Memories of WW-2 and VE-Day in Goldhanger

With international celebrations about to take place on the 80th anniversary of the end of World War Two, here is a very brief summary of what happened here...

Fifty people served in the armed forces, with others in the Home Guard, ARPs, AFS, Land Army and in armaments factories. Key workers such as teachers, shopkeepers, farmers, etc. and mothers with young children stayed at home.

Government Regulations had a significant impact on those at home: food rationing, blackouts, no petrol for civilians or fishing allowed in the Blackwater.

Searchlights and anti-aircraft guns were in "The Park" near the Rectory (now Goldhanger House) and many army personnel were billeted in the village.


Bomber and fighter aircraft were constantly overhead as the village was between the USAF base at Messing and the New Zealand base at Bradwell.

Incendiary bombs fell on the village. Barrow Marsh farmhouse was destroyed.

The village school had an air-raid shelter and received food parcels from abroad.

London evacuees came to the village. A school was set up in the Parish Rooms.

In Maldon District 84 serving lost their lives and there were 19 civilian deaths, but in contrast *no lives were lost* from this village. a good reason to celebrate!

If you are getting one of a variety of means tested benefits, you may be able to get a social tariff, making your bills much lower.

For example BT offer a Home Essentials plans from £15 a month.

First, check if your current provider offers a social tariff. You can apply for most tariffs online, or call your provider and ask to switch.

If your provider doesn't offer a social tariff, you can switch to one that does. Your provider might let you leave your current contract without paying a penalty fee.

- someone in your household receives Pension Credit, and your annual water and sewerage bill is 3% or more of your net household income (after housing costs, rent or mortgage payments)

Watersure - bill cap scheme

Energy

The Warm Home Discount Scheme is a one-off £150 discount off your electricity bill. If you're eligible, your electricity supplier will usually apply the discount to your bill automatically.

You qualify if you are on one of a variety of means tested benefits or on tax credits with a low income and have high energy costs. Your property must have a high energy cost score to be eligible for the scheme. This is not based on the actual energy costs in your energy bill. It's calculated based on your property's type, age and floor area.

Well done Goldhanger, you know how to have a good time!






New Bridge In The Woodland.




Churchyard Tree



Julian of Norwich

Julian of Norwich, spiritual writer of the early 15th century, enjoys – in heaven – her saints day on earth on 8 May. She had two amazing experiences which have cast her into the harsh light of the 21st-century where she is mostly recognised by one saying which comes in two forms, the first in the shorter version of what is now known as her Revelations of Divine Love: "but all shall be well, and all manner of things shall be well."

And the second in the longer version:

"Sin is befitting, but all shall be well, and all shall be well, and all manner of things shall be well."

These revelations were shown, as she wrote, talking of herself, "to a simple, uneducated creature in the year of our Lord 1373 on the 8th day of May," at the age of 30, and at the point of death from a severe illness which she had earlier prayed for so that she could be "purged by the mercy of God and afterwards to live more to God's glory".

As a result she received various revelations: sensory and visual, in words that came into her head, and unearthly ones that she wasn't allowed, nor able to, "show the spiritual vision as openly or as fully as I would like to."

On that day she experienced 15 of what she called, 'showings', the first beginning early in the morning, at about 4 o'clock' and continuing 'until it was well past the middle of the day. A 16th came the following night between two dreamlike experiences of diabolic temptation, and were "conclusion and confirmation" of the entire sequence. The showings were so compelling and rich in meaning that she understood them to come directly from God, and to be messages not just for herself but for all Christians. This led her to write them down to convey her sense of their significance as it was revealed in the course of many years of meditation, renewed by 'flashes of illumination and touches, I hope, of the same spirit which was shown in them all'.

Julian also put it in context: 'although sin is commonplace among mankind, there is a way to overcome one's failings and attain spiritual wholeness, but all shall be well'.

Recipe of the month

Easy Halloumi Wrap

Preparation time
Less than 30 mins
Cooking time
10 minutes
Serves
Serves 1



Ingredients

- 100 g halloumi cheese
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 1 large soft flour tortilla wrap
- 3 tbsp hummus
- 1 large carrot peeled into ribbons
- A handful of spinach leaves
- Freshly ground black pepper

Method

- Slice the halloumi into 1cm/½in thick strips and season with pepper.
- 2. Heat the oil in a frying pan over a low—medium heat and fry the halloumi strips for a few minutes, turning until all sides are golden. If the pan is too hot, the outside of the halloumi might brown before the centre gets nice and soft, but you can lift the pan off the heat to reduce the temperature briefly.
- 3. Warm the tortilla following pack instructions, then spread the hummus down the middle. Layer the carrot, spinach and crispy halloumi strips, add any sauces or toppings you like, then roll up the tortilla and eat while the halloumi is still warm.

If you like it spicy, add a drizzle of hot sauce.

Note - this quantity is for one tortilla
