upon your lips; therefore God has blessed you forever" which is unique in being considered as a profane, or irreligious, royal wedding song. However in the Jewish and Christian tradition the psalm was read allegorically and interpreted in a messianic way.

The unknown author of the letter to the Hebrews, interprets the psalm as applying directly to Jesus Christ. He begins his letter:

"Long ago God spoke to our ancestors in many and various ways by the prophets, but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, through whom he also created the worlds."

And in verse 8 he writes,

'But of the Son he says [in psalm 45], "Your throne, O God, is forever and ever, and the righteous sceptre is the sceptre of your kingdom."

And the bible ends with:

The grace of the Lord Jesus be with all the saints. Amen.

And that's theology for you. My advice is that you look for grace around you, and try it on for size yourself.




Striking Competition 1st June







Recipe of the month

Banana pancakes



Preparation time: less than 30

mins

Cooking time: less than 10 mins

Makes 6 small pancakes

Ingredients

2 bananas, peeled (approx.

160g/5oz peeled weight)

120g/41/20z plain flour

1 tsp baking powder

120ml/41/4fl oz oat milk (or

other plant-based milk)

3 tsp coconut or vegetable oil

To serve (optional)

handful blueberries

1 banana, sliced

maple syrup (or honey if you're not vegan), to drizzle


dollop coconut yoghurt



Method

- 1. Roughly chop the bananas and add to a blender with the flour, baking powder and oat milk. Blend until smooth. Alternatively, mash the banana thoroughly on a plate, then transfer to a bowl and whisk in the other ingredients until smooth.
- 2. Heat a teaspoon of the oil in a small frying pan over a medium—high heat and spoon the mixture into the pan to make two pancakes, each about 10cm/4in in diameter you will need about a tablespoon of mixture per pancake.
- Cook for around 2 minutes on each side, or until golden-brown, adding more oil if needed, then keep warm. Repeat until you have made all the pancakes.
- 4. To serve, divide the pancakes between two plates and top with the banana, blueberries, maple syrup and coconut yoghurt. Enjoy while still warm.
