Trophies from the Past

In the days before car ownership, radios, television, foreign travel and the internet, residents were more involved in local entertainment and keen to participate in local club activities. One sign of that are the number of trophies that were once awarded for competitions held by the many clubs and societies that were based in the village. This month's front cover shows six such trophies that we have photos of and know a little about...

The Goldhanger Ploughing Cup

This was presented by the Rector, The Revd. Frederick Gardner to the winners of the annual ploughing matches between 1902 and 1906. William Bentall's horse-drawn Goldhanger ploughs would have undoubtedly been used for these competitions. We know that the Goldhanger Friendly Brothers were involved in organising these annual competitions as most of their members were farm workers. Having spent 100 years in Canada with members of Goldhanger family the cup was returned to the village in 2022.

The Goldhanger Regatta tankard

The tankard is dated 1872 and was awarded for the "four oars amateur race" at the Regatta held in the Creek and the Estuary near "The Shoe" over a period of at least nine years from 1868 to 1876. Today the trophy is in the hands of the West Mersea Town Regatta and is awarded to the winner of a rowing race.

The Goldhanger Players Cup

This cup was presented to members of the Goldhanger Players dramatic society "for outstanding performances" and is dated 1933. The Village Hall didn't open until 1937 so they must have put on performances somewhere else before then.

Goldhanger & Little Totham Gardening Society Mens & Ladies Cups

These cups were awarded annually to members of Gardening Society around the 1950s. The men's cup was presented by R E Wakelin, a farmer who lived in Follyfaunts and the ladies cup was presented by Sir Gilmore & Lady Jenkins who lived in Goldhanger House. Sir Gilmour was a senior civil servant.

The Goldhanger Flower Show Cup

The flower show cup has the date of 1949 and was presented by Miss F Wakelin. Presumably there was an annual show in either the Church or the Village Hall.

Most of these cups are no longer in the village and were probably not of solid silver. There were undoubtedly once more in the village and there is a collection of similar plated cups in The Chequers that were awarded for games of darts, dominoes and cribbage. There are also two Goldhanger bellringer's trophies made of wood that are still awarded annually at Essex bellringing association competitions and occasional come back to the village.



London Marathon 2025

Last June I found out that I had won a ballot place in the London Marathon! I really wasn't expecting to get in as over 840,000 people worldwide applied for approximately 17,000 ballot places (the rest of this year's 60,000 places are sold to charities). To say I was shocked is an understatement and I spent several days deciding whether this 74 year old body could make it through the training needed to even get to the start line let alone the finish. However, I thought it was worth paying for the place just to see how well a woman my age who, in spite of doing a little bit of running on and off for over 20 years, but never running more than 13 miles (very slowly), would do.

I'm fascinated by the power of belief and before I retired, my work (first as a Driving Instructor then as a Holistic Life Coach and

Workshop Leader) reflected this. Consequently this marathon running journey is an ideal opportunity to learn so much about whether my will to complete whatever running challenge I set for a particular day, can overcome the negative self-belief challenging it. So far it has. My longest run to date is 16 miles and no one is more amazed than me. So when it comes to running at least, I think my imposter syndrome has finally gone. 





07786 954656 or As I write this in February, I am wondering whether March will "Come in like lion" and out like a lamb or in like a lamb and out like a lion" as the old saying goes, recognising the varied weather March brings us. It can be a wild month, I wondered if that was why it was named after the Roman god of war, Mars, but it turns out that, it quite simply meant that the weather was now suitable for Roman soldiers to get back to fighting again after the winter break! Another favourite saying is about the oak and the ash; "If the oak is out before the ash we are in for a splash. If the ash is out before the oak we are in for a soak". It is supposed to forecast whether it will be wetter or drier in the days to come but it actually reflects that it has already been wetter as the ash likes rain and the oak will come in to leaf regardless of how wet or dry it is. However inaccurate these old sayings may be, it is fun to keep them going. "Whether the weather be hot or whether the weather be cold, we'll weather the weather whatever the weather whether we like it or not". Whatever the weather it is now Spring, an exciting time of year because, though there is nothing very colourful yet in the garden, snowdrops and the leaves of daffodils are all the more welcome. It is a time for new beginnings and plans for the future.

Officially the First Day of Spring is the 20th of March, that is the Spring Equinox when daylight and night time are the same length although signs of spring are already with us in February. I am not sure quite why there has to be an official day. It will soon be time for the Lenten Fast. Pancake day is early in March this year as Easter is the 20th April. The idea is that pancakes use up all the eggs that are not going to be put under the hen for hatching as, when lent begins, it is traditionally the right time to set eggs under a broody hen to hatch then in 21 days' time one will see the little chicks peeking out from amongst the mother hen's feathers. A good use for the eggshells from the pancakes is to use them to sew sweet peas, it is what my mother always did and when they are ready, she planted them straight outside in their place and she had spectacular sweet peas all summer.

The word Lent simply means 'lengthening' and was the word for the season of spring, sure enough, the Lenten Fast is during Spring time when the days are visibly lengthening. Nowadays the word lent refers only to the Lenten Fast recalling the 40 days Jesus spent on his own, fasting in the desert before he began his ministry; preaching, teaching, blessing and healing. For Christians it is the preparation for Good Friday when Christ's crucifixion is remembered followed by the celebration of Easter. Fasting has been a central part of Christianity from the beginning. It is a luxury to have the choice of fasting or feasting. There are many people today who do not have the sufficient wherewithal with which to grow or purchase the food they need for themselves and their families on a regular basis. Strictly speaking every Friday is a fast day in the Christian calendar. Fasting is a discipline that is not an easy one to uphold. If it were easy, it would not be worth the effort. I wish you well with your fasting.







Ingredients

- 250g cashew nuts blitzed in blender
- 2 crusts of wholemeal bread blitzed in blender

- 100g mushrooms chopped

- 1 tablespoon marmite
- 1 heaped teaspoon mixed herbs
- Olive oil

Method

- 1. Preheat Oven 180°C and line a greased loaf tin
- 2. Combine blitzed nuts and breadcrumbs
- 3. Fry onion celery and mushrooms
- 4. Melt marmite in hot stock and mix in herbs
- 5. Mix all together with nuts and breadcrumbs
- 6. No need to season
- 7. Put into lined loaf tin and cover with foil
- 8. Cook 30 minutes covered then uncover for about 7 minutes
- 9. Allow it to cool down before taking out of tin
- 10. Enjoy
